“Little girl, I tell you to get up.”

“DAUGHTER, YOUR FAITH has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction.”

“Do not be afraid; just have faith.”

In this weekend's Gospel, Mark describes the healing of two daughters of Israel by Jesus.

In both cases faith is needed to receive the grace of God. We see how in both healings, the two protagonists, the haemorrhaging woman and Jairus, need to approach Jesus in order to effect healing. At the same time they need a strong faith.

Faith is both a personal and a communal relationship. “Faith is first of all a personal adherence...to God. At the same time, it is a free assent to the whole truth that God has revealed” (CCC 150). A personal faith says, “I believe in God.” This is an act of belief in the one, true, and living God. It is as though we gather all that we are, and gratefully give our hearts and minds to God. We have a personal relationship with the Trinity of God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is certainly the case of the woman who was suffering a long-term haemorrhage.

But faith is also communal. This is the case of the daughter of Jairus. It is not just a private act. In the assembly of believers at Mass, we profess our faith together and join our hearts as we experience ourselves as the Body of Christ. Our personal faith brings us into a relationship with God's people, and the faith of the entire people strengthens us in our relationship with God.

Faith is a gift. God not only speaks to us, but he also gives us the grace to respond. To believe in Revelation we need the gift of faith. Peter was able to see that Jesus was the Messiah, not from “flesh and blood,” that is, not by means of reason or common sense, but by the grace of the Father (Mt 16:16-18). When by faith and baptism we enter the Church, we already share in eternal life.

Faith believes with conviction in a message. We have seen that faith is a relationship with God; now we note that it is also belief in a message. This message is found in Scripture and Tradition and is transmitted to us through many means such as liturgical prayers and the Creeds. Faith fills us with conviction because God guarantees the truthfulness of what he revealed. “Our Gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and [with] much conviction” (1 Thess 1:5). The Spirit assists us to be believers: “Faith is the realisation of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen” (Heb 11:1).

Let us pray today to Jesus as Lord of life and ask him to help us reach that level of faith, health, wholeness, and holiness to which he is calling us, and to be able to spread to others the power of his presence in the midst of us.



Saint of the Week

28th June - St Irenaeus (130 - 202)

Irenaeus was born in Smyrna (now Izmir in western Turkey) in 130 and emigrated to Lyons, in France, where he eventually became the bishop.

Whenever we take up the Bible we touch Irenaeus's work, for he played a decisive role in fixing the canon of the New Testament. We need to remember that the Church had to decide, early on, what was scriptural and what was not.

Irenaeus went through all the books of the New Testament, and all the candidates. He did not simply accept or reject each book but gave reasons for and against the canonicity of each book or else his enemies could have said that he was making decisions to bolster his own arguments.

He died in 202. It is not noted for certain whether he was martyred or died a natural death.

DID YOU KNOW...


...that the Gospel of Mark, which we will read from for the rest of the liturgical year, was the first of the four Gospels to be written?

Biblical scholars tell us that Mark's gospel, the shortest, was written around the year 65, some thirty years or so after the death of Jesus. Matthew and Luke, both of whom use Mark as the basis for their gospels, were written some ten to fifteen years later, whilst John was the final gospel to be written, around the end of the first century. The gospel of Mark was written for a non-Jewish (Gentile) audience. Mark's gospel uses a winged lion for its symbol, possibly in recognition of the resurrection of Christ the King.



2. Always pray for people who are sick. Your prayers can help them get better, or they might help your sick friend to understand why God is letting them suffer.




