The Assumption of Mary



"THE SPIRIT IS WILLING, but the flesh is weak," says Jesus to his slumbering disciples at Gethsemane. Jesus here describes a phenomenon that we can all relate to: our bodies sometimes work against our spirits. We try to raise our souls to God in prayer, but our limbs fidget and our eyes wander. We dream of teleporting to work or to the Mediterranean instead of commuting or travelling, but we are painfully aware that our bodies are limited by space and time. And as much as we wish to be healthy, our bodies are racked with sicknesses, and we will eventually succumb to death.

This experience has led many people over the course of history to regard the body, along with its senses, appetites and emotions, as an evil thing. They have viewed the body as a hindrance to good works, a prison for the spirit, weighing it down and preventing it from reaching the heights of virtue or contemplation. That is, they say, until death, which frees the soul from the shackles of the flesh.

Tomorrow's Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary answers this way of thinking with a resounding "no". This is how the Catechism describes the Assumption: "The Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory." In other words, Mary enjoys the blessedness of Heaven right now in her material body and not as a disembodied spirit.

In fact, Mary was not the first to enter Heaven with her body. Christ opened the gates of Heaven by rising from the dead and ascending to the Father in his resurrected and glorified human body. The Catechism explains that Mary was given the grace to participate in Christ's resurrection "so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death."

And because God is good, Mary will not be the last to do so. We profess in the Apostles Creed: "I believe in the resurrection of the Body." It is a dogma of the faith that God will resurrect each of our bodies, in the same manner as Christ was resurrected from the dead. We will be reunited with our bodies for eternity.

The resurrection of Christ's body, of Mary's body, and of all our bodies, points us to the truth that the body is an essential part of who we are and is not evil. The body was created by God, who calls his creation "very good". Human nature is fallen and fractured by sin, and that is why we feel weighed down by the flesh. But our brokenness does not change the fundamental goodness of our bodies. Christ, by becoming flesh, elevated the human body to a great dignity. According to the catechism, "This dignity entails the demand that [the believer] should treat with respect his own body, but also the body of every other person, especially the suffering."

So we rejoice in the Bodily Assumption of Mary, because she is a sign of hope. The great gifts that God has given her will be ours one day too. We ask Our Heavenly Mother, the Queen of Heaven, to pray for us, that we may live in the true hope of the resurrection.

I will leave you with the words of St Paul: "The body [is meant] for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. ... So glorify God in your body." (1 Cor 16).

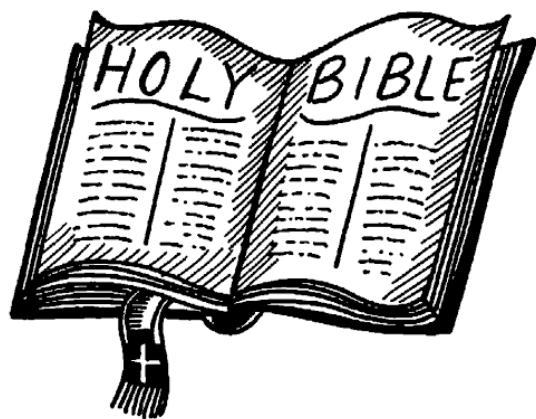

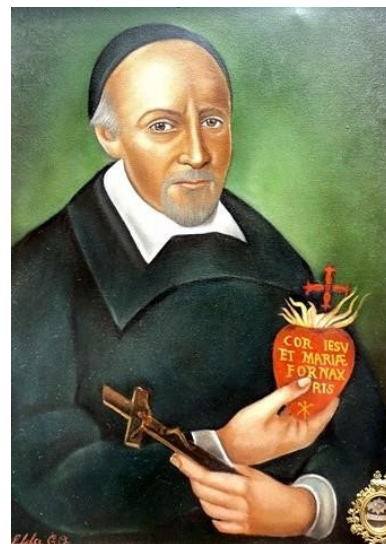
Saint of the Week

19th August - St John Eudes (1601-1680), Priest

John Eudes was born on 14 November 1601 in Normandy, France, and died there on 19 August 1680. He was ordained priest and spent many years preaching parish missions. He organised a congregation of nuns that grew into the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity, dedicated to the care of women rescued from a disorderly life, and a congregation of priests dedicated to the running of seminaries. He was active in encouraging devotion to the Sacred Heart, and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

In the circumstances in France at the time, when the Church was corrupt and the heresy of Jansenism was rife, (teaching that human nature was corrupt, original sin rampant, and perfection was both necessary for salvation and practically unattainable), St John's encouragement of devotion to the Sacred Heart was a defiant proclamation that the centre of God's essence is his love, not condemnation.

I was born in 1936, the second child in a family of eight children. My family name was Carter. I was the first baby to be baptised in the new St Patrick's church.

In 1936, the old church was destroyed by fire. I received Holy Communion and Confirmation at St Patrick's. Educated at St Pat's Primary School and then to high school at OLMC, where I graduated after attaining my Intermediate Certificate. I joined the CYO and later the Patrician Club.

I had a two year working holiday in New Zealand, and then came back and rejoined the Patrician Club, where I met my husband, Norm Hector. We married at St Monica's church and raised two daughters.

Eventually Norm, Anne Marie and Claire, joined Robert Beasley's Choir, so once again we were back in Parramatta.

In 1993 Father John Boyle asked Norm to train as an acolyte. Norm and I had a beautiful granddaughter in 2014. I lost Norm in 2014 and I miss him terribly every day. The deterioration of my eyesight also has been a very great challenge. St Patrick's has always been my spiritual and family home.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary on Monday, it is worthwhile reflecting on what the Catechism says on this matter (974-975): "The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body. We believe that the Holy Mother of God, the new Eve, Mother of the Church, continues in heaven to exercise her maternal role on behalf of the members of Christ."

Fire in Our Hearts

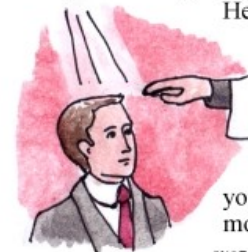

What do you think happens when the Holy Spirit is in someone's soul? The Holy Spirit pulls us closer to Himself and God the Father and Jesus. 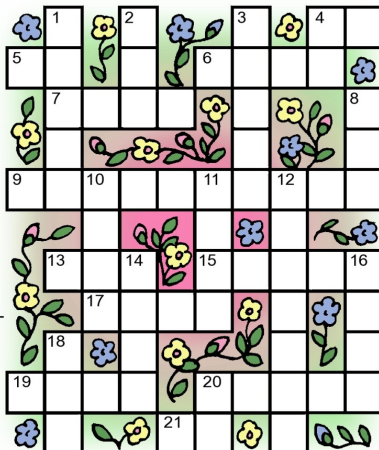

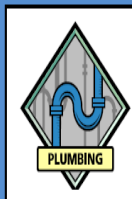
