"I am the light of the world."

ON THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT, we are treated with a liturgical colour that doesn't often see the light of day. In fact, this colour presents itself specifically on the third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday), and today's celebration, the Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday). Why? The Church recognises that the human person cannot go on being penitent for an extended period without the risk of settling into an insincere gloom rather than an active and purposeful spiritual penance. As such, these days are a reminder of the joyous celebrations soon to come; the dark penitential violet is brightened by a shaft of light which brings about a radiant rose (but most would call it pink...).



Speaking of light, our Gospel for today revolves around this reality; we read of the miraculous cure of the blind man and the very confusing ordeal following his healing. I write 'very confusing' purposefully as, at a cursory glance, there is nothing confusing about it. Jesus has restored a blind man's sight; no one can do such things unless he is of divine origins - thus it is evident that he is the foretold Messiah, the light of the world. Yet this miracle continues to flabbergast the Pharisees. Why? St John the Evangelist notes that the man was cured on the Sabbath, a day of rest. The Pharisees, zealous observers of the Law, abhor any work performed on the Sabbath. Since Jesus had cured a man from blindness on the Sabbath, a day God ordained for rest, he cannot be the foretold Messiah as he does not follow the Law. Any supporting evidence of the miracle from witnesses or relations of the man does not justify Jesus' 'crime' of working on the Sabbath. Thus, the Pharisees are unable to comprehend the sign of the Messiah; their pride and arrogance blinds them from recognising Jesus as the Christ. This unfortunate reality contrasts with the faith of the man cured of blindness. Interestingly, Jesus is the one who acts upon the ailments of the man without prompting. We do not hear of the man crying out to Jesus - in fact he doesn't say anything to Jesus at first - so one can assume he is at peace with his condition. Yet we see the man's faith and trust in action at the directions of Jesus. After placing spittle over the man's eyes, Jesus instructs him to wash in the Pool of Siloam, a simple yet profound command. Through his trust in Christ the man receives more than his sight, he receives the wonderful gift of faith for he courageously attests to the Pharisees that Jesus is from God. Furthermore we read towards the end of the Gospel his profession of faith: 'Lord, I believe', and in doing so worships Jesus. Christ enlightens those who seek him with the gift of faith.

Dear friends, with Easter drawing near we recognise the light of Christ that breaks through the darkness. Amidst the chaos surrounding the events of the crucifixion, the light of the Resurrection shines through highlighting the victory of Christ. Our Lenten penances at this point may seem quite burdensome, however we take heart knowing that the end is very near - the Passion is not the end - the light of Easter Sunday shines brightly. May we continue to journey on in our Lenten pilgrimage with a renewed faith knowing that Christ is our light in a darkened world.

Karabi Community Services have a foodbank which operates on Mondays from 12:00noon - 2:00pm. Bookings are required prior to visit on 9631 6575 (9:00am - 4:00pm Monday to Friday). They are located at 41 Fyall Avenue, Wentworthville.

Turbans for Australia are located at 14 Martha St, Clyde (0432 017 000) and run a food bank where they provide hampers every Sunday - arrive at 10:00am.

The Salvation Army has commenced a 'Second Bite' program, based at 426 Church Street Parramatta (9635 6870), running Mon/Wed/Fri 10:00am - 12:00noon, across bakery items, frozen meat and veggies.

Parramatta Mission - located at 119 Macquarie St, Parramatta (9891 2277) offers breakfast and lunch on weekdays. Their hours are Monday to Thursday 8:30am - 4:30pm and Friday 8:30am - 3:00pm.
