'Place me with your Son!'

IN 1537, IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA was journeying to Rome with his companions in order that they might offer themselves to the Pope for his missioning. At a shrine at La Storta, a few kilometres north-west of Rome, Ignatius received an extraordinary response to his novena-like prayer to Mary, "Place me with your Son." Ignatius describes his experience



in these words: "He experienced such a change in his soul and saw so clearly that God the Father placed him with Christ his Son that he would not dare doubt it – that God the Father had placed him with his Son." In the "seeing", Jesus was carrying his cross. The Father addresses Ignatius and says, "I shall be favourable to you at Rome." Then the Father turns to Jesus who is carrying his cross and makes this request: "I want you to take this man to serve us." Jesus, with his cross in hand, looks at Ignatius and says: "We want you to serve us." The vision is an obvious answer to Ignatius's prayer to Mary. He is confirmed in his being placed with Jesus in action carrying his cross. This vision becomes an icon of Ignatian spirituality. The vision is about Ignatian service. TO BE PLACED WITH THE SON means TO SERVE. Hence, my prayer on my bookmark to commemorate my ordination on the 22^{nd} February 2019.

I never had any visions like St Ignatius but the desire to serve as a deacon is something that I feel strongly in my prayers. When the Bishop asked me to serve at South Mount Druitt, my first reaction was, "Why me?" I felt the heaviness of the cross on my shoulder, but I could not say "no" to the Bishop if I truly believe that God speaks through one that is the successor of the Apostles. Since I always regularly pray to Mary to be placed with her Son, then my prayers have been heard! I must carry the cross not grudgingly but with the same will as that of Mary who accepted to be "the handmaid of the Lord." They say to be careful what you pray for. The words of Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane: "Thy will be done, not mine" has now a new whole meaning for me. A few days ago, I retired from nursing, thinking of having a relaxed life. It did not last long. This is what it takes sometimes to serve – to be a disciple of Christ.

I am saying all this with great humility to demonstrate that unless the talk becomes action, then the Gospel is not truly our way of living. Many of you asked me, "Why are you leaving us?" With some humour, I answered, "Ask the Bishop!" The answer is more profound than anyone may think, since to do God's will, we need to listen to those God sends around us and to those who really love us. Some of you told me that there is no better person to be appointed as the Pastoral Director of a Parish and others said, 'Our loss is their gain!" These words were of great consolation in the midst of the uncertainty, fear and anxiety I was going through during my discernment process.

Your support has been amazing. Your words of encouragement have been soothing to my soul. We have experienced highs and some lows together during my two and a half years ministering in the Cathedral. You have taught me a lot and you have become part of my life. For this, I say, "Thank you." How much I wish there are more words to show my gratitude to you and to God! God has formed me and

moulded me to be a better person during my stay. The work in the 'field hospital' is plentiful and the need to move has arrived. My only hope is that I brought you, in some way, closer to God with my example, words and love. Please pray for your priests and deacons. Au revoir!

SYNOD 2021-2023

In his homily to open the journey of the Synod of Bishops, Pope Francis called to mind the rich young man who desired to follow Jesus. As avid readers of the scriptures we are well aware of this account. The rich young man approaches Jesus, impresses him with his devotion to the law but walks away in sadness following Christ's call to renounce all earthly attachments. To follow Christ requires a process of self-emptying. Yet Pope Francis tackles this particular account from another angle, he focuses on the very first line of the Gospel 'Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him.' Why this particular line? Pope Francis shows that Christ is always journeying, moving from one place to another yet continues to avail himself to all. Along his journey he encounters many (all with ranging issues) whom he never turns away. Jesus encounters, listens and discerns. Take the rich young man; Jesus, being the Incarnate Word, knew exactly what this man needed. Yet he didn't jump to conclusions, he conversed with the young man, seeking to draw him into the heart of the Father. This journeying process is the hallmark of the Synodal process the Pope calls the faithful to. I ask you to continue to pray for this process.

December, continuing for the Sundays following till just before Christmas. Then, as in the past, the Café closes until February. We will keep you posted. Checking with





Saint of the Week

15th November - St Albert the Great (1206-1280)

Albert was born at Lauingen on the Danube in Germany in 1206, and studied at Padua and Paris before entering the Order of Preachers (Dominicans). He taught in a number of places including the University of Paris, where St Thomas Aquinas studied under him.

He was one of the greatest philosophers of the Middle Ages, coming at the beginning of the great flowering that came wit the rediscovery of the works of Aristotle. He had a great interest in science and astronomy and his learning gave him the title, as a Doctor of the Church, of *Doctor Universalis*, the "Universal Doctor".

In 1260 the Pope made him Bishop of Regensburg, a post that he held for three years before resigning it. He made great efforts to secure peace between people and between cities. He died at Cologne in 1280.

"Dear Brothers and Sisters: Today we conclude our series of catecheses on Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians. We have seen Paul speak in a variety of ways as apostle, theologian and pastor, opening up the inexhaustible riches of Jesus Christ. Paul's personal encounter with the risen Lord led him to

proclaim boldly the freedom from sin and death won by Christ's victory on the Cross, and the new life bestowed on us by the Holy Spirit at our baptism. Paul's insistence that charity is the fulfilment of the law should lead us enthusiastically to pursue the way of Christian love and to cultivate the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Nor should we ever grow weary or discouraged by our failures or apparent lack of progress. Saint Augustine evokes the image of Christ asleep in the boat amid the storm to remind us that whenever we feel weary and the tempests of life threaten to overwhelm us, we need but awaken Christ in our hearts, trusting in his faithful presence and the lifegiving power of his Spirit. With Saint Paul, may we constantly rejoice in the newness, joy and freedom of the new life proclaimed by the Gospel."

Appreciating the Natural Environment

A good place to start thinking about what does 'the cry of the earth' mean for each of us is to appreciate our natural environment to help us focus on actions to treasure it. Parramatta has many options to escape the built environment and get out into nature. Paths along the Parramatta River allow us to walk, run or ride. You can observe the many bird species, watch mud crabs scuttling and contemplate the cobbled spread of mangroves on the riverbank. Parramatta Park is also a wonderful outdoor space, with majestic eucalypts and regenerated shrub habitat perfect for picnics, playing and quiet contemplation of a book, the sky or just being outside. Lake Parramatta has a 4km bush walking circuit, with stopping places to rest and contemplate the bush serenity, plus options to swim and kayak if that's your thing. The Sydney basin is ringed by multiple national parks to the north, west and south, natural places interfacing with suburbs (Lane Cove, Botany Bay) plus the iconic harbour with many foreshore bushland pockets protected. Parramatta Council has an extensive bushcare program involving community volunteers if you're inspired to get more deeply involved in hands on nature conservation locally. There are also national tree day mass planting activities too.


DID YOU KNOW...




