## “Follow me.”



YOU COULD BE FORGIVEN for thinking that last weekend's Gospel reading from John marked the end of the Gospel, especially considering the final words we heard: "There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book...". This weekend however, we hear from the final chapter of John, following on immediately from Jesus' post-resurrection appearances to the disciples, including Thomas, that we heard at Mass last weekend. Included in this weekend's Gospel is the famous dialogue between Jesus and Peter in which Peter affirms his love for Jesus three times, compensating for the three times he denied knowing Jesus on the night before the crucifixion.

What I find most interesting about the Gospel are the final words of Jesus to Peter. Having outlined the "kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God", a gruesome one at that, Jesus says to Peter, "Follow me." There is something almost comical in these two simple words. After all, if ever there was a reason *not* to want to follow someone it would surely be knowing that doing so would result in one's death. Yet there is a matter-of-factness about the words of Jesus that seem to imply that though there is a high price to pay for discipleship, following Jesus is worth that price.

As it was for Peter and the other disciples, so it is for us. Jesus calls us to follow him and also knows our fate and the cost of our discipleship. Yet we are often reluctant to embrace all that is involved in being a disciple of Jesus. If we were in the same position as Peter and were to hear Jesus proclaim our fate to be the same as Peter's, would we respond with the same fervour that Peter ultimately showed? Yet this is what we are called to do. Only God knows the cost of being a disciple and we are called to embrace all that being a disciple entails, safe in the knowledge that whatever our fate, living out our faith in an active and joyful manner is worth the cost, for what awaits us at the final judgement is so wonderful that any suffering or hardship we endure on earth will pale into insignificance.

If we wish to compare this situation with one which is familiar to most of us, consider what it is to be in a loving relationship with another. We find it easy to fall in love and commit ourselves to pursuing a relationship with another and usually do so without thinking of the consequences. Nonetheless, we feel that the prospects of happiness and personal fulfilment are worth embracing all that is entailed in a loving relationship with another, even if, as sometimes happens, that relationship doesn't follow the course we had anticipated.

Yet with Jesus, there is no need to fear any lack of enthusiasm or fidelity or any of the other struggles that are too often the hallmark of human relationships. We can be confident that the struggles of discipleship are well worth it and that when we find ourselves in a situation that seems to demand more of us than we expected or feel we can bear, we will, like Peter and the others, have the means to do what is asked of a faithful disciple who, out of love for Jesus, doesn't count the cost.

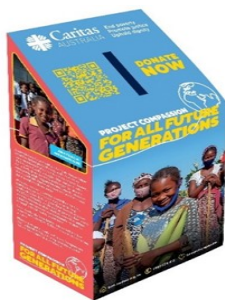

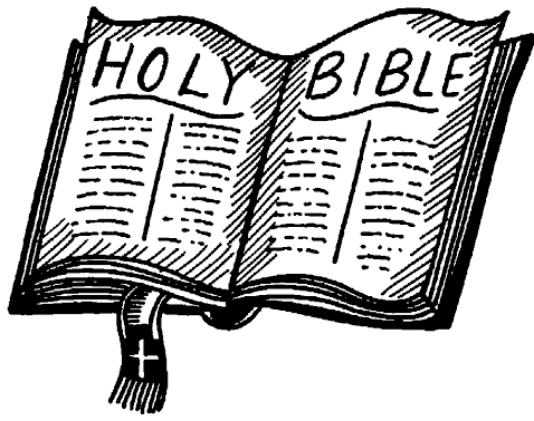

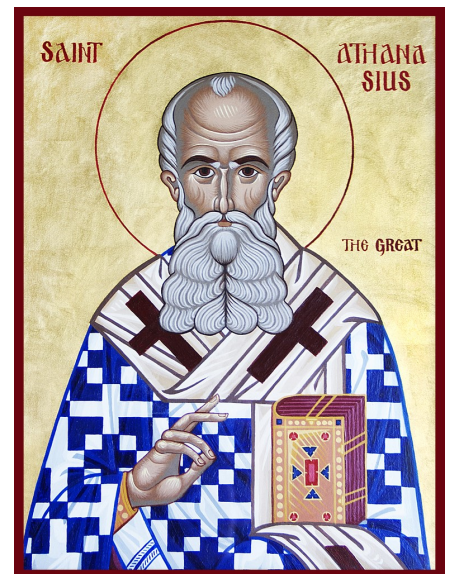

## Saint of the Week

### 2<sup>nd</sup> May - St Athanasius (295-373), Bishop, Doctor

Athanasius was born in Alexandria, Egypt. He assisted Bishop Alexander at the Council of Nicaea and later succeeded him as bishop. He fought hard against the heresy of Arianism all his life. Arianism is a heresy which teaches that the Son is created by the Father and is not equal to him, thus putting a huge gulf between God and humanity. Athanasius, as a result of his orthodox stance, underwent much suffering and spent a total of seventeen years in exile. He wrote outstanding works to explain and defend orthodoxy, which can be read to this day.

## Pope Francis' Words...

### Extract: General Audience on 28 April



“Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on the meaning and value of old age, in the light of God’s word, we now reflect on the figure of the widow Naomi as presented in the biblical Book of Ruth. This short yet beautiful story speaks of the relationship of love and mutual support between the elderly Naomi and her daughter-in-law Ruth. Naomi, dwelling in a foreign land, is left alone when her two sons die. Despite her grief, she encourages her two daughters-in-law to remain among their own people as she returns to Bethlehem, her native town. Ruth chooses not to abandon her beloved mother-in-law, and accompanies her to Judah, telling her: “Your people shall be my people, and your God my God” (1:16). Ruth’s love supports Naomi, and Naomi in turn helps Ruth to find a new husband, Boaz. God blesses this marriage with a son, Obed, who was the father of Jesse, the father of David. The story of these two faithful women shows us that, in God’s providential plan, the covenant of love and fidelity uniting the generations can prove immensely enriching for our families and for the growth of a society that respects the dignity and gifts of each of its members, however young or old.”

### **The celebration of the Eucharist**

Then we all stand up together and pray. When we have finished the prayer, as I have said, bread and wine and water are brought up; the president offers prayers and thanksgiving as best he can, and the people say 'Amen' as an expression of their agreement. Then follows the distribution of the food over which the prayer of thanksgiving has been recited; all present receive some of it, and the deacons carry some to those who are absent.

Those who are well provided for, if they wish to do so, contribute what each thinks fit; this is collected and left with the president, so that he can help the orphans and the widows and the sick, and all who are in need for any other reason, such as prisoners and visitors from abroad; in short he provides for all who are in want.
