Nervously Approaching Our Lord

IN 2002, MULTI-GRAMMY AWARD winner Eminem released a song titled Lose Yourself in conjunction with biographical hip hop drama film 8 Mile, starring himself. The song speaks of Eminem's film character, from his early struggles to finally being accepted and gaining the respect of other rappers. Outside the film, the song generated commercial success reaching the number one single rank for several consecutive weeks with music critics praising Eminem's work. Twenty years later Lose Yourself has garnered iconic status and has been acclaimed as one of the greatest hip hop songs of all time. Now, this may seem like a random thought on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), however the opening words of the song, I believe, highlight the sentiments of our First Communicants which, in turn, assists our appreciation of this august sacrament.



Lose Yourself begins with the lyrics 'His palms are sweaty, knees weak, arms are heavy.' Those who know this song can hear the beat begin to kick in... here B-Rabbit (Eminem's film character) acknowledges his anxiety as he begins to rap. When rehearsing with our First Communicants last week I noticed the nervous tension in each child as they practiced receiving the Eucharist for the first time. Some of the children were unsure of the correct posture when approaching the priest, some struggled to place one hand over the other, while others forgot to respond 'Amen' following Fr. Robert saying, 'The Body of Christ.' Yet I believe their apprehension stems from their attempt to reconcile faith with sense data; something the Sacramental Team has tried to instil in each child. Our faith teaches that Jesus Christ is truly, really and substantially present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharistic Host, yet our senses tell us that the host we receive both looks and tastes like a wafer. The preparation and action to receive Our Lord is already difficult, the leap of faith is even greater. As such one can understand each child's nervous approach and preparation when receiving the Eucharist for the first time... it makes Eminem's performance in 8 Mile look like a walk in the park.

Providentially our Gospel for this Sunday assists our faith in recognising Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist. After feeding the five thousand the crowd approaches Jesus for more food. Christ, recognising their desire, turns their minds from earthly food to heavenly food: his very self. He states 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' To the Jews this is a strange thought; nervous chatter ensues and doubt creeps into their minds. Yet Christ does not back down from their dubious question for he again states: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Our Lord is adamant that true life is found in Him; our reception of the Bread of Life assists our journey towards Eternal Life. Whilst our senses may scream 'Wafer, Wafer, Wafer,' our faith in Christ reminds us of the wonderful reality of Jesus' presence in the form of bread. Christ is present. How privileged are we to receive him?

Dear friends, today I invite you to remember in your prayers each child who is receive the Eucharist for the first time today. This important step in their faith journey is a reminder of Christ's love for them. Additionally, I invite you into their shoes and remember the nervous excitement when you first received the Eucharist. We are privileged to receive Our Lord regularly which can result in familiarisation; may we never forget to receive the Eucharist full of faith, for Jesus Christ, God Incarnate, is truly present in our midst.

Saint of the Week

12 June - Bl Alfons Maria Mazurek (1891-1944), Priest, Martyr

Born in 1891 at Baranowka, near Lubartow, Poland, he entered the Order of Discalced Carmelites in 1908, taking the religious name Alphonsus Mary of the Holy Spirit. He was ordained a priest and appointed as a professor, while dedicating himself to the education of youth. Afterwards he served in his Order as prior and bursar. In 1944, after having been arrested by the troops that had invaded his country, he was shot on 28 August at Nawojowa Gora, near Krzeszowice. He was beatified by John Paul II on 13 June 1999, together with many other Polish martyrs.

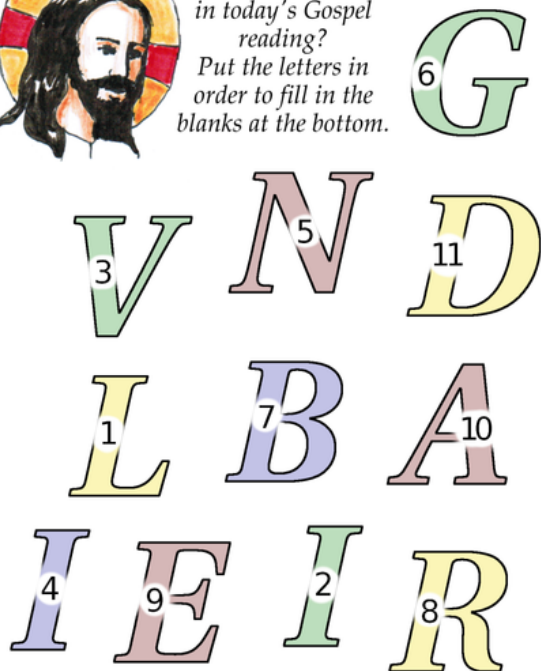

The Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. At the Last Supper, Jesus knew that He was going to leave His friends. So He turned the bread into His Body and the wine into His Blood - even though they still looked like bread and wine - and told the Apostles to do the same.
