'Yes, I am a king....'

THE LORD IS KING; he is robed in majesty. The words of our responsorial psalm reflect the common understanding of a king - a man seated on a large throne, dressed in royal robes with a large crown atop his head. His very presence oozes power and authority. Yet as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, our gospel depicts a very different image of a King.


Our gospel is situated in the middle of the Passion Narrative. Christ, at this point, has been arrested and is now on trial before Herod. He is not dressed in royal robes nor does his presence seem to exude power. Jesus is chained and looks like a criminal. Following a brief exchange, Pilate asks Jesus 'So you are a king then?' Pilate, like the masses who have arrested Jesus, understands kingship in terms of physical appearance and the abundance of wealth and power; a man beaten and chained could not be considered royal. Despite his situation Jesus answers 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.' When you consider the journey Christ is set on, the suffering he is to endure, and the determination to atone for the sins of humanity, Jesus, standing before Pilate beaten and bruised is robed in majesty.

To perceive kingship in terms of one's outward appearance is to misunderstand the role of a king. A true king desires the highest good of the subjects he serves. In his Passion Christ desired our freedom from sin and death - he desired to share paradise with us. As such Christ's appearance in our Gospel is one of majesty, for by his wounds we are healed.

My dear friends, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, may we give thanks to God for his abundant goodness. In emptying himself our Lord has won for us the prize of immortality. May we live in thanksgiving to God and seek to exhibit the same love toward our neighbours.



Saints of the Week

24th November - St Andrew Dũng-Lạc and his Companions, Martyrs

The evangelisation of Vietnam began in the sixteenth century. There are now about six million Catholics in Vietnam, some ten percent of the population.

This growth comes partly from the fact that since the earliest times the seed of the Faith has been watered by the blood of the martyrs of Vietnam - the missionary clergy, the local clergy and the ordinary Christian people. Over the course of the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries no less than 53 decrees signed by the lords and emperors of the country from 1625 to 1886, launched one persecution of Christians after another, each one more savage than the last. Over the whole territory of Vietnam about 130,000 Christians were killed in these persecutions, 117 of them canonised by Pope St John Paul II in 1988. By nationality 96 were Vietnamese, 11 Spanish and 10 French. Some were religious, others laypeople. They were killed in a variety of ways: by beheading, strangulation, burning alive, torn to pieces and whilst under torture in prison.

NEWS FROM ROME



"Dear Brothers and Sisters: In this year of Saint Joseph, today we begin a new series of catecheses on the humble carpenter of Nazareth, the foster-father of the child Jesus and the patron of the Universal Church. In Hebrew, the name Joseph evokes God's power to bring about growth and new life. Joseph teaches us to trust in God's providence quietly at work in our world. His life is principally associated with two small towns, Bethlehem and Nazareth, reminding us that God's preferential love is for the poor and those on the margins of life. God chose Bethlehem, the city of David, as the place where his Son was to be born under the watchful care of Joseph, who was himself of the house of David. By his life and example, Saint Joseph reminds us that, in our own day, the Church is called to proclaim the good news of Christ's coming, beginning with the existential peripheries of our world. The poor and forgotten in our midst can look to him as a sure guide and protector in their lives. Let us ask Saint Joseph to intercede for the Church, that we may always set forth anew from Bethlehem, in order to see and appreciate what is essential in God's eyes."

Living Laudato Si' - FOOD

Laudato Si's coverage of 'the cry of the earth' and 'the cry of the poor' elements are both relevant to food production and access. Our pandemic experience of supply chain strain producing gaps in Australian supermarkets has made visible the potentially invisible but critical roles played by those who grow, harvest, transport and sell food for us. At a global level, Laudato Si calls us to reflect at a global level on a world that can produce enough food to feed the world's population, but where food is unequally distributed, generating malnutrition and starvation for many millions and obesity and food wastage for others. Locally in Parramatta, the recent lockdown experience and COVID isolation requirements produced food insecurity for many community members, necessitating foodbanks to be established and expanded in our community to meet this basic need.

Potential responses to food access issues could have several forms. Acknowledge and thank the food retail staff you meet who have worked through the pandemic to keep our community supplied with food. Starting to grow your own food or exploring community gardens run by local councils will both increase self-sufficiency plus appreciation for those who work to deliver food to us. Supporting non-perishable food donation drives run by a range of charities will reallocate food resources to those in our community who really need the assistance. Thoughtful food purchasing will buy an adequate rather than excessive amount of food.

There are many small-scale food producers in and around the Sydney basin. The Hawkesbury Harvest food trail is a good starting point for identifying opportunities to visit farms, understand food production from a farming perspective and pick your own produce. It's a great option to combine with a drive and potential picnic day out.


The General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar (39), states the following:




