Preaching the Gospel in Personal Encounters



FIGURES FROM THE 2021 CENSUS were released this week, and they are yet another reminder of how desperately Australia needs to be re-evangelised. In Australia's first census in 1911, 96 per cent of Australians called themselves Christians. As of 2021, just 44 percent of Australians identified as Christians (down from 52 percent in 2016). Those identifying as Catholic dropped to 20 percent (down from 23 percent in 2016). Most strikingly, the proportion of Australians who identify with no religion jumped from 30 percent to 39 percent over the last 5 years.

The results are clear: Australia is rapidly moving away from its Christian roots, and it falls to us to preach the Gospel in our homeland with renewed vigour. It is timely that this Sunday's Gospel contains Christ's instruction to his disciples on how to preach the Good News. We need to hear anew this call to evangelise in our day. Let me highlight one or two simple ways to preach the Good News offered to us by Pope Francis in his encyclical *The Joy of the Gospel*.

The Gospel narrates that "The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out." Who are those who are sent out today? Priests? Deacons? Religious? Missionaries? While each of these have a special role to play in evangelisation, Pope Francis makes it clear that the obligation to preach the Gospel falls on every baptised Christian: "Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus." That means you.

The 72 were sent into Gentile towns and Samaritan villages. Does this mean that we need to travel far to preach the Gospel? No. Pope Francis says that start by preaching the Gospel in an every-day way, through informal conversation with friends, family, colleagues, or even strangers.

He suggests that we listen sincerely to the people we meet, hearing their joys, hopes, concerns and needs; then in that context, "bringing up God's word, perhaps by reading a Bible verse or relating a story, but always keeping in mind the fundamental message: the personal love of God who became man, who gave himself up for us, who is living and who offers us his salvation and his friendship." The Holy Father continues, "In this way they will have an experience of being listened to and understood; they will know that their particular situation has been placed before God, and that God's word really speaks to their lives."

Doing this in an increasingly secular culture can seem like a daunting task. Jesus even warned his disciples that they will sometimes be rejected. But take note of how the disciples felt when they returned. "The seventy-two came back rejoicing." Evangelisation will ultimately bring joy to us missionary disciples who are sure to witness God's grace at work in the lives of those we meet.

So let us take us the task of evangelising Australia with courage, starting simply with the people around us, and praying that slowly, over time, our country may come to know again the personal love of the living God, revealed in Jesus Christ.

5th July - St Antony Mary Zaccaria (1502-1539), Priest

Antony Mary Zaccaria was born in Cremona in Lombardy, Italy, and started by studying medicine, but soon decided to become a priest instead and was ordained in 1528. He founded the Congregation of Clerks Regular of St Paul, generally known as the Barnabites (after the church that was their headquarters), whose aim was the reform of the clergy and laity. He was part of the general movement to self-reform in a Church that was coming increasingly under attack from the Protestant Reformation.
