## **Preparing for Christ's Coming in 2022**

IN LAST WEEK'S BULLETIN, Fr Robert explained that our era sits between Christ's two major advents (or comings) in history: his First Coming as a child in Bethlehem two millennia ago, and his Second Coming in glory at some unspecified point in the future. But Christ is not absent in the meantime. Christ is continually arriving in the present moment: in the daily Eucharist, in the Scriptures, in the communion of the Church, and in the ordinary events of life through which God speaks and works. The Lord is near!



Before every instance of Christ's coming, God graciously prepares his people to receive him and his graces. For his Second Coming, Christ warned us in last's weeks readings that we must stay awake and stand alert. For Christ's First Coming, God sent the prophets, who exhorted Israel to prepare by getting rid of their false idols and returning to God wholeheartedly. And the last and greatest of the prophets is St John the Baptist, who appears on the scene in today's Gospel with a simple message: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand."

John is unique among the prophets in that he precedes and announces Christ at every major event of his life. Six months before Christ was conceived by the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, John heralded a new era of salvation history when he was also conceived miraculously in his parents' old age. When Christ arrived at the house of Zechariah, shrouded as he was in the tabernacle of his Mother's womb, John announced his presence by leaping for joy in Elizabeth's womb. John lays the foundation for Christ's public ministry by first undertaking his own ministry of baptising and preaching repentance. And it was only after John was beheaded that Christ began the journey toward Jerusalem so that he too might give his life.

And John continues to fulfill this role even after death. Just as John the Baptist preceded Christ at every appearance of his earthly life, John precedes Christ's coming in the Church today. As we look forward to receiving the extraordinary graces of Christ's birth this Christmas, John proclaims to our Eucharistic assembly what he preached to the Jews expecting the promised Messiah: repent.

The Greek word used for repentance is metanoia, and it means having a change of mind and heart; going beyond our fallen ways of thinking, seeing and acting; moving in a different direction. In John's day, the crowds expressed their repentance by "confess[ing] their sin" and being baptised in the Jordan, which signifies being washed from stains and harms that sin produces.

In our own time, a similar way that we can express our repentance is in the sacrament of reconciliation. It is an opportunity to confess our sins and be washed clean of them as John exhorts us. When we can freely acknowledge our sins and failures, we become humble, honest and vulnerable before God. A penitent heart such as this is docile and open to God, and it allows God to enter, embrace, heal and cleanse it. Confession, among other forms of repentance, is an excellent way to prepare for the arrival of our infant Lord this Christmas, who himself became humble, vulnerable and weak for love of us.

### Saint of the Week

09 December - St Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin

Juan Diego was born in about 1474 in Cuauhtitlan in the kingdom of Texcoco, part of present-day Mexico. As an adult he embraced Christianity and he and his wife were baptised. In 1531 the Mother of God appeared to him, on the hill called Tepeyac near Mexico City, and told him to ask the bishop to have a church built on the spot. Through the purity of his faith, his humility and his fervour, a church was built, in honour of Our Lady of



Guadalupe (whose feast is celebrated on 12 December). He left everything and devoted himself to the care of the sanctuary and the reception of pilgrims until his death in 1548.

# GETTING TO KNOW... Silvana Rechichi



Greetings, fellow parishioners of St Pat's! My name is Silvana Rechichi. I was born in Italy; with my family, I migrated to the Land of Oz in 1968. I was 13. We settled in Parramatta and became parishioners from those very first days, all told 55 years! We spoke not a word of English, yet we felt at home from the very first moment we set foot inside the church.

I remember with fondness the first people we met the very first day we attended Mass: Frank Keane, Molly Boyle, sisters Noreen Mclean and Marie Ray, Paula Cowling and many more who, through their faithful dedication and loving example, helped me grow into the faith and encouraged me to participate more fully in the life of the church here in Parramatta.

Over all this time I have been involved in various ministries: Reader, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist and Communion to the sick at Westmead Hospital, Rosary and Lenten groups; Novena to Mary and Taize prayer groups, just to name a few. I was also a chorister in the Parish Choir and later also a cantor at the 6:00pm Vigil Mass, which I still attend to this day. Each of the ministries mentioned has brought with it its own spiritual rewards and enriched my life in many ways.

Iln 55 years, the parish has experienced its share of painful episodes but none more so than the disastrous fire of 1996 which destroyed our spiritual home and saw its parishioners scattered to nearby parishes. What a joy it was to be part of a combined Diocesan Choir at the dedication of the new Cathedral in 2003 and, like a phoenix rising, witness its rebirth.


Sadly, one by one, I had to let go of all the ministries when the time came to care for my mum in the final years of her life. Some years after her death, I "reprised" the Novena to Mary Full of Grace, originally started by then Dean, Fr. Kevin Walsh, and which takes place on the last Tuesday of the month, in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.

From a very young age I was encouraged to let faith reside in my heart and reason in my mind, together they continue to shape and direct my life. Now that I am older, and hopefully wiser, I am beginning to understand a glimmer of that great commission entrusted to us by our Lord and Master, Jesus Christ, and that is to "love the Lord my God with all my heart and with all my soul and with all my strength and with all my mind' and to "Love my neighbour as myself".



Why do you think God saved Mary from all sin? He wanted her to be the perfect mother for His Son Jesus. If you could make your own mother wouldn't you make her perfect too?


