Our Need for Healing

LENT HAS BEGUN! We know that our Lenten penance consists of three practices: praying more intensely, fasting with self-control, and giving generously to those in need. These practices bring about conversion of heart and they make us ready to accept the graces of our Crucified and Risen Lord at Easter. But let me explain another important effect of this



discipline: prayer, fasting and almsgiving heals our brokenness and restores the order of God's creation.

Look at the fall of Adam and Eve in Genesis. We see that the sin of our first parents severely broke God's intended plan for creation in three ways. Firstly, humanity's relationship with God was wounded. Adam and Eve were created to know, love and serve God. But instead, after they sinned, they hid from Him out of shame. They feared God and could no longer bear to stand in his presence (Gen 3:9-11).

Secondly, Adam and Eve's relationship was broken. Eve was given to Adam as a companion and a helper, and he was to love her as his own self. But Adam failed to protect Eve from the wiles of the serpent, and she, in turn, enticed him into sin. From then, their relationship would be marked by at attempts at dominating rather than loving the other (Gen 3:16).

Lastly, humanity's relationship with the rest of creation was broken. Adam and Eve were given the task of working and governing the earth. Created in the image of God, they were to be the instrument of God's rule over the world. But after the fall, creation would no longer yield to humanity's headship and labours (Gen 3:17-19).

The fall from grace ruptured humanity's relationship with God, with other people, and with creation. Today, each of us inherits these three broken relationships and we feel their effects. God seems distant to us and we sin against him often. Our relationships with each other are filled with pain, wounds and dysfunctions. And we do not have mastery over creation or over ourselves. Rather, we are often dominated by our love for created things such as pleasures or possessions.

Our Lenten disciplines heal each of these broken relationships. Lenten prayer heals our relationship with God. We fight against our inclination to run away from God in fear. Instead, we meet him face to face in love. Our charity to those in need heals our broken relationships with each other. Instead of domination, we serve each other in humility. And lastly, fasting heals our relationship with ourselves and with creation. In Lent, we let go of our desires and attachments to creatures, choosing instead to use created things for the glory of God and not our own satisfaction.

We must note that this healing of relationships is not our own work. We can only do this because we are united to Christ. Where the first Adam yielded to temptation, we see in this Sunday's Gospel that Christ, the New Adam, is victorious over the devil. He fasts for forty days; he does so for love of the human race; and he remains completely faithful to the Father. We too can be victorious over Satan, but only because we are part of the Body of Christ through the Holy Spirit. We are united to the King, Conqueror and Divine Physician. In him, the order of God's creation is restored and all our brokenness is healed.


God's Gift - Life

I was surrounded by wonderful priests and St Patrick's parishioners and friends offered their prayers, support and assistance. This resulted in my guick recovery and now I am in remission.

After the initial shock, I embraced cancer as a temporal suffering for the greater glory of God. I felt inspired to offer it for souls in purgatory, for the holy priests and churches all over the world. My major strength during surgeries and treatment was from holding my rosary tightly and a prayer shawl. Both my surgeries were delayed to 3:00pm, the Divine Mercy time. I felt his presence and soon found myself sharing my faith with patients, nurses and also teaching the rosary. This diverted my mind from chemo and I soon realised the purpose of God.

It's amazing how God works when we surrender to him. He slowly reveals mysteries of life to us. Life is a beautiful, precious gift from the creator. It made me realise we are here for a limited time and not to procrastinate. Now, every morning, I wake up joyfully and thank God for one more day to live, pray and to praise him!



9th March - St Frances of Rome (1384-1440), Religious

Frances was born in Rome in 1384 and was married at the married at the age of 13.

Although she had wanted to be a nun, she was happily married for forty years and had

three sons. She distributed gifts to the poor and ministered to the sick. She was remarkable for her humility and detachment, her obedience and patience in adversity (including her husband's banishment, the death of two of her sons from plague, and the loss of all her property). She was a mystic and contemplative, part of the great flourishing of mysticism in that period of time, and after her husband's death she retired to a convent she had founded, where she died on 09 March, 1440.

Pope Francis' Words...

From Catechesis on Old Age: 02 March 2022

'Today there is a greater longevity of human life. This gives us the opportunity to increase the covenant between all times of life. So much longevity, but we must make more alliance. And this also helps us to increase with the meaning of life in its entirety. The meaning of life is not only in adulthood, say, from 25

to 60 years – no. The meaning of life is all of it, from birth to death, and you should be able to interact with everyone, and also to have emotional relationships with everyone, so that your maturity will be richer and stronger. And it also offers us this meaning of life, which is everything. May the Spirit grant us the intelligence and strength for this reform: a reform is needed. The arrogance of the time of the clock must be converted into the beauty of the rhythms of life. This is the reform we must make in our hearts, in the family and in society. I repeat: what must we reform? The arrogance of the time of the clock must be converted into the beauty of the rhythms of life. The alliance of the generations is indispensable. A society in which the elderly do not speak with the young, the young do not speak with the elderly, is a sterile society, without a future, a society that does not look to the horizon but rather looks at itself.'

need. It helps us to be generous like God. Maybe you have a bit of money you can give to the poor or to the Church.





