How should we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday?

The devotion of the feast of Divine Mercy was actively promoted by Pope John Paul II. On April 30, 2000, the canonisation of Faustina Kowalska took place, and the second Sunday of Easter was officially designated as Divine Mercy Sunday.

While writing these few words for the bulletin, I had time to reflect more deeply about this feast. If I have the love of God, why do I need God's mercy? What is the relation between the love of Jesus and God's mercy? Are mercy and love the same? St Paul wrote to the Ephesians (2:4-5): "But because of His great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in our trespasses." Mercy is the expression of Jesus' love for us. By becoming one of us, Jesus lived in this world, died, but rose from death. With his wounds still visible on that Easter Sunday, he shows his disciples and us, the path of dying and rising with him. We have all in some way or another, experienced this path ourselves. We show mercy to someone when we love them so much that we are ready to forgive them, time and time again. That is what we are called to do in whatever vocation we are called to live.

Having settled the distinction and the relationship between love and mercy, I wondered what exactly Jesus asked and promised to Saint Faustina. I was aware of the Novena and Chaplets, but I confess that I was not that familiar with the content of her visions and visitation from Jesus which she documented in her diary. Two entries struck me the most. Firstly, Jesus said that "*the Feast of Mercy was a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners*" (Diary 699). We can conclude from this statement that this is a feast for all of us since we are all sinners! We certainly can take refuge in these words. However, as always, the Gospel is demanding of us. And here comes the second entry in St Faustina's diary which struck me: Jesus said "*On the day of My feast, the Feast of Mercy, you will go through the whole world and bring fainting souls to the spring of My mercy. I shall heal and strengthen them*". Notice that Jesus was trying to get us to "go out", not "stay in", and to give this refuge to all humankind! The focus here is in evangelising poor sinners. Jesus said that the loss of each soul plunges him into mortal sadness (Diary 1397). If we do not do our very best to "go out" and evangelise others, inviting them to the feast, then we are not really helping Jesus with his deepest desire to save them.

Adoration is good, the Chaplet is good, but on the Feast of Mercy we are also reminded that Jesus would like us to focus on trying to get the worst of sinners to his feast, so that he can heal and strengthen them as well. Think this Sunday about how you can do this according to your God-given capabilities and gifts.



Saint of the Week

17th April - Blessed Clara Gambacorta (1362 - 1419)

Blessed Clara was born in Pisa in 1362, married at the age of twelve and widowed at the age of fifteen. She longed to join a religious order, but her family objected. When at last they relented, upon the advice of Saint Catherine of Siena she received the Dominican habit at the Monastery of the Holy Cross in Pisa. In 1385 along with Blessed Maria Mancini she founded the Monastery of St Dominic in Pisa where regular observance was strictly maintained. She was noted for her great prudence and charity, especially in pardoning the assassin of her father and brothers. She prized study and urged her sisters to do likewise. She died on 17 April 1419.



Today we should thank God for His mercy and forgiveness and ask Him to look on us and our friends and the whole world with love and forgiveness! Here is a prayer we can say:


