"...my favour rests on you."

THIS WEEKEND WE CELEBRATE the third of the great revelations of God to the world in the person of Jesus Christ: his baptism. This third revelation occurs in the space of less than three weeks, the first being the Nativity (Christmas Day) and the second being last weekend's feast of the Epiphany of the Lord when Christ was revealed as the universal Saviour by the Magi, the wise men (or kings) from the East. Today we fast forward about thirty years to the baptism of Jesus by his cousin John in the River Jordan.

Speaking of baptism, I must say that whilst I enjoy everything about the sacramental side of priestly ministry, including the awesome privilege of celebrating the Eucharist, baptism is the sacrament I enjoy celebrating the most, particularly when baptising infants. It is almost always an occasion marked by great *joie de vivre*. People find it difficult not to be happy in the presence of a baby, especially one just a few months old and, for the celebrant, there is a more relaxed atmosphere than usual in the church.

Returning to the baptism of Jesus, it is worthwhile reflecting on the timing of his baptism. It is significant that he chooses to be baptised as he prepares to begin his mission, preaching repentance and calling people to the Kingdom of God. Immediately following his baptism, Jesus ventures into the wilderness "where for forty days he was tempted by the devil." (Luke 4:2a) Following his desert experience, Jesus, "filled with the power of the Spirit," returns to his hometown and begins his mission by preaching in the synagogue in Nazareth. We are aware of the reception he received!

The question of why Jesus chose to be baptised is rather a vexed one. Of course, if there is one effect of baptism that Jesus did not need, it is forgiveness for sin! Many commentators point to Jesus asking to be baptised as a means of showing us the way, setting us an example to follow. The example doesn't end at his baptism: all that Jesus did in the years following his baptism up to his death is a means of pointing the way to holiness for us, helping us to know how to be fully human and the path to salvation. We choose to ignore his example at our peril.

We are baptised for the very purpose of preaching the Kingdom of God. Admittedly, we'll do it in a manner different to Jesus but the mission is the same. Though most of us are baptised as infants, our parents, godparents and parish community have the responsibility of helping us to develop a deep and meaningful relationship with God. We will be tempted as Jesus was, but our resolve will be firm if we have a strong foundation in the faith. Our mission is to spread the Good News of God's Kingdom through the gifts and talents God has given us, to be conduits of God's healing love through the manner in which we love others—in a nutshell, to be just like Jesus. It is an awesome responsibility but a joyful one...

...and it begins with our baptism.

NEWS FROM...ROME

From Pope Francis' Homily on the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (01 January 2022):

"The New Year begins under the sign of the Holy Mother of God, under the sign of the Mother. A mother's gaze is the path to rebirth and growth. We need mothers, women who look at the world not to exploit it, but so that it can have life. Women who, seeing with the heart, can combine dreams and aspirations with concrete reality, without drifting into abstraction and sterile pragmatism. And the Church is a Mother, this is what makes the Church feminine. For this reason, we cannot find a place for women in the Church without allowing the heart of the Woman and Mother to shine. This is the place of women in the Church, the great place, from which other places, more concrete and less important, are derived. But the Church is Mother, the Church is woman. And since mothers bestow life, and women "keep" the world, let us all make greater efforts to promote mothers and to protect women. How much violence is directed against women! Enough! To hurt a woman is to insult God, who from a woman took on our humanity. He did not do it through an angel; nor did he come directly; he did it through a woman. Like a woman, the Mother Church, takes the humanity of her sons and daughters."

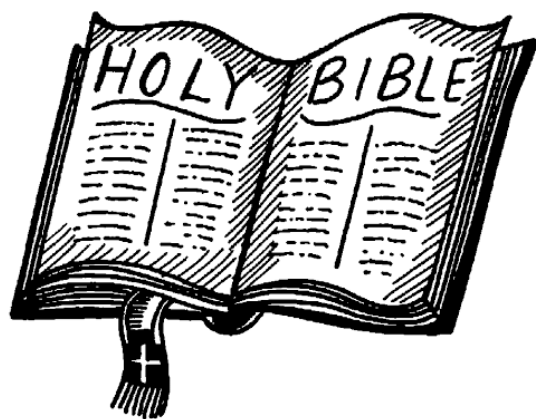

Saint of the Week

11th January - St Aelred of Rievaulx (c.1109 - 1167), Abbot

Aelred was born in Hexham, northern England, around 1109. His family was well connected and he was sent at an early age to serve in the court of King David of Scotland. He was attracted to religious life but also attached to life at the king's court. At the age of 24, after a personal struggle, he entered the newly founded Cistercian monastery at Rievaulx, Yorkshire. After a short time at another new monastery in Lincolnshire, he returned to Rievaulx as Abbot where he remained until his death in 1167.

