## Mary, our Intercessor



WHEN I WAS YOUNGER I remember hearing a story of a king who was devoted to his people. He would pour his time and effort to serve his subjects in order for them to flourish. The subjects of his kingdom were so impressed by his efforts that they would send gifts to his palace as a token of their affection. It so happened that a young pauper wanted to give the king a gift. According to hearsay the king's favourite fruit was a pear. The pauper made his way to the finest pear tree in the kingdom, picked one fruit and made his way to the palace gates. Upon arrival he was met by the palace guards who told him he was not allowed to enter as he was dressed poorly. Disappointed but not deterred, he sought a way to enter the palace. Circumnavigating the palace his nose caught the scent of cooked food. Following his nose he noticed an open window that led into the kitchen. Seeing his chance, he jumped left and right, scurried up the ramp, moved past the guard and jumped through the window. With a smile on his face he made his way to the kitchen door when it suddenly opened. Standing before him in all her majesty was the queen mother herself. Falling to his knees he explained to the queen mother his intentions. "I want to give this pear, the king's favourite fruit, to him as a gift." Seeing his honesty and purity the queen smiled. She took the young pauper by the hand and walked him into the throne room to the king before all his advisors. Standing before the king she and the pauper bowed low. Raising her eyes to the king she said "My king, please receive this gift from your faithful subject." The young pauper could hardly believe what he saw. On a silver tray surrounded by a garland of flowers was the pear he picked for the king. The king smiled, received the gift and gave thanks to the young pauper.

This story, while fiction, speaks volumes of the role of our Blessed Mother. Our Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time explores the miracle at the wedding feast at Cana. Whilst the focus of the passage remains on Christ, (this is the first of the signs in John's Gospel), it is Mary who intercedes for the wedding party. Seeing a need she rushes to the aid of the bride and groom. In ancient times a wedding celebration would last a few days and wine was an essential part of the festivities. The absence of wine would spell the end of the celebration. As such the shortage of wine is no small incident. Mary, aware of the needs of the bride and groom, intercedes on their behalf. She implores her Son and her God to provide for the celebration. Her efforts prove fruitful as we hear from the steward: 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

Dear friends, as we begin Ordinary Time, a season of growth in our spiritual lives, may we seek the powerful intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Like the story of the pauper, she too crowns our prayers and needs with her beauty such that they are presented as a fragrant offering to the Lord. May we rely on her as we walk this pilgrimage of life.



### Easing of restrictions




## Saint of the Week

### 17<sup>th</sup> January - St Anthony of the Desert (251 - 356), Abbot

St Anthony is the originator of monastic life. He was born in Egypt in 251. When his parents died, he listened to the words of the Gospel and gave all his belongings to the poor. He went out into the wilderness to begin a life of penitence, living in absolute poverty, praying, meditating, and supporting himself by manual work. He suffered many temptations, both physical and spiritual, but he overcame them. Disciples gathered round him, attracted by his wisdom, moderation, and holiness. He gave support to the victims of the persecutions of the Roman Emperor Diocletian, and helped St Athanasius in his fight against the Arian heretics.

He lived to be over a hundred years old and died in 356.




Extract from Pope Francis' annual address to the Vatican diplomatic corps: 'It is therefore important to continue the effort to immunize the general population as much as possible. This calls for a manifold commitment on the personal, political and international levels. First, on the personal level. Each of us has a responsibility to care for ourself and our health, and this translates into respect for the health of those around us. Health care is a moral obligation. Sadly, we are finding increasingly that we live in a world of strong ideological divides. Frequently people let themselves be influenced by the ideology of the moment, often bolstered by baseless information or poorly documented facts. Every ideological statement severs the bond of human reason with the objective reality of things. The pandemic, on the other hand, urges us to adopt a sort of "reality therapy" that makes us confront the problem head on and adopt suitable remedies to resolve it. Vaccines are not a magical means of healing, yet surely they represent, in addition to other treatments that need to be developed, the most reasonable solution for the prevention of the disease.'

## Pray for PEACE...

As the New Year begins, let us pray that it will see God work in ways that will motivate those responsible for violent conflicts to open their hearts to possibilities for true and lasting peace. Peace is not the mere absence of war, good as that is, but true peace comes about through an attitude of tolerance, understanding and respect for the dignity of all.

## DID YOU KNOW...


...that the “Thrones, Dominions, and Powers” that we often hear mentioned in the Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer, are actually ranks of angels?

The lowest are Angels, Archangels and Principalities; the middle order is made up of Powers, Virtues and Dominions; and the highest are Thrones, Cherubim and Seraphim.

We can learn from this story that we should listen to our parents. Jesus is God and even He obeys His mother!


Here's another thing: if you need Jesus to help you with anything, pray to His Blessed Mother to ask Him for it. You know He will listen to His Mother!
