I will comfort them as I lead them back...

THIS WEEKEND MARKS the first weekend of the reopening of our churches and other places of worship to congregations after an extended and unprecedented period of closure. The words of Jeremiah in our First Reading this weekend, a line of which is quoted above, are particularly moving in light of the extraordinary circumstances which have culminated in the reopening of churches and other places of worship over the past few days.



As I noted in the recently published Annual Report, this return to worship after a long hiatus gives us an opportunity to reflect on the importance of parish life and all it offers, including of course, the Eucharist. At this stage, Bishop Vincent has not lifted the suspension of the Sunday obligation, and so for those who are apprehensive about returning to Mass at this stage, there need be no anxiety on this matter.

But with regard to the idea of the "Sunday obligation", we might ask ourselves why we come to Mass each Sunday. Am I coming only out of the sense of fulfilling an obligation? If the Sunday obligation was never reinstated, would that affect my attendance? Would I only then come to Mass occasionally, perhaps even just on the "big occasions" like Christmas and Easter? Or would my pattern of attendance be unchanged? Is there a more profound reason why I come to Mass each Sunday that has nothing to do with the force of habit or a sense of guilt if I miss Mass?

On returning to Mass after a long absence, it is worthwhile asking what has been missed most about the Sunday celebration. The answer might be one thing or several things (and might not be explicitly "religious"): fellow worshippers, hospitality, music, the space, scripture, the Eucharist, prayerfulness, maybe even the opportunity to sanctify the week ahead. In reminding ourselves what we value about the Sunday Mass, we are reconnecting with that part of us that craves intimacy with God and God's people, something that may have been somewhat neglected over the past few months due to circumstances beyond our control. This is something that Bishop Vincent has highlighted in his pastoral letter which you received with this bulletin.

A few months ago, as churches in the United Kingdom reopened after an even longer period of closure, the Catholic periodical "The Tablet" (31 July) noted in its editorial that bishops might have concerns about people not returning to Mass and that they might be tempted to appeal to the Sunday obligation as a means of ensuring Catholics would return to Mass. It suggested that a better way would be to emphasise the Eucharist as a source of healing, unity, and nourishment, the true "source and summit of the Christian life" as emphasised in Church teaching. If people have the benefits of something pointed out to them, the "big stick" approach is redundant. And what is more beneficial than that which makes us more like Christ?

So, welcome back! The parish clergy and staff look forward to continuing to serve you as we reopen. There will be several opportunities to gather socially between now and Christmas, so please keep an eye and ear open for them so as to reconnect and strengthen the bonds that join us as brothers and sisters in Christ.

Wishing you a blessed week ahead as we re-open!

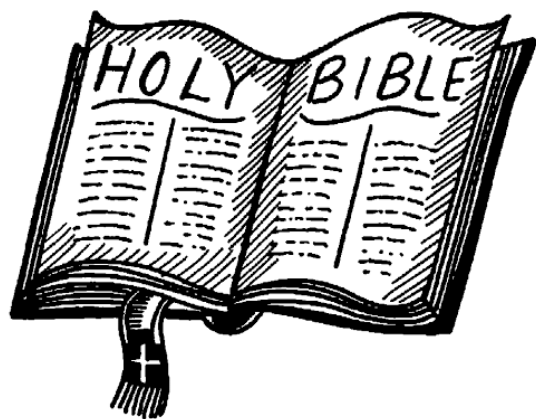

Saint of the Week

24th October - St Antony Mary Claret (1807 - 1870)

Antony was born at Sallent in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. After becoming a priest he spent several years preaching to the people throughout Catalonia and also in the Canary Islands. Returning to Spain, he established a missionary order, and founded a great religious library and publishing house in Barcelona which published millions of cheap copies of ancient and modern Catholic works. In 1851 the Pope appointed him Bishop of Santiago de Cuba. The diocese was in a terrible state and everything needed reform and renewal. He reorganised the seminary, enforced clerical discipline, and regularised thousands of marriages. He built a hospital and many schools. This was not done without opposition and he was the subject of fifteen assassination attempts.

Recalled to Spain in 1857 by Queen Isabella II to act as her confessor, he did further great work for the Church. His health began to fail, and he died at the Cistercian abbey at Fontfroide.

DID YOU KNOW...

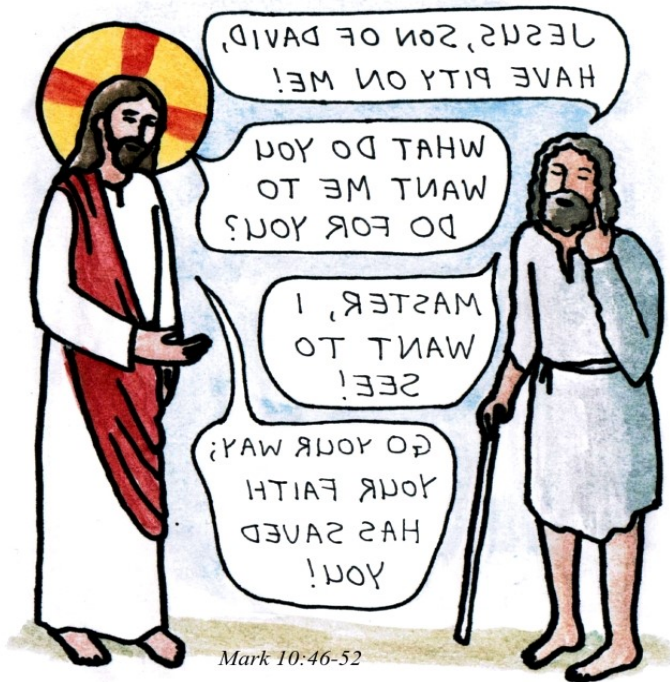
...that as Catholics we do not worship Mary and other saints?

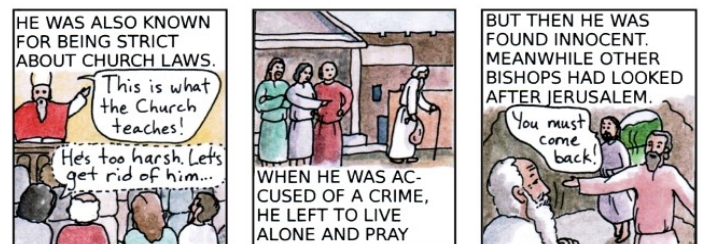

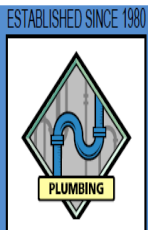
