Childlike simplicity...

UNDER NORMAL CIRCUMSTANCES I make it a priority to visit the school a few times throughout the week and I'm always amazed when I visit the younger years. Despite my difficulty in remembering names, the children always greet me with joy and warmth. I recall at



the beginning of this year first meeting the kindergarten children. Their teachers had just introduced me to the class and I spent a few moments saying hello to them. Recess time came and I said my farewells as I had to return to the Cathedral. I exited the classroom with the children and headed towards the front office when I noticed several children walking beside me attempting to hold my hand. I laughed and told them they couldn't come with me as I had to leave. They said, 'Yes, Father' but continued to walk with me to the front office nonetheless. As I left the school, I asked myself why would they walk with me all the way to the office? After all, I just met them. In the end it came to down to the innocence children exhibit when they are young. They don't place importance on what you have or what you do, it's who you are - another person, made in God's image and likeness - that is important.

It is this example, this attitude, that is essential to the spiritual life. As they make their way through Galilee, our Lord reveals to the disciples the blueprint to authentic discipleship; a life patterned according to the example of Christ who both died and rose from the dead. Wealth and worldly success are not keys to spiritual enlightenment, but rather love modelled on Christ. Unfortunately, this important lesson falls on deaf ears as the disciples begin to argue about who is the greatest among them. Rather than berate them, Jesus brings before the disciples a little child, an example of innocence and simplicity. Christ says, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.' We do not approach the Lord with our merits or our achievements, but with loving trust and innocence, like that of a child.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, often in our prayers and pursuit of sanctity we fall into a similar attitude to that of the disciples on the road. We present to the Lord all that we've done for Him. In a sense, we bargain with the Lord. 'I've done this for you, you do this for me.' This, of course, is not the right attitude. The way forward is not in presenting our achievements, but in trusting in what God has already done for us and allowing his grace to move our thoughts, words and deeds. This requires the innocence and simplicity of a child who lovingly places their life in the care of their parents. As we reflect on this Gospel, let us ask the Lord for the grace to approach him like a child. In doing so, we seek to deepen our relationship with Him who offered His life for our salvation.

A Third Message During Lockdown...

Over the past couple of months, we have written a couple of messages on the subject of the pandemic and the lockdown imposed by the government in the interests of minimising the spread of the coronavirus and its sometimes deadly consequences. Those messages have sought to reassure parishioners at a difficult time and to encourage all to receive one of the vaccines on offer. We do hope you have been encouraged by the endorsement that Pope Francis and Bishop Vincent have given on the moral aspects of the vaccination for Covid-19.

This third message sees us all at a point in the lockdown where there is, at the very least, a glimmer of light dawning on the difficult situation we have endured over the past couple of months. This light is breaking because of the increased vaccination rate and will shine brighter as an increased number of people seek to take advantage of the vaccines on offer. At this stage there is no certainty about whether parishioners will need to have received the vaccine in order to participate in parish activities, including Mass, but we would encourage those who have not yet received the vaccine to consider doing so. Once we have some news on this matter, we will let you know. Most certainly, the diocese will issue guidance on vaccine mandates when the time for reopening nears.


Speaking of this, we at least now have *some* hope that Masses with a congregation will be allowed in the not-too-distant future, with mid-October being suggested as a possible time for reopening. This will depend, of course, on the NSW government declaring that a sufficient percentage of the population has been vaccinated to make an easing of restrictions feasible. Let's hope and pray that this is so and do our part to increase the likelihood of this happening.

Rest assured that the clergy and staff of St Patrick's continue to pray for you and Masses are being offered for all parishioners on a regular basis. Please pray for us and let us hope that this glimmer of light with regard to a possible reopening grows bigger and brighter in the coming weeks, culminating in the chance for us to meet and worship

together again in our beautiful cathedral.



Saint of the Week

20th September - Sts Andrew Kim Taegon, Paul Chong Hasang and Co.

For centuries, Korea was closed to all outside influences, and all contact with foreigners was forbidden. No missionaries went there. Nevertheless, a number of laymen sought to find out all they could about the outside world. Some books about Christianity fell into their hands and they were converted. It is likely Christianity started in Korea in the early seventeenth century. In the nineteenth century over ten thousand Christians were executed with great cruelty.

For most of these years, the Church in Korea had no priests and was an entirely lay phenomenon. The first priest, a Frenchman, entered the country in 1836 and was beheaded three years later. Andrew Kim Taegon, the first Korean priest, secretly trained in Macau, entered Korea in 1845 and was executed in 1846, together with his father. A lay apostle, Paul Chong Hasang, and many others perished at the same time. A further major persecution occurred in 1866.

In all, 103 Korean martyrs are celebrated today. They are mostly lay men and women: some married, some not; some old, some young, even some children.



NEWS FROM ROME

From Pope Francis' Mass on 14 September in Prešov, Slovakia: 'How do we learn to see glory in the cross? Some of the saints teach us that the cross is like a book: in order to know it, we have to open it and read it. It is not enough to buy a book, take a look at it and put it on a shelf in our home.

The same is true for the cross: it is painted or carved everywhere in our churches. Crucifixes are found all around us: on necks, in homes, in cars, in pockets. What good is this, unless we stop to look at the crucified Jesus and open our hearts to him, unless we let ourselves be struck by the wounds he bears for our sake, unless our hearts swell with emotion and we weep before the God wounded for love of us. Unless we do that, the cross remains an unread book whose title and author we know, without its having any impact on our lives. Let us not reduce the cross to an object of devotion, much less to a political symbol, to a sign of religious and social status.'

We are a small family of three – Peter and Priscilla, and our son, Patrick.






