Humility Yields Greatness

IWhat does it mean to be great? The dictionary defines greatness as 'the quality or state of being important, notable or distinguished.' It then gives the example of students who, to achieve greatness, take risks and seek to foster a good work ethic. Not surprisingly this idea of greatness is centred on the individual and their efforts.



It's no wonder that notable sports icons such as Michael Jordan, Roger Federer or Sam Kerr are considered great in their respective fields. With this in mind we ask whether this idea of greatness is consistent

with our Christian understanding? Is a Christian made great through one's efforts?

In our Gospel for this Sunday, we encounter two individuals who have come to offer prayer and praise to God: a Pharisee and tax collector. In ancient times fidelity to the Law of Moses equated to greatness in the sight of God. Having said that, you couldn't have two more polarising characters with regards to upholding the Law of Moses. The former is undeniably faithful; he lists it out: "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The Pharisee is flawless according to the Law. The Tax Collector, on the other hand, cannot be deemed great according to ancient understanding. He has betrayed his people by working with the Romans, and he most likely pocketed some of the payments made by his Jewish brethren, thus separating himself from the rest of his people. Yet, consider the prayers of both men. The Pharisee is not praying at all; he hasn't offered praise to God; he has exalted himself. He has no reliance on God's providence as, according to him, he has done enough to be deemed great and righteous. On the contrary, the tax collector prays with humility. It says that 'he stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." He acknowledges his sinfulness and unworthiness before God which gives rise to a change in heart. The tax collector's change of heart has made him at rights with God, whilst the Pharisee did not. Greatness in the Christian understanding is not found in following 'a set of rules,' rather it begins with humility which inspires the individual to undergo 'metanoia'; a paradigm shift in one's life to live, with love, in accordance with the teachings of Christ.

Dear friends, let us follow the humble example of the Tax Collector who exemplifies greatness in the eyes of God. His humility reminds me of St. Thomas the Apostle who left everything behind to follow Christ - his greatness is evident through the many peoples who now love and serve Christ throughout the world. As we approach Our Lord in the Mass and in our prayers, let us do so with humility. Knowing our shortcomings, God transforms our lives to live and love like him. May we allow his grace to change us in order to bring many others to know Jesus Christ.



that God was pleased with the tax collector's prayer?




