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The Mystery of the Trinity



THE DOCTRINE of the Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. It is so unfathomable that, had God not revealed it to us through Christ, humanity could never have discovered it on its own. Nonetheless, while it remains a mystery, that is, beyond the scope of human reason to fully understand, we can gain some limited understanding of the Blessed Trinity because of this revelation to us.

God revealed to the people of Israel that he is one God: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord" (Deuteronomy 6:4). In other words, God is one nature, one substance, one essence, one being. This means that *what* God is, is singular. God is one *thing*.

Through the incarnation of the Son, God further reveals to humanity that he is three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In other words, *who* God is, is three. So we can summarise the teaching of the Trinity in a simple formula: we confess one God in three persons.

In this life, we can only have a very limited perception of what the Trinity IS, but our understanding may be furthered by considering what the Trinity IS NOT. Firstly, The Trinity does not mean that there are three Gods. We believe in three persons, but only one God.

Secondly, the Trinity does not mean that there are three parts in God, or that each person is one third of God. Rather, each of the persons is fully God, whole and entire.

Thirdly, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are not three masks or costumes for God, as if the one God is acting or playing three different characters. Rather, the three persons are really distinct from each other. The Son is not the Father or the Holy Spirit, and vice versa.

Lastly, none of the persons of the Trinity were created. The Son and the Holy Spirit are co-eternal with the Father and co-equally God. There was never a time in which the Father existed without the Son and the Holy Spirit. God always was, is now, and always will be a Trinity of persons.

We may never fully understand the mystery of the Trinity. But we do not need to ponder this mystery from a distance. The extraordinary thing is that God invites us all to become participants in his trinitarian life. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit exist in an eternal, infinite communion of love. By sending his Son to assume a human nature, God opens the door for the human race to become partakers of this divine communion.

When each of us were united to Christ through baptism, we became participants in the Son's place in the Trinity. Jesus is the Son of the Father by nature; through reception of the Holy Spirit, we became sons of Father by adoption. As the Father eternally loves his Beloved Son, so he now showers his divine love upon us, his adopted children. The Holy Spirit makes this possible by conforming us to the image of Christ and inflaming us with love for the Father. This love can bridge the gap between our minds and the mystery. We may not understand, but we can worship, adore, and spend our lives in and for the Triune God. And we pray that he keeps us faithful to this, so that after the veil of this earthly life is lifted, we may see the Blessed Trinity face to face.







Saint of the Week

13th June - St Anthony of Padua (c.1195-1231),

Born in Portugal, Saint Anthony was first of all an Augustinian monk, but he was so impressed by the martyrdom of five Franciscans who had been spreading the faith in Morocco that he became a Franciscan friar himself, so that he could preach the gospel in African too. Illness obliged him to leave Morocco, and a storm then drove his ship to Sicily, so that he found himself taking part in the General Chapter of the Franciscans in 1221, where he met Francis of Assisi himself. His preaching career then took him to northern Italy and southern France. Later he returned to Italy, to Padua, where he was an outstanding preacher and the first Franciscan theologian. His sermons are full of gentleness, but he reproved the wicked with fearless severity - especially backsliding clergy and the oppressors of the weak. His shrine is a centre of pilgrimage, and he is patron saint of the lost and found.
