Life in the Spirit

I'M SURE YOU'VE HEARD stories about people who have had near death experiences. Almost without exception they change their lives. They see themselves as having a second chance. They change their priorities. They do things differently. They live better. Wouldn't it be awesome to get a second go at our lives?! To have an opportunity to live life better? To get a second chance at fixing things and doing things right?



Of course a person doesn't need to have a near death experience to change their life but it seems like outside of these life-changing events it is most difficult for most of us to change significantly. We stay in our rut. We do what we do. We can tinker with our lives at the edges, but we are not up for a wholesale change of life.

We all live at two levels – the physical and the spiritual, but here's the thing: how we are spiritually, affects every other part of our lives. If our spiritual life is dead and uninspiring then all the rest of our life will be dull and sedentary. Maybe we go to Mass on Sunday, and then maybe we go back again the next Sunday. There is nothing alive and vibrant. There is nothing spiritual feeding into the rest of our lives, causing it to be fruitful, to flourish, to thrive.

Well, maybe today's scriptures can help with that.

In the first reading God tells us, "I will open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people. And I shall put my spirit in you, and you will live". In the second reading, St Paul talks about God giving life to us "through his Spirit living in us."

All these readings suggest that God can, in fact wants to, bring us into a vibrant spiritual life, by placing his Spirit into us. And that would be like Lazarus coming from his grave into a rebirth.

Some people might say, but isn't this what happened at baptism? – a death to the world, and a re-birth into the Spirit. If we were already reborn in the Spirit, why have we ended up in this spiritual desert?

The best answer I can give you is that we are a bit like the Israelites: they were born as the Chosen People and led into the Promised Land, but they lived surrounded by people that worshipped other gods and over time their faith got more and more diluted. Most of us were baptised as infants and we have grown up surrounded by people and cultures that encourage us away from a serious living of our faith. Many of us look a lot like everyone around us.

That is not okay! Christianity is entirely countercultural, and it always has been. Our core teachings demand forgiveness, self-giving charity, humility, the exact opposite of what the rest of the world sells and encourages. If we look the same, quite simply, we are not doing it right! This lacks all the vibrancy and energy that comes with life in the Spirit.

This Lent, let us ask God for a second chance. Let us consider making the most radical change we could make – embracing the "life in the Spirit". All we need to do is pray for it and God will do the rest.







The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'


