“The room is shaken by a wind that filled the entire house...”



FOR TODAY'S CELEBRATION of the Solemnity of Pentecost, I would like to focus on the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles. This reading relates an exodus from the fear the disciples had been experiencing whilst hiding in the upper room after what had happened to Jesus. Fifty days have passed since the resurrection. By now Jesus has ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. Jesus has directed the disciples to remain in Jerusalem until they are clothed with power from on high. Pentecost is that day of empowerment, the day when God's promised Spirit descends upon those gathered in the upper room and the Spirit-inspired message of salvation will be proclaimed by Peter on the temple mount.

Pentecost: from the Greek word for fifty, is thus celebrated fifty days after the feast of Passover; as Christians we celebrate Pentecost fifty days after Easter.

We find all the disciples together one in place, the upper room, probably the same room used by Jesus and the disciples to celebrate the Last Supper. That morning's peace is interrupted by a sudden and violent wind, a microburst, that descends upon the upper city. The room is shaken by a wind that “filled the entire house”. What had just been happening caught the attention of the “devout Jews” who are in Jerusalem for the feast. The gathering crowd witnesses the first miracle of “tongues”, a group of men and women, each filled with the promised Spirit of God, all speaking at once, ecstatic in their praise of God and God's good deeds. The new arrivals are amazed. They have come from the most distant parts of the Roman Empire, but somehow each one is able to hear and understand in their own native language what the disciples are saying.

In John's gospel, Jesus spent the night before he died preparing them for his physical separation from them, and for the coming of the Spirit who would fill the void in their hearts, promising them that he will ask the Father who will send “another Advocate,” the Holy Spirit, to be with them forever. Pentecost celebrates the fulfillment of that promise. Now filled with the Holy Spirit, we are led by the Spirit as we follow the Lord. In that time The Spirit appeared in the Upper Room as “tongues of fire” that settled upon all present.

Fire and light define the Christian experience. The first command in the Book of Genesis is “Let there be light!” The Gospel writer names Jesus as the “life [that] was the light of the human race.” That light “shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it” (John 1:4-5). Jesus is still that light, and we are to be the flames he uses to draw the attention of others to himself. We should be willing to shine brightly for the Lord, to put our light on a lampstand so that it will give light to everyone not only in the room but in the whole world.

To end, I would like us to ponder this question: what kind of evangelisation would be possible if we were more open to the Holy Spirit working powerfully in our weekly gatherings and in our individual lives?

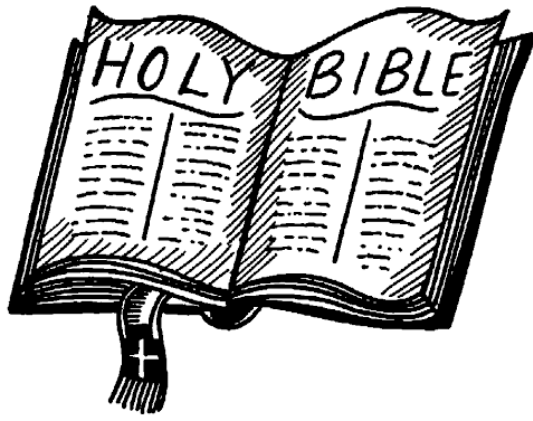

Saint of the Week

26th May - St Bede the Venerable (672/3—735)

Bede was born in 672 or 673 near St Peter and St Paul monastery at Wearmouth-Jarrow, England. He was sent there when he was three and educated by Abbots Benedict Biscop and Ceolfrid. He became a monk at the monastery, was ordained when thirty, and except for a few brief visits elsewhere, spent all of his life in the monastery, devoting himself to the study of Scripture and to teaching and writing. He is considered one of the most learned men of his time and a major influence on English literature. His writings are a veritable summary of the learning of his time and include commentaries on the Pentateuch and various other books of the Bible, theological and scientific treatises, historical works, and biographies. His best-known work is *Historia Ecclesiastica*, a history of the English Church and people, which he completed in 731. It is an account of Christianity in England up to 729 and is a primary source of early English history. He is called "the Venerable" to acknowledge his wisdom and learning. Bede was the first to date events *anno domini* ("AD" the Year of the Lord), and in 1899 was declared the only English doctor of the Church. He died in Wearmouth-Jarrow on 25 May 735.

NEWS FROM ROME



Pope Francis continued his catechesis on prayer: 'In our continuing catechesis on Christian prayer, we now consider some common difficulties we encounter in our practice of prayer. The first is *distraction*. Prayer, like study and work, demands concentration and mental discipline. This calls for our cultivation of the virtue of vigilance, by which we focus our lives on doing the Lord's will daily in expectation of his return. A second difficulty is the experience of *spiritual aridity* ... A third difficulty is *acedia* or sloth, a form of spiritual fatigue that leads to the deadly temptation to abandon prayer altogether.'

My name is Danny Dingle, your erstwhile cantor who is currently on leave due to a health issue.

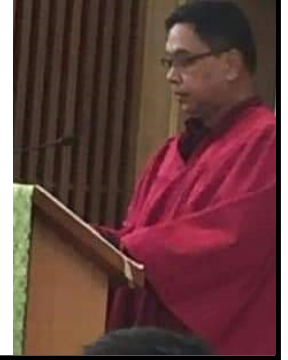
I first set foot in St Patrick's Cathedral on 17 September 1989. I remember the day well because it was my birthday and the wedding of my sister at the old Cathedral.

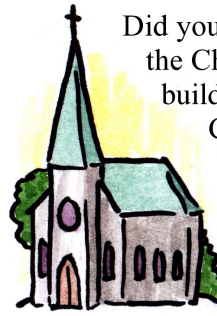

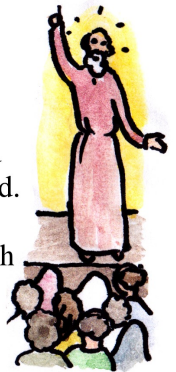


Did you know that Pentecost Sunday is the Church's birthday? Not the church building, but the people who are the Church.

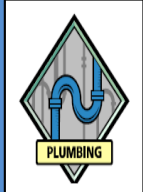
