## Faith Works



I'M SURE YOU'RE AWARE of the story of a priest praying in his church who is caught off guard with a downpour that soon turns into a flood. At the sight of the increasing chaos he kneels down in prayer and asks God to save him. No sooner had he finished praying when a man in a canoe rows by and offers him a lift to safety. The priest refuses the man saying, "God will save me." The waters rise and again the priest kneels down in prayer asking God to save him. He finishes his prayer and immediately a second man, this time in a motorboat, calls out to offer the priest a ride to safety. Again, the priest refuses, adamant that God will save him. Again, the waters rise resulting in a flooded church. The priest swims outside and quickly climbs onto the roof of the church. He kneels down in prayer and cries out "God, save me!" Suddenly he hears a helicopter approaching and a man with a megaphone calling out to provide him a way to safety. Hopeful that God will deliver him the priest refuses the third man's offer. Predictably, the priest drowns. His soul ascends to heaven where he is met by God. The priest looks at God and asks "Why didn't you save me? I called out to you several times!" God shakes his head and replies "What do you want from me? I sent you two boats and a helicopter."

As comical as this story is it speaks of the reality of faith; faith is always coupled with works. We hear in our second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews of the unwavering faith of Abraham. Despite the many obstacles Abraham faces he is never one to falter; he continues to abide by the will of God, even to the point of offering up his son to God. Notice how he engages with each trial: Abraham actively seeks to follow God's will. He does not wait passively for God to fulfil the promises he has made, rather Abraham seeks to bring God's promise to fruition by acting with faith. Additionally, Christ in our Gospel highlights the need to be ready and waiting for the coming of the Kingdom. He uses the parable of the servant actively waiting for his master as means to justify the pairing of faith with works. Both examples differ completely from the foolish priest in our story who waits imprudently for God himself to save him. Faith therefore is not passive; it must be coupled with works in order to be effective.

What follows is an examination of ourselves. Am I actively seeking to follow God's will? Do I ask the Lord for certain things and expect it to fall in my lap, or am I seeking to understand and follow his ways? May we all respond with faith knowing that Christ walks with us in our lives.


Unfortunately, we have had to postpone this tour till October as the shrines we were visiting are closed to tours due to the increasing number of COVID.





## Saint of the Week

### 12<sup>th</sup> August - Blessed Isidore Bakanja (c.1886-1909) Martyr

Isidore was born in what was in his time the Belgian Congo, around the year 1886. At the age of twenty he was baptised and, from that time onward, lived the faith to the full, until he died a martyr while working as a house servant of a Belgian colonist. Although he knew that his employer resented Christians, Bakanja insisted on wearing the scapular and saying the Rosary in his free time. In February 1909 his martyrdom began when he was severely beaten even to drawing blood, just because he was a Christian. The wounds inflicted by the strokes were so severe that he died on 15 August 1909, after having forgiven his aggressor.
