“Master, what must we do?”



ON THIS THIRD SUNDAY in Advent we acknowledge a change in pace and mood in our Advent journey, made clear to us by the lighting of a rose-coloured candle in addition to the violet ones lit over the first and second Sundays of Advent. The Church anticipates the great celebration for which we are preparing – the Nativity, the event in history marking the beginning of our salvation – and our readings reflect this lift in mood with the reading from the prophet Zephaniah trumpeting a fanfare of joy: “Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away.”

The Gospel is less obvious in expressing this uplifted, anticipatory mood but does acknowledge that there was, among the people gathered around John the Baptist “a feeling of expectancy.” They understand that John has come to prepare the way for Jesus the Anointed One, and so they ask him a profound question: “What must we do?” Each of the groups gathered around John, the crowd in general, the tax collectors and the soldiers, asks the same question. They were all keen to know what needed to be done to prepare for the coming of the Messiah.

And fair enough, too. Imagine if you were told that you were to be entertaining someone of great importance or fame in your home in a couple of days' time. Surely you would do your utmost to make certain you had plenty of provisions in stock, do some research to ensure you could hold a conversation with this person, and so on? Each person in such a situation would surely adopt the same approach.

John the Baptist does not outline a generic routine for preparing the way for the coming of Jesus. Note how he gives a different answer to each of the groups that approach him. He urges the general crowd to share with the less fortunate, the tax collectors to be just and the soldiers to be gentle and content with their pay. Each person therefore, is called to examine their behaviour and eliminate anything that is contrary to charity. The aim is *general*, to be more Christlike, but the manner in which this is achieved is *specific* to each individual depending on circumstances, personality, and so on.

There is no “tick-a-box” way of living as a Christian unless you consider there to be just one box to be ticked, a box labelled “Living like Jesus”. A formulaic approach to faith only induces unnecessary anxiety (“Did I say all ten Hail Marys in that Mystery of the Rosary”) and possibly smugness on the part of those with the disposition and inner strength which enables them to adhere to rules and regulations, even at the expense of true happiness and fulfillment. But Jesus didn't come to save people with certain characteristics or abilities; he came to save us all.

And this salvation begins with recognition of our shortcomings as Christian disciples, repentance for our sins and a desire to change and start anew, living lives of loving response to a merciful God. This is called conversion and it is what John the Baptist preached to prepare the world for the coming of the Messiah.

In essence, conversion is “what we must do” and we must commit to it daily to experience life to the full, that very reason that the one for whom John prepared the way, Jesus, came into our world.







Saints of the Week

14th December - St John of the Cross (1542-1591), Priest, Doctor

John was born in Fontiveros, Spain, in about 1542. He spent some time as a Carmelite friar before, in 1568, Saint Teresa of Ávila persuaded him to pioneer the reform of the Carmelite order. This was a difficult task and a dangerous one: he suffered imprisonment and severe punishment at the hands of the Church authorities. He died at the monastery of Ubeda in Andalusia on 14 December 1591: the monks there had initially treated him as the worst of sinners, but by the time he died they had recognised his sanctity and his funeral was the occasion of a great outburst of enthusiasm.



His works include two major mystical poems—he is considered one of the greatest poets of the Spanish language—and detailed commentaries on them and the spiritual truths they convey. He was canonised in 1726 and declared a Doctor of the Church (someone who is considered to have contributed significantly to an understanding of the faith) in 1926.

NEWS FROM...ROME



General Audience, 01 December: ‘Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on Saint Joseph, we now reflect on Saint Matthew’s description of Joseph as both “a just man” and as “the husband of Mary”. As a devout son of Israel, Joseph willingly submitted to the requirements of the Law and its precepts concerning marriage. Having learned that Mary was already with child, out of love and regard for her Joseph sought to spare her the humiliation of a public separation. Then, in a dream, Joseph learned from an angel that it was right that he should marry Mary, since she had conceived her son by the power of the Holy Spirit. By God’s providence, Joseph came to a deeper understanding of divine justice and its authentic demands. Joseph and Mary’s openness to God’s saving plan brings their love to a maturity expressed in the virtues of chastity, fidelity, respect and humility. Far from restricting our freedom, these virtues in fact give our love direction and endurance. In this sense, Joseph and Mary can serve as an example not only to young people engaged to be married, but to all of us, who also in the midst of life’s inevitable challenges, are called to discover the true joy and freedom that come from trusting in God’s just and providential concern for our lives.’

Living Laudato Si' - CHILDREN

Children have an innate curiosity plus wonder and awe for the natural environment. Encourage their engagement with the natural world by experiencing it fully. Let little hands play with dirt, touch grass shrubs and bark, point at insects and birds living their lives and ask why is the sky blue? Give them opportunities for all their senses to appreciate our wonderful planet, including taste, if you are brave! Find a comfortable place outside, get a rug and look at the sky and clouds with a pre-school child and discuss what might be going on. Enjoy stimulating their creativity and taking a shared journey to a wonderful unknown destination!

For older primary school and early high school children, technology offers the opportunity of positive screen based experiences via citizen science projects run by many government and environmental organisations. These allow an enhanced appreciation to be developed of threatened species and the biological sciences.

The Parramatta Diocese also has a short video on The Well platform summarising Laudato Si's key concepts of care for creation aimed at infant to mid primary-aged students.

DID YOU KNOW...

...that John the Baptist, featured prominently in our Gospel this weekend and last weekend, had his own disciples prior to Jesus commencing his ministry?

The most famous follower of John was, of course, the apostle Andrew (John 1:40). Scholars differ in their opinion about who the second disciple was (John 1:35), but most say either John or Phillip. Apart from these two, the Acts of the Apostles mentions Apollos (Acts 18:25) as having received the baptism of John as well as a group of believers encountered by Paul, also at Ephesus who were in the same situation (Acts 19:1-3). Of course, there most likely were many more who had closely followed John during his ministry preparing the way for Jesus. Some scholars even believe Jesus to have been John's disciple!


