Salt: An Essential Ingredient of Discipleship

IN THE MOST SIMPLISTIC SENSE the human person can be described as both beautiful and complex. Beautiful through the unique individuality and God-given dignity he or she holds, and complex through the various attributes that shape each individual. This reality is evident in observing our respective social circles; each person, family, friend or acquaintance, is a miracle in and of themselves. Whilst possessing the gift of life they also exhibit qualities both unique and comparable to others. In short, the human person is incredible. Yet the words of our Lord seem to understate this reality for he describes the disciples as both salt and light: 'You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world.' If you are thinking of new ways to describe a few difficult friends of yours, maybe these? Jestings aside, our Lord's words, as on many occasions in the Gospel, highlight a fundamental reality of discipleship; its foundation is the two greatest commandments.



Throughout history salt has been pivotal to civilisation. Its distinct abilities to both preserve and enhance food have made it an essential household item for thousands of years. With this in mind it is no surprise that Jesus teaches his disciples the importance of these qualities and the need to manifest them: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men.' Preservation and amplification; these are the necessary characteristics of the disciple. Preservation in discipleship is understood through the first beatitude presented in our Gospel last Sunday; 'How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven.' In essence, the disciple understands his absolute need for God; without God and his grace the disciple will soon be overcome by the trappings of the world. As such the disciple seeks to remain within the love of the Father in order to attain eternal life. From this follows amplification. An encounter with our Lord leads to transformation and a desire to share the Good News. Ultimately, the disciple is called to make more disciples by preaching the Gospel in word and deed. Those who encounter the Good News and desire to live it out are made new as the life of Christ now enlightens their lives. The analogy of salt therefore speaks of the need for every disciple to foster a loving devotion towards our Lord which allows him to preach the Gospel with love through word and deed.

Dear friends, we all know the difficulty of true discipleship. With a growing secular world coupled with the effects of Original Sin, it is becoming more difficult to live according to our Lord's precepts. The noise of the world can seem so loud. Despite this, we are comforted in our knowledge that Christ has already conquered the world, and in doing so has paved the way towards salvation. Discipleship, imitation of the Master, therefore rests on the two greatest commandments: love of God and love of neighbour. This Sunday, may we ask for the grace to grow in love of the Lord in order to preach the Gospel with love, joy, and conviction.

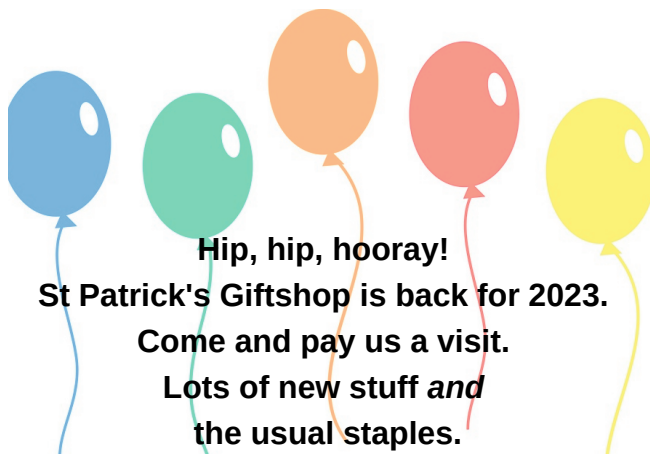

08 February - St Jerome Emiliani

Jerome was born near Venice in 1486. He started his career as a soldier but after he was taken prisoner and then miraculously liberated, he devoted himself to helping the poor, distributing his own possessions among them also. Two priests joined him in this task and in 1532 he founded a religious order, the Clerks Regular of Somaschi, for the relief of poor and orphaned children. He died at Somaschi (near Bergamo) in 1537.

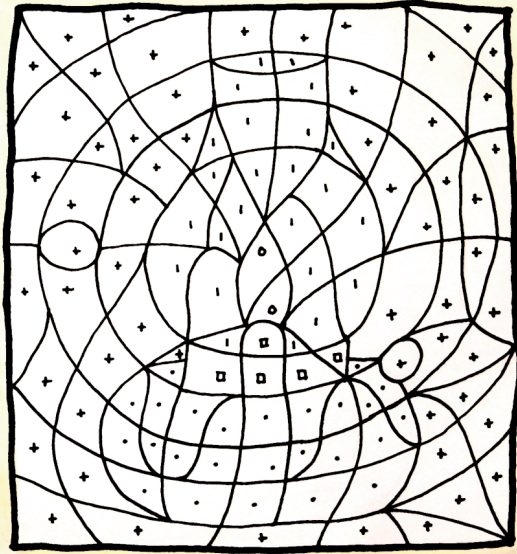
While formation and study has had real challenges at times, David has thoroughly valued the whole process and was delighted to be ordained on 10 December last year.

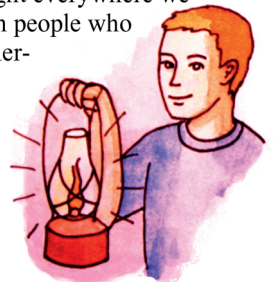


You are the Salt and Light!
