Martha and Mary



IN HIS BOOK *The Power of Silence* Robert Cardinal Sarah relays the story of a young priest, Angelo Comastri, and his encounter with Mother Teresa. Eager to begin his priestly vocation on the right foot, Fr. Angelo journeyed to the general house of the Missionaries of Charity to meet Mother Teresa. His desire to meet the great saint was of genuine purpose: he sought the prayerful support of this holy woman. Upon meeting her and being gifted with a Miraculous Medal, Mother Teresa asked him a simple yet distressing question: 'For how much time do you pray each day?' Fr. Angelo was both astonished and embarrassed. He listed all his daily prayers: Holy Mass, Rosary, Divine Office. Mother Teresa looked at him with love and said 'That is not enough, my son! That is not enough, because love cannot be reduced to the indispensable minimum; love demands the maximum!' She continued 'Do you think I could practice charity if I did not ask Jesus every day to fill my heart with his love? Do you think that I could go through the streets looking for the poor if Jesus did not communicate the fire of his charity to my heart?' For Mother Teresa charity always begins with Christ, for without it our actions are useless. In sum, without Christ we are too poor to help the poor.

I begin with this incredible story as I believe it sums up the Gospel for this Sunday. Jesus, after relating the parable of the Good Samaritan to the lawyer, journeys to Bethany to the house of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. We don't hear of the initial exchange between Jesus and the family but we do hear that Martha and Mary begin waiting on him. At some point Mary ceases to work and sits at the feet of Jesus, clinging on to every word. Martha, noticing the actions of her sister, confidently calls to Jesus saying, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself? Please tell her to help me.' These words remind me of my childhood. If the del Rosario household was to expect guests it was all hands on deck. If one of my siblings was found lazing around he or she was quickly roped in to continue working. I'm sure this would be the case in any household...except here in Bethany. Jesus knows the importance of presence and the order of discipleship; a lesson he is seeking to teach all his followers. He calmly says 'Martha, Martha, you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her.' Why has Jesus praised Mary's action and not suggested to her to help Martha? Jesus is outlining the order of discipleship. In order for one to help the other he first needs to dwell with charity itself. One needs to contemplate the love of God so that one can communicate that love to the other through charitable works. Helping the other begins with Christ. As we read this Gospel may we ask for the grace to balance our spiritual life. May we first draw closer to Christ, who waits for us in the tabernacle, to fill our hearts with his love. Only then are we able to effectively live out our calling as a disciple of Christ; to imitate the Master by loving our neighbour as oneself.

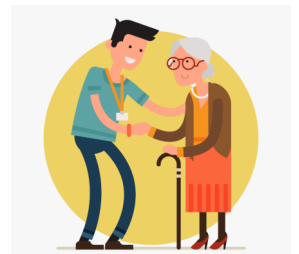

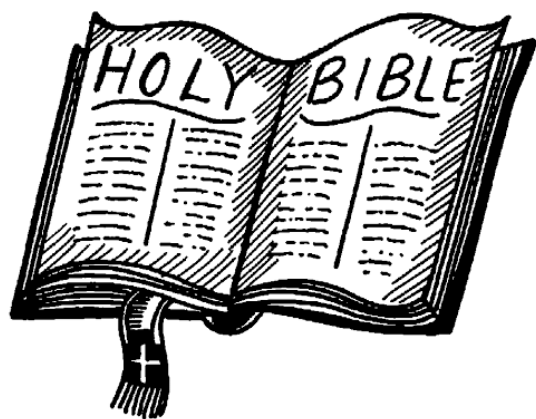

Saint of the Week

23rd July - St Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373), Religious

Saint Bridget, born 1303, was the daughter of Birger Petersson and his wife, Ingeborg. Bridget's family was pious; her father went to confession every Friday and made long and arduous pilgrimages as far away as the Holy Land. As was usual during the Middle Ages, Bridget was married when she was 13 years old to a young man with whom she had eight children, four daughters and four sons, all of whom, unusually for the time, survived infancy.

