

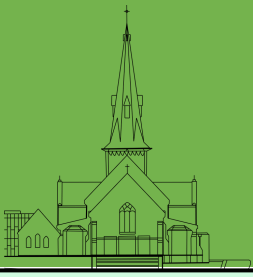

Living the Life of the Kingdom

THERE HAS BEEN great interest over the centuries, especially from composers, in the final words spoken by Jesus from the Cross. Generally, these have been identified as seven sayings, compiled from across the four Gospels, as each Evangelist gives his own account of this event. For example, in Matthew and Mark, Jesus cries out to God. In Luke, he forgives his killers, reassures the penitent thief, and commends his spirit to the Father. In John, he speaks to his mother, says he thirsts, and declares the end of his earthly life. Combining these different perspectives helps give us a fuller picture of Jesus during his last moments of earthly life.



Of course, just as Jesus spoke his last words, so he spoke also some first words. I am not speaking here of his speech as a child, but rather the words recorded in the Gospels. Only Luke gives us any record of Jesus' words as a child. Interesting and profound as those words are, I am more interested in focusing on Jesus' first words recorded in the scriptures as he "comes onto the scene" to begin his public ministry following his baptism. These are the words we hear in this weekend's Gospel passage from Matthew, almost identical to those we find in Mark.

Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.

According to Matthew, these are Jesus' first words as he begins his preaching in Galilee - just ten words, but, because they come from the lips of Jesus, and are uttered at the beginning of his public ministry, words well worth pondering. If Jesus had uttered only the word "repent", we would still have been wise to obey him, of course, but the fact that Jesus gives us a reason to repent makes the task meaningful. We are called to repent "for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand."

But what does Jesus mean? Is he referring to the kingdom of God that is to be instituted at the end of time? Or is he referring to something less tangible and definitive but no less powerful? I like to think that Jesus is referring to the latter, that God's kingdom is breaking into human history and calling us to a new way of living. Effectively, Jesus is pointing to himself as the one who embodies that kingdom. In calling people like Peter, Andrew, James and John to follow him, he is thus calling them to enter into God's kingdom.

Jesus embodies the kingdom because there was no conflict between his manner of being and what the kingdom of God stands for: love, justice, peace, unity, hope, and so on. This oneness was surely what attracted the disciples Jesus called, making them willing to risk everything just to follow him.

And this is how we are to approach our lives as Christians too. Living a "kingdom life" is what we aspire to, having no conflict between the values embodied in Jesus and those we live out as disciples. This is the most fulfilling way to live. Fear is certainly a great motivator, but not for long. The greatest motivator is the satisfaction that comes from putting our old "non-kingdom" ways behind us and forging ahead with a life that reflects that of our Saviour. This is also the manner of bring which gives us the greatest chance of reaching God's kingdom understood as heaven.

And, who knows? Living a "kingdom life" may even attract others, too!

Turbans for Australia are located at 14 Martha St, Clyde (0432 017 000) and run a food bank where they provide hampers every Sunday - arrive at 10:00am.

The Salvation Army has commenced a 'Second Bite' program, based at 426 Church Street Parramatta (9635 6870), running Mon/Wed/Fri 10:00am - 12:00noon, across bakery items, frozen meat and veggies.

Parramatta Mission - located at 119 Macquarie St, Parramatta (9891 2277) offers breakfast and lunch on weekdays. Their hours are Monday to Thursday 8:30am - 4:30pm and Friday 8:30am - 3:00pm.

Saint of the Week

23 January - St Marianne Cope

Maria Anna Barbara Koob was born in Heppenheim, in Grand Duchy of Hesse, which is now part of Germany, on 23 January 1838. Her family emigrated the following year to Utica, in New York State. The family's surname was anglicized to Cope.

In 1862 she entered the Sisters of Saint Francis in Syracuse, New York, after having postponed her entrance nine years in order to work to support her family. She was instrumental in the founding of several schools and hospitals for immigrants. In 1883 she led a group of sisters to the Hawaiian Islands to care for the poor, especially those suffering from leprosy. After the death of St Damien de Veuster she took over the home he built for boys, after having herself built one for girls. She died on 09 August 1918 and canonised in 2012.

Archbishop Anthony Fisher: “The Archdiocese of Sydney thrived under his leadership. He saw great promise in youth, and his vision in bringing World Youth Day 2008 to Sydney saw a whole generation of young Catholics respond to Christ's call. Our community as a whole was uplifted by this colossal event and moved by the testimony it offered.”

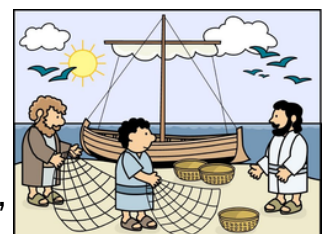

Did You Know...

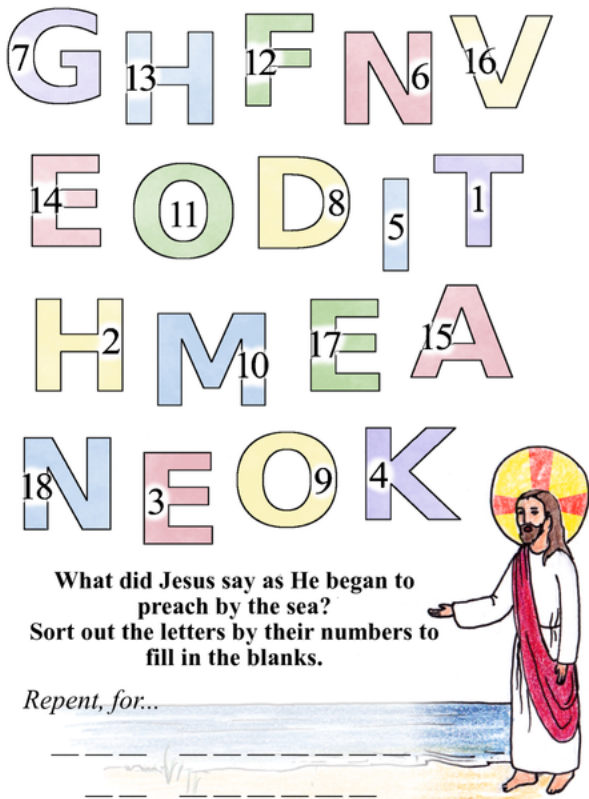
...that Capernaum, mentioned in today's Gospel, was a medium-sized city, like Bethsaida, in the Galilee region?
