## The Eucharist sustains us



OUR GOSPEL THIS SUNDAY comes from the glorious sixth chapter of John's Gospel. This chapter is widely known as Jesus' Eucharistic discourse. Why so? You'll notice that the Gospel of John does not have an institution narrative compared to the three synoptic Gospels. St. John does not recount the institution of the Eucharist but emphasises the high priestly prayer of Jesus. So it is no coincidence that John dedicates almost an entire chapter to the revelation of the Eucharist.

With two thousand years of teaching on the Blessed Sacrament we generally have a solid understanding of this particular text. Jesus has just fed the vast multitude with a few loaves and fish. The people who witnessed this feat seek to make Jesus their earthly king. Christ, knowing his hour has not yet come, slips away from the crowd. This of course only entices the crowd to search for him (which they quickly do) as they see in Jesus the solution to their temporal needs. Christ however directs them to elevate their hearts beyond the physical:

“Do not work for food that cannot last,  
but work for food that endures to eternal life,  
the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you.”

What is this food? What is that which leads to eternal life? Christ answers:

“I am the bread of life.  
He who comes to me will never be hungry;  
he who believes in me will never thirst.”

It is Christ himself who is the food, our food, come down from Heaven. He is that which sustains us throughout the pilgrimage of our lives. With that said, how do we reconcile this reality with our current situation? How can we sustain our spiritual life in this midst of this more severe lockdown? Dear friends, Christ knows and understands our situation. He knows that we are unable to leave our homes. He knows that we cannot receive the sacraments for the time being. He knows this situation is out of our control. Does this mean we are limited in grace received? Definitely not! The Church in its wisdom provides *The Prayer of Spiritual Communion* as a means of uniting one's heart with Jesus'. Here we receive the grace present in the Blessed Sacrament so long as we have a desire to unite our heart to Christ's. So, in confidence let us pray together:

My Jesus,  
I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.  
I love You above all things,  
and I desire to receive You into my soul.  
Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally,  
come at least spiritually into my heart.  
I embrace You as if You were already there  
and unite myself wholly to You.  
Never permit me to be separated from You.  
Amen.

## A Message During Lockdown

In light of the protracted lockdown we are currently experiencing, I know a lot of parishioners are struggling with not being able to get to Mass and receive the nourishment of both scripture and the Eucharist, something Fr Chris highlights in his front page article this weekend. Rest assured that I, along with Fr Chris, Fr Chadi, Fr Joseph and the parish team, are remembering you in our prayers at this time. Let us hope and pray that the lockdown will end after the current four-week extension.

One perspective which might assist those who are struggling at the moment to what amounts to a eucharistic fast, is to consider one of the reasons we are called to fast from food occasionally. Though there are many reasons for fasting and various benefits that flow from this ancient practice, one thing it does is to give us solidarity and a certain amount of empathy with those who can't access food for one reason or another. Likewise, a eucharistic fast, though forced upon many of us rather than undertaken freely at this time, can give us solidarity and empathy with our brothers and sisters throughout the world who rarely receive the Eucharist, for one reason or another.

Of course, not being able to get to Mass does not mean an enforced spiritual wasteland. You can still view our weekday 12:30pm Masses (8:00am Saturday) as well as the Sunday 11:00am Mass online via our YouTube channel, the link for which you will find on our website in case you haven't already subscribed (free of charge!) to our channel. You can also, for the time being, watch our Masses on Facebook. If you can't be present to watch our Masses when they are being livestreamed, you can still watch them later as they are saved for future viewing. One of the longest running television programs on commercial television in Australia is "Mass for you at home", and this can be seen on Channel 10 each Sunday morning at 6:00am. You can also access these Masses on the website [massforyou.com.au](http://massforyou.com.au).

In addition to these options, our Diocesan website, [www.parracatholic.org](http://www.parracatholic.org), has resources to feed you spiritually at this time. You can access them by clicking the link which pops up on the homepage when you visit the site. Of course, there is a wealth of other resources floating around in the digital ether if you wish to access them!

I want to reiterate that though we cannot undertake pastoral duties with the "personal touch" at this time to the extent that we would like to, it is still possible for us to chat with people over the phone or via Zoom, etc. If you would like to chat with a member of the clergy or parish team please don't hesitate to make contact with us. We are here to serve you at this time as much as any other.

Once again, rest assured of our prayers at this time and we do hope and pray that we can worship together soon in our beautiful cathedral.



## Saint of the Week

### 2<sup>nd</sup> August - St Peter Julian Eymard (1811– 1868)

Peter Julian Eymard was born at La Mure, France, in 1811, during the anti-clerical aftermath of the French Revolution. In spite of illness and parental opposition he completed his studies for the priesthood, and was ordained at Grenoble in 1834. After spending five years in parochial work, he joined the Marist Fathers at Lyon, with whom he stayed until 1856. He went on to found a new religious society - the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament - whose special duty would be to foster devotion to the Eucharist. Other organisations for sisters and lay members soon followed. During his apostolate he was supported and inspired by his friend and fellow-priest, St John Vianney. Peter died in 1868 and was canonised in 1962 by Pope St John XXIII.

## DID YOU KNOW...

**...that some feast days on the liturgical calendar take precedence over regular Sunday celebrations?**

We have such a situation before us over the next two Sundays, 08 August (St Mary of the Cross MacKillop) and 15 August (The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary). In Australia, Mary of the Cross is a National Patron and so this means that the day has the status of a Solemnity, giving it precedence over a Sunday. The Assumption is a universal feast of high standing and its status, also as a Solemnity (and a Day of Holy Obligation in Australia), means it also takes precedence over a Sunday in Ordinary Time.