After her husband died in 1344, Bridget arranged her affairs and prayed for guidance. God gave her the task of founding a new religious order, mainly for women. This she did. Christ then appeared to her and asked her to go to Rome and wait there until she got the pope to return from France to Rome. She was to be there during the Holy Year of 1350. Bridget never returned to Sweden. For the rest of her life she saw visions concerning the reform of the Church, messages to kings and popes and many other persons in high places, directing them to work for the Church. Although she had longed to become a nun, she never even saw the monastery she established in Sweden.

Bridget was canonised in 1391. She is the patroness of Sweden and one of the six patron saints of Europe.

Getting to know...

Silvana Rechichi

Greetings fellow parishioners of St Pat's! My name is Silvana Rechichi, I was born in Italy; with my family, I migrated to the Land of Oz in 1968. I was 13. We settled in Parramatta and became parishioners from those very first days, all told 54 years! We spoke not a word of English yet we felt at home from the very first moment we set foot inside the church.

I remember with fondness the first people we met the very first day we attended Mass: Frank Keane, Molly Boyle, sisters Noreen Mclean & Marie Ray, Paula Cowling and many more who, through their faithful dedication and loving example, helped me grow into the faith and encouraged me to participate more fully in the life of the church here in Parramatta.

Over all this time I have been involved in various ministries: Reader, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist and Communion to the sick at Westmead Hospital, Rosary and Lenten groups; Novena to Mary & Taize prayer groups, just to name a few. I was also a chorister in the Parish Choir and later also a cantor at the 6:00pm Vigil Mass, which I still attend to this day. Each of the ministries mentioned has brought with it its own spiritual rewards and enriched my life in many ways.



In 54 years the Parish has experienced its share of painful episodes but none more so than the disastrous fire of 1996 which destroyed our spiritual home and saw its parishioners scattered to nearby parishes. What a joy it was to be part of a combined Diocesan Choir at the dedication of the new Cathedral in 2003 and, like a phoenix rising, witness its rebirth.

Sadly, one by one, I had to let go of all the ministries when the time came to care for my mum in the final years of her life. Some years after her death, I "reprised" the Novena to Mary Full of Grace, originally started by then Dean, Fr. Kevin Walsh, and which takes place on the last Tuesday of the month, in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.

From a very young age I was encouraged to let faith reside in my heart and reason in my mind, together they continue to shape and direct my life. Now that I am older, and hopefully wiser, I am beginning to understand a glimmer of that great commission entrusted to us by our Lord and Master, Jesus Christ, and that is to "love the Lord my God with all my heart and with all my soul and with all my strength and with all my mind" and to "Love my neighbour as myself".

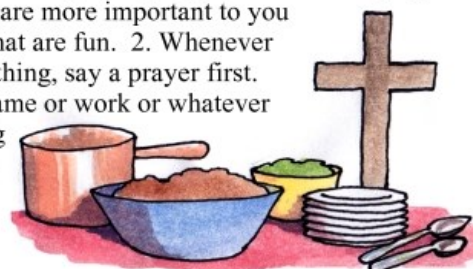
Martha was so busy in the kitchen but her sister wasn't helping! What did Jesus say to her when she complained to Him?

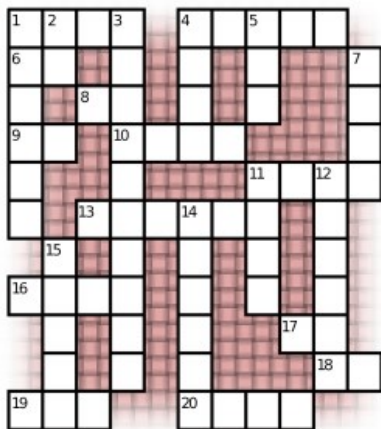

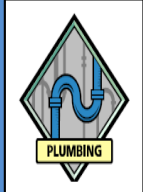
