“Take the plank out of your own eye first...”

THIS WEEKEND MARKS our last Sunday in Ordinary Time until the end of June. As you are aware, Lent begins this Wednesday and so our weekend Masses over the next three months will be focused both on the penitential season of Lent and the joyous season of Easter, right through to Pentecost on 05 June. Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi, as usual, follow in the wake of Pentecost and so the next Sunday in Ordinary Time falls on 26 June.

Last weekend we began to hear Jesus' detailed teaching following the beatitudes and we were challenged to love our enemies. This weekend we continue to hear from the Sermon on the Plain and Jesus challenges us to reflect on our tendency to judge the behaviour of others without having the humility to acknowledge our own imperfections, the well-known “take the plank out of your own eye first” teaching.

The teaching about not judging others is sometimes misunderstood to mean that we must not judge the actions of others. On the contrary, we need to judge actions otherwise the whole basis of our Christian ethical system would be undermined! What we are called *not* to do is to judge a person solely on the basis of their actions. How often do we see someone and make a judgement about them, sometimes on the mere appearance of the person rather than on anything substantial? To judge a person exclusively on their actions or appearance is to define a fellow human being in a narrow manner, failing to acknowledge that, like me, that person is made in the image and likeness of God. It fails to recognise the truth that a person's identity as a child of God and a human being is a great deal more than what they do or what they look like.

On a few rare occasions in our life we may be fortunate to come across someone who strikes us as being remarkable because of the way they bear themselves, radiating a sense of contentment and being comfortable within their own skin, someone who accepts who they are and extends that acceptance to others. If we had met Jesus during his time on earth he would have been such a person. Such people know they are not perfect but don't possess the insecurities many of us have which we sometimes project onto others as a means of feeling better about ourselves.

Surely this is how we should strive to be. We are warned by Jesus to build our treasure in heaven and it is in this that we find true contentment. Judging others and failing to recognise our own shortcomings is certainly the antithesis of building treasure in heaven where it will do us most good. As we move into the season of Lent this coming week, let us make a personal commitment to doing some serious reflection on our faith journey and pledge to make some progress on that journey by viewing others charitably and removing that plank from our eye which blinds us to the truth about ourselves and equally prevents us from seeing Christ in all whom we encounter.

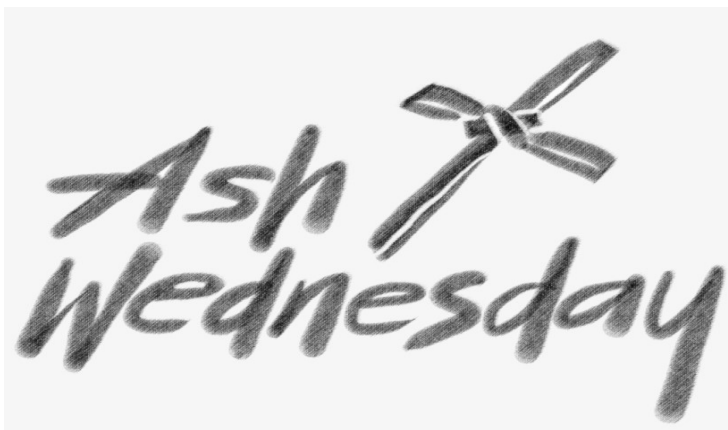

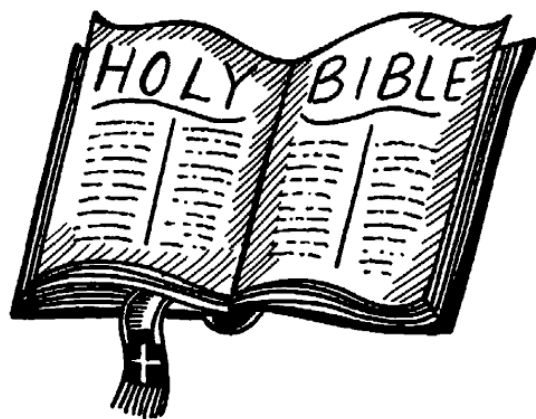

04th March - St Casimir (1458-1484),

Casimir was the second son of King Casimir IV of Poland. He assiduously cultivated the Christian virtues, especially chastity and generosity to the poor. Zealous in faith, he had a particular devotion to the Eucharist and the Virgin Mary. For several years, while his father was away in Lithuania (the Kings of Poland at this time were also Grand Dukes of Lithuania), he ruled Poland with great prudence and justice. He died of tuberculosis on 04 March 1484.

Pope Francis' Words...



'Dear Brothers and Sisters: Today begins a new series of weekly catecheses on the meaning and value of old age, viewed in the light of God's word. Increased longevity has led to growing numbers of elderly persons in our midst, and thus a need to reflect anew on the relationship between the generations. Our throwaway society often exalts youthfulness and even dismisses the elderly as an unwanted burden. It is important, then, to consider and value the spiritual fruitfulness that this time of life can bring to the elderly themselves, as well as the gifts that they can offer to the communities of which they are an integral part. In this sense, we need to rediscover the "covenant" that unites the generations in looking to the future of our human family. The prophet Joel speaks of a time when "the elderly shall dream dreams and the young see visions" (cf. Joel 2:28). In these days of pandemic, we have come to see once more how important it is to offer our young people wise guidance, hope and enthusiasm as they look to the future. As we begin these reflections, let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us understand and appreciate the great contribution that the elderly can make to a just and fraternal society.'

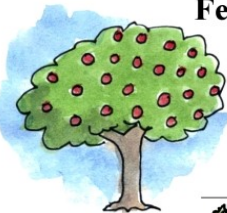
...that this Friday, 04 March, is Autumn Ember Day?

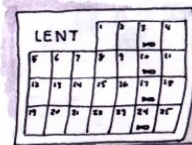

It is good for us to remember that we will die one day. It helps us realize that God put us here and that we need Him all the time. If we remember how much we need God then we will think of Him more and love Him more.

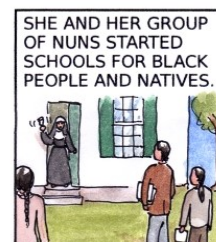
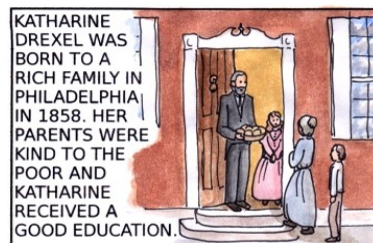
