The Empty Tomb...



A HAPPY AND HOLY EASTER to each of you on this highlight of the Church's year, the Feast of the Resurrection, better known to us, of course, as Easter.

"The Empty Tomb" may sound like the name of a short story in the detective fiction or horror genres but it does in fact describe something far more puzzling, far more significant and far more glorious: the resurrection of Jesus and the very reason over two billion Christians throughout the world gather to celebrate the feast of Easter.

Of course, the tomb visited by the three women on that Sabbath day was not empty. It was, as we hear, occupied by "a young man in a white robe" but this man certainly wasn't the one they were seeking. There three loving, dedicated and faithful women were looking for the body of Jesus, crucified just two days earlier, that they may anoint his body for burial as was the custom of the day. On reaching the tomb they found that their concerns about how to access the burial place which was sealed by a heavy stone were pointless—the stone had been rolled away and the body of Jesus was gone! Stolen? No. The "young man in white" tells the women that Jesus of Nazareth has risen and is making his way to Galilee "just as he told you."


What we don't hear today is the reaction of the women after their encounter with the man in white. If we read on we learn that "...the women came out and ran away from the tomb because they were frightened out of their wits; and they said nothing to a soul, for they were afraid...". In fact, there is a lot of disbelief in Mark's version of the Resurrection, with many failing to believe the accounts of those who had witnessed the risen Jesus.

What has brought us here today? Clearly we have witnessed something of the reality of the risen Jesus in our own lives or else we wouldn't be gathering to rejoice this Easter Day. It may be recovery from illness, some consolation after the death of a loved one, an opportunity given when all seemed lost, a sense of peace in a time of suffering or some other experience of light shining when it seemed darkness would prevail. What Easter reminds us is that because of the work of God in our lives we ought to have the loving devotion of those women who went to the tomb on that first Easter Day, but not imitate their fear and silence. Rather, our response should be one of rejoicing and telling others the Good News that the tomb was empty for one reason only - Christ has risen and we are redeemed!

Once again, a happy and holy Easter to all of you gathered here today. If you are not a regular visitor to the cathedral parish but live in the area, we would love to know how we can welcome you and get to know you better. Please make yourself known to one of the clergy or welcomers. We're here to serve you!





Saint of the Week

5th April - St Vincent Ferrer (1350—1419)

Vincent was born in Valencia and joined the Dominicans at the age of 17. In 1399, with the approval of the Pope, he set out on his mission as a preacher. For twenty years he travelled through western Europe, with thousands flocking to hear him wherever he was. From 1408 he worked mostly south of the Pyrenees. Among others, he preached to the Jews, of whom some 25,000 were converted to Christianity; and in the Kingdom of Granada he converted thousands of Moors. In 1417 he moved on to Brittany and continued his work there. He died in Vannes in Brittany on 05 April 1419.

DID YOU KNOW...

.....that Easter falls on a carefully calculated day, dependent upon the moon?

The First Council of Nicaea in the year 325 established the date of Easter as the first Sunday after the full moon (the Paschal Full Moon) following the March equinox. Easter can fall on any Sunday between 22 March and 25 April, so this year's Easter Sunday, falling on 04 April, is pretty much in the middle of the earliest and latest dates on which it can fall. As a matter of interest, Easter Sunday is quite late next year, falling on 17 April. In 2023, Easter Sunday will fall close to this year's date, on 09 April, but will be very early in 2024, falling on 31 March.




Easter is the time when we celebrate Jesus' rising from the dead.

Has risen as He said. Alleluia!