Aelred is remembered for both his energy and gentleness. His writings and sermons were characterised by a deep love of the scriptures and by a very personal love of Christ "as friend and Saviour". Under his direction, Rievaulx grew to an extraordinary size.

Aelred has been called the St Bernard of the North.

Commentary on St John's Gospel

NEWS FROM...ROME



"Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on Saint Joseph, we now consider Joseph's dignity as the foster-father of Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary. As Mary's husband and Jesus' legal father, Joseph had all the rights of a father, including that of naming their child. Yet Joseph had learned from the angel that, in God's plan, Mary's Son was to be named Jesus, which means "the Lord saves". Joseph's docility to God's will and his fatherly care for the child Jesus can teach us much about the authentic meaning of parenthood. To be a mother or father is not simply a matter of biology; more profoundly, it entails caring for the life of a family. In this sense, one of the highest forms of parenthood is to take on the responsibility of becoming adoptive parents, prepared to welcome an orphaned or abandoned child as part of one's own family. Let us pray that through Joseph's intercession, fathers of families will be given the grace to respond to their noble vocation, and that the many children in our world who long for a secure and loving home will find a welcome on the part of good and generous families."

Pray for PEACE...

As the New Year begins, let us pray that it will see God work in ways that will motivate those responsible for violent conflicts to open their hearts to possibilities for true and lasting peace. Peace is not the mere absence of war, good as that is, but true peace comes about through an attitude of tolerance, understanding and respect for the dignity of all.

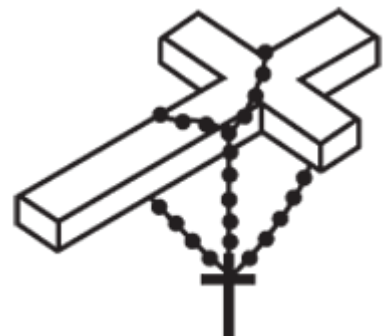

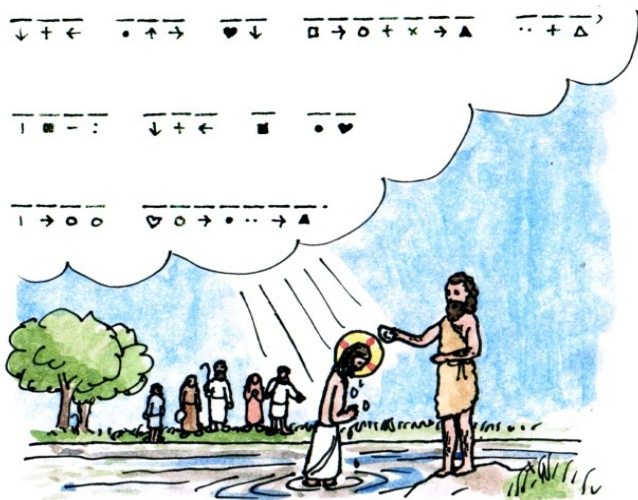
...that the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan is the first of the Rosary's Luminous Mysteries, prayed each Thursday?

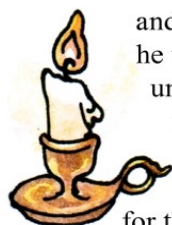

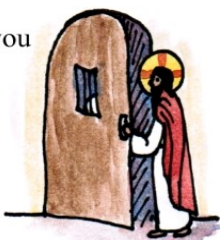

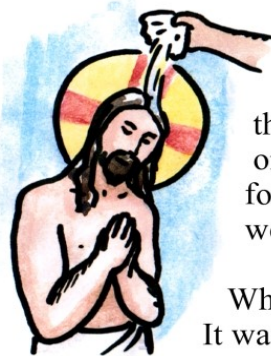

When you were baptized God was getting you ready for a special job too. He was giving you grace so that you could grow closer to Him and bring other people closer to Him too.

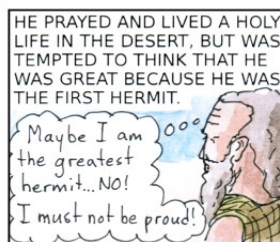
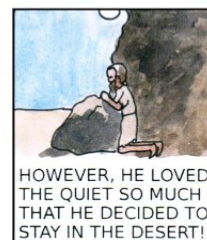
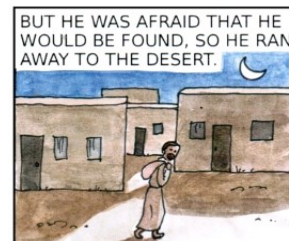
