### The Consecration of Russia and Ukraine

POPE FRANCIS, on the Solemnity of the Annunciation this week, consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary during a solemn Penitential Service at the Vatican. The Holy Father invited all the bishops around the world to join him in this consecration, and Bishop Vincent did so at the 12:30pm Mass last Friday. Why was this done?



When Our Blessed Mother appeared to the three shepherd children, Lucia, Jacinta and Francesco, in Fatima in 1917, she told them, "God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace."

Mary also warned the children that "war, famine, and persecutions of the Church and of the Holy Father," were imminent, and "to prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart."

Mary continued: "If my requests are heeded, Russia will be converted, and there will be peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world, causing wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; various nations will be annihilated."

We can easily recognise that Mary's warnings eventuated in the last century, which was marked by the greatest bloodshed in human history. Her warnings about the errors of Russia seem to refer to atheistic Communist regime of the Soviet Union.

Pope John Paul II did consecrate Russia and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 1984, and the Soviet Union soon collapsed. So why is this consecration being renewed now by Pope Francis? In the current climate where war still plagues many parts of the world, it seems fitting to entrust ourselves again to Our Blessed Mother.

So let us join the Holy Father in praying for peace, especially through devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart. What does this involve? It means we honour her pure and spotless heart, which was conceived without sin and loves Our Lord and her children most perfectly. We entrust our entire lives to her motherly care, through which she faithfully and securely leads us to her son, Jesus. We invoke her saintly intercession for us and for the world, and we submit ourselves to her direction. In particular, she asked us at Fatima to repent, make reparation for the sins of the world, and pray for the conversion of sinners. Let us entrust the world's suffering to the Mother of Peace, and join her in praying for the conversion of sinners. Let her Immaculate Heart triumph.

In other news, today is Laetare Sunday. "Laetare" means "rejoice" in Latin. The entrance antiphon from Isaiah exhorts us, "Be joyful, all who were in mourning," because we have passed the halfway mark of Lent. You might notice the liturgical colour for this day is *rose*, which is a softer colour than the penitential purple of Lent. So be joyful that our Lenten penances are nearly over, and soon we will enjoy the celebration of Christ's resurrection.

### **Bishop's Good Samaritan Appeal**



### Saint of the Week

## 27<sup>th</sup> March - St John of Egypt (died c.394), Hermit

John was one of the most famous early desert hermits and a noted prophet of his era. He was born in Lycopolis, modern Assiut, Egypt, was a carpenter by trade and became a hermit at the age of twenty. He was walled up in a hermitage near Assiut, with a single window opening onto the public. There he preached to vast crowds each week. He predicted two military victories for Emperor Theodosius I, and they were proven accurate in 388 and 392. He avoided all people for the last fifty years of his life. According to the writer on the saints Alban Butler, John prayed incessantly, and he spent the last three days of his life without food or drink or any interactions but prayer. He was discovered in his cell, with his body in a position of prayer. He died around the year 394. The cell in which John spent his life was discovered in 1925.

### Pope Francis' Words...

General Audience: 23 March 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on the meaning and value of old age, viewed in the light of God's word, we now turn to the special vocation of the elderly to hand on to new generations their personal experience of the Church's faith. At the end of the exodus,

the aged Moses hands down in a magnificent song his own long experience of faith in the Lord who remains ever faithful to his promises. This "handing on" of the experience of faith is the essence of the living Tradition of the People of God. In our own day, the Church's efforts to evangelize, catechize, transmit and explain her faith certainly takes place with the aid of books, films and other resources, yet nothing can replace the direct person-to-person testimony of a life-long experience of closeness to God in faith. In a world that at times seeks to cancel aspects of history and culture, or replace truth with fake news or propaganda, we greatly need the wisdom and experience of the elderly to help new generations know the Church from the inside, to live lives of fidelity to God's word, to persevere in hope amid trials, and to show compassionate love for all our brothers and sisters. May we value this precious vocation of the elderly as we cherish the gifts of the past and look forward to the fulfilment of God's promises in the coming of his Kingdom.


### DID YOU KNOW...

### ...that there are three sacraments of initiation in our Catholic tradition?

Baptism, of course, is always the first sacrament of initiation, be a person baptised as an infant or an adult. In the Latin Church (Roman Catholic), the next sacrament of initiation is usually Eucharist, followed by Confirmation, though these two sacraments can be received in reverse order, as happens when an adult is initiated at the Easter Vigil. The Eastern Catholic Churches, and the Orthodox, have different traditions such as confirming and even giving Eucharist at infant baptism. Either way, the prominence of Baptism is evident in all Christian traditions: Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant.





Try to make sure you go to confession before Easter so your soul will be clean and ready for the great celebration!




