A call to be extraordinary

THERE HAS BEEN a marked increase in these competitive times of a call to people to achieve excellence, to strive ever harder to stand out from the crowd and thus profit in some way, be it materially or by an enhanced reputation. There is a whole industry devoted to helping people "be their best" and people are willing to invest considerable sums of money to pursue this end.



Of course, to "be one's best" is essentially what our Christian faith is all about, though the aim is not to increase material wealth or for us to put ourselves above others. For we Christians, to "be our best" is to be more Christlike in our

words and deeds, for it is only when we are living and loving as Christ did that we are truly happy and content, whatever comes our way.

In the Sermon on the Mount, which we finish hearing from this weekend due to Lent beginning in a couple of days' time, Jesus gives us six examples of what it is to live radically according to his teachings – in other words, how to be extraordinary. Of course, the word "extraordinary" simply means to be above and beyond what is ordinary, and as Christians we are not called to live ordinarily, like those who don't share our beliefs. After all, Jesus did not come into the world to tell us everything is okay and to keep living as we had been. He calls us to something more profound than the ordinary, something more difficult and demanding, yet something more satisfying and fulfilling. Of those six examples of Jesus, we heard four last weekend and we hear the other two this weekend.

"But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." These words, from the final of Jesus' six examples of extraordinary living, are surely some of the most radical and disturbing words of Jesus (and he had many!). Personally, this example hits me hardest in considering what is demanded of disciples of Jesus. Loving our enemies, that is, seeking what is best for them, doesn't come naturally to any of us; our natural reaction is to seek vengeance on those who have hurt us, to "hit back twice as hard".

What results from such a response? The wisdom of Jesus lies in seeing the "enemy" as a fellow sinner who is in need of correction, not "a taste of their own medicine". When we look at the current state of the world, we see cycles of violence because of the taste for vengeance over a more measured approach aligned with the teachings of Jesus. Loving one's enemies does not make us doormats but rather highlights to the perpetrators the folly of their behaviour so that they can be enabled to change both their behaviour and their very manner of being – and so find salvation. This approach does not preclude punishment but sees punishment as corrective rather than punitive.

Forgiveness and love free the victim too. No longer will he or she simmer with indignation and allow anger to destroy them. Despite their suffering, they will still feel that contentment and fulfilment, the closeness of God, that I mentioned earlier.

If all of this sounds extraordinary, it is.

And it is what we are called to be.



Saint of the Week

23 February - St Polycarp (d.155), Martyr

Polycarp was a disciple of the Apostles, bishop of Smyrna (now Izmir in modern-day Turkey), and a friend of St Ignatius of Antioch. He went to Rome to confer with Pope Anicetus about the celebration of Easter. He was martyred at Smyrna in about 155 by being burnt to death in the stadium. Polycarp is an important figure in the history of the Church because he is one of the earliest Christians whose writings still



survive. He bears witness to the beliefs of the early Christians and the early stages of the development of doctrine.

Ash Wednesday
