Not all heroes wear capes

I recently watched the historical drama series on Netflix called 'Barbarians.' The series follows General Arminius and his relationship between the Roman Empire and the Germanic Tribes. Upon reflection I noticed that Arminius unquestionably fits the hero archetype. He is brave, determined, strong, skilful and inspirational, to note a few characteristics. Through his efforts, he is able to unite the Germanic peoples and lead them to a decisive version of the strong of the st



unite the Germanic peoples and lead them to a decisive victory over the Roman Empire in the Battle of the Teutoburg Forest (AD 9). Arminius' heroism and loyalty to country of origin has placed him amongst the great military leaders throughout history.

Heroes are lauded for their efforts; Arminius is praised for his skill in overcoming the mighty Roman Empire. In our First Reading for this Sunday, we hear of the war between Amalek and Israel. At this point Israel have just crossed the Red Sea. They haven't yet received the Ten Commandments, nor have they been condemned to wander the desert for forty years. They have just arrived. Their reception in the desert: war. Moses then instructs Joshua to prepare the men for war and engage Amalek. He will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in his hand. Here we ask, who is the hero? Is it Moses or Joshua? As mentioned earlier, heroes are lauded for their efforts. Joshua is victorious only when Moses' hands are raised; as such the hero is not Joshua. What of Moses? He is only an instrument of God's power; he has no power other than God working through him - therefore it cannot be Moses. The hero in this account is God. Through God the nomadic people of Israel are able to overcome Amalek and his forces, a decisive victory for God's chosen people.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I believe this account is analogous of our pilgrimage to our heavenly homeland. Along the way we encounter Amalek in many forms: sin and temptation. At times these forces seem too large to overcome. We ask, 'Who am I to face such an opponent?' Yet the same hero who saved Israel again and again is present. The Emmanuel is here. Prayer, our relationship with God, is our helmet, armour, sword and shield. God provides us with the necessary equipment to overcome the foe. Our part? We need only call on him to defend us. Let us therefore never forget the goodness of God and his willingness to defend his people. He is the hero who saves at all times. May we respond to his love and goodness and say in faith 'Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.'



17 October - St Ignatius of Antioch (d.107)

Bishop of Antioch, Ignatius was arrested, condemned to death, and transported to Rome to be thrown to the wild beasts in the arena. In the course of his long journey to Rome, Ignatius wrote seven letters to various churches, in which he dealt wisely and deeply with Christ, the organisation of the Church, and the Christian life. These letters can still be read today, available online.



Ignatius was martyred in 107 and his feast was already being celebrated on this day in fourth-century Antioch.




