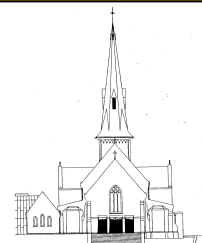

FROM THE DEAN'S DESK

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the great solemnity of Easter - a time when ***"God our Father by raising Christ...has conquered the power of death and opened for us the way to eternal life"*** (Opening Prayer for Easter Sunday morning Mass). Being conscious of, living by this fact we can indeed proclaim the words of the Responsorial Psalm for today: ***'This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad'***.



The basis for our ***rejoicing*** and ***gladness*** is indeed the fact that through the Resurrection, the power of death over us has been overcome. This does not mean that there will be no more occurrence of suffering, pain or death in our life. It means that death does not have the final say in our lives anymore. It means that we can, through the power of the Risen Christ, overcome the weaknesses, disillusionments and disappointments of life.

The celebration of Easter challenges us to live out in our lives the power of the Paschal Mystery – the suffering, death and Resurrection of Christ. It urges us to recognise that we have to live out the pattern of Jesus suffering and death in order for us to live and be affected by the power of His Resurrection. The **letter to the Philippians** takes up this theme as it states: ... ***'that I may come to know him and the power of his resurrection, and partake of his sufferings by being moulded to the pattern of his death...'*** [3:10].

We need to recognise that the pattern of the Paschal Mystery is imbedded in our lives: ***joy, suffering, disillusionment, death and resurrection***. We experience this in all elements of our life – especially in our relationships. Without the hope of, and in, Christ's Resurrection, then this experience can usually end with death. The Easter story challenges us to see that this pattern of suffering, death and new life can be experienced in all aspects of our life. We recognise this in the Gospel readings given to us for Easter Sunday [John 20:1-19; Mark 16:1-7 and Luke 24:13-35]. In John's and Mark's Gospel, Mary of Magdala is confronted with the mystery and pain of the empty tomb. Her news of this to the disciples is met with some disbelief – they have to come and see it for themselves. John tells us they only see the signs of death – the cloths used to bury Jesus neatly placed in the tomb.

John tells us that the disciple – 'the one Jesus loved' - enters the tomb: he sees and he believes. Their sadness is moving towards joy. Luke's Gospel tells us of the downhearted disciples returning to their homes, disappointed at what happened to Jesus. They fail to recognise him. It's only at the breaking of bread that they become aware of him. They return to Jerusalem to tell the disciples and they are greeted with the amazing news: ***'The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon'***.

With our faith and hope in the power of Jesus' Resurrection we too can overcome all aspects of sin, disillusionment and even death. We can be like the Beloved Disciple who entered the empty tomb and believed. We haven't seen the Risen Jesus, but we still believe in his presence and power.

This is indeed the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in him. May the renewal and spiritual advances made during our Lenten journey deepen and strengthen our faith in this reality. May the Risen Christ and the power of his Resurrection be with you today and always.

Here is a short history of our Cathedral.

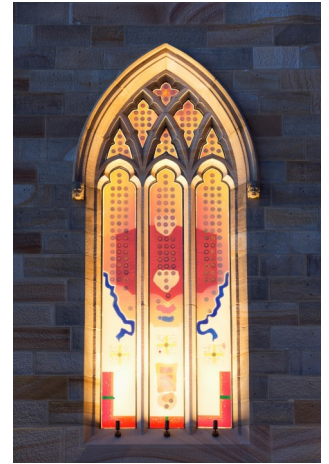
There has been a centre of worship here since the early 1820s. The current sandstone building is the third St Patrick's Church completed on the site and was opened in 1936. When the Diocese of Parramatta was created in May 1986, St Patrick's Church became a Cathedral.

On 19th February 1996, the Cathedral was destroyed by fire, devastating the community but evoking an extraordinary feeling. "A new St Patrick's will rise from the ashes" was the catch cry, and so it proved to be. The beautiful Cathedral which you see before you was completed and dedicated on November 29, 2003.

The Cathedral precinct consists of the Chapel (the old Cathedral), the Cathedral (which is usually accessed via the Chapel), the Cloisters, Murphy House, the Cathedral Hall and the Cathedral Offices and Presbytery.

We encourage you to walk around the Cathedral and appreciate its award winning architectural design or simply spend some time with our Lord in the Chapel. You will find a guide pamphlet in the Cathedral narthex that will assist you to understand and appreciate some of the wonderful aspects of St Patrick's Cathedral.

Welcome and enjoy your visit to Parramatta.

Good Friday Collection

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land takes place on Good Friday. SACRAMENTS AT ST PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL

• Baptism

Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (vitae spiritualis ianua), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. (Source: Catechism of the Catholic Church)

At St Patrick's Cathedral, Baptisms are celebrated on most Sundays at 12.45pm. If you would like to have your child baptised, please contact the Parish Office on 8839 8400. You may also like to visit our webpage for more information and download a form. It is compulsory for all couples to attend a Baptism Preparation Seminar held on the third Saturday of the month from 4.00pm-5.00pm in the Parish Hall.

• Sacraments of Initiation for Children already Baptised

Preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation for children already baptised is a parish-based family centred process.

Here at St Patrick's Cathedral Parish the process of preparation begins around the second half of the year. Information sessions (*enquiry time*) are held at the parish, usually in the Cathedral Hall. These sessions provide the information parents need to continue the process of bringing the child to full initiation within the Faith Community. In May and June, the parish publishes notices when these gatherings will take place.

Request for enrolment in the parish based process takes place following the information session. Enrolment takes place during a Sunday Liturgy.

Confirmation and Holy Communion are dealt with in a similar manner.

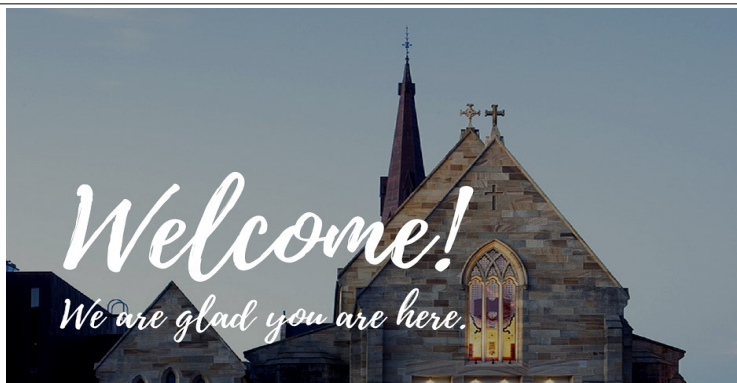

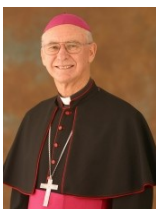
