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The Mountaintop Experience

'HAVE YOU EVER HAD a "mountaintop experience"? Something transcendent, something spiritual? A glimpse of God's glory? Many people may have moments when they experienced a profound sense of God's presence. Versions of this can happen when people are engaged in prayer, or worship, or perhaps in adoration. It can happen in a church, in the silence of a room, in the midst of nature. I have even heard of it happening in a cell in Auschwitz.



In today's Gospel, Jesus and the disciples have the

ultimate mountaintop experience – God's glory shines through Jesus. Let us reflect on what this experience meant for Jesus, and for the disciples, and to draw from that, what this type of experience might mean for each of us.

Firstly, in reflecting on what it is likely to have meant for Jesus, we should look at the timing and the context. This happened about a week after Peter professed Jesus to be the Christ, and Jesus in turn stated that the Christ would have to suffer and die. We are at a pivotal point in Jesus's ministry and from here he is going to begin his journey to Jerusalem and to his passion and death. At the very beginning of his public ministry, the Father affirms him personally, and that affirmation is accompanied by great signs. This whole event would have edified Jesus, strengthened him, and confirmed that the path he was taking was fully in alignment with God's plan.

For the disciples it would have been different. Certainly it would have been a remarkable experience but their journey was not the same as Christ's, their need for strength and edification would come later. We should keep in mind that Jesus brought the very same disciples with him into the garden of Gethsemane. There they would have witnessed His agony. So, in their case, they got to see Christ's glory and His agony, and these two experiences together gave them a proper perspective on their own later journey, where they could see suffering and humiliation illuminated by God's glory.


What the experiences had in common for both Christ and the disciples was a confirmation that they were on the right path, and edification for either the journey at hand, or as something to draw on later when times would get tough.

With that in mind we should mention one further point: Peter's response to this wonderful event was "I will make three tents here." In other words, "This is wonderful, let us stay here". This would be a very natural response but it misses the point of the experience. These experiences are not an end in themselves. Sadly, I know people that had wonderful spiritual experiences but when I met them a few years later, they were no longer practising their faith. "I just don't experience God they way I used to" is often their refrain. They have missed the point of the beautiful experience they were given. It is not for God to give us experiences. If He does then it is a blessing and it has its purpose. They give us a glimpse of God's glory, confirm us on our path, and strengthen us for our journey. Our faith is not lived on the mountaintop, it is lived in the valleys, and just like Christ, we too must turn our face towards Jerusalem...





Welcome to our seminarian-in-residence, Jeff Hood!

I GREW UP IN Murwillumbah on the North Coast. I have worked for a large part of my life as a Psychologist and Psychotherapist in various settings. I spent a few years working as the State Training Manager for the St Vincent de Paul Society in NSW, was the inaugural Co-ordinator of Bereavement Services at Sacred Heart Hospice in Darlinghurst and taught at the Australian Centre for Grief and Bereavement. For most of my working life, I have taught at various universities and training institutes, teaching trainee psychologists, psychotherapists, and medical students. After graduating in Drama and Theatre Studies from Monash University, I taught there for ten years.

I spent four years as a seminarian, mostly at St Francis Xavier Seminary in Adelaide. More recently, I completed formation as a Spiritual Director at the Heart of Life Centre for Spiritual and Pastoral Formation in Melbourne. My most recent work was as a spiritual director, as a Pastoral Supervisor for clergy, and as a lecturer and supervisor at Heart of Life and the University of Divinity.

We often struggle to believe, in the deepest places of our being, that God loves us – deeply and passionately. About five years ago, I experienced a very difficult time in my life, a time of very deep questioning. Lots of things that I thought were important ceased to be so. The outcome of my period of struggle was a renewed confidence in God's constant loving presence, and a strong desire to commit my life to working to make God's love more known in our struggling world, as a priest.

During my time here at St Patrick's, I hope to meet many of you, to learn from you, and to discover God's love more deeply through your prayers and through our encounters. I assure you of my prayers during this great renewal time of Lent.


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
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
