Labourers for the Harvest

OUR WORLD TODAY is not very different to the world that Jesus was looking at. All around us is a society full of people that are harassed and dejected. They run from one thing to the next - social media, alcohol, sex, substances, money. Each time they think 'This will fix me. This will make me happy.' But nothing satisfies, and they have no clue where to find the healing they need. Truly, they are like a flock of sheep without a shepherd.



What an appropriate set of scriptures for us to reflect on as we continue our month of stewardship for our parish. In today's gospel Jesus says: 'The harvest is rich but the

labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.'

So, are we to pray for more labourers? Of course we are, but it doesn't end there. We are not called to make this prayer: "Oh Lord there is a lot of work to be done. Please send more labourers - that doesn't include me!"

We are the consecrated nation from the first reading and we are told we are to be a "kingdom of priests." Every one of us is called to be a priest, in the sense of being called to minister to God and to minister to God's children.

So what is it we are called to do? You're probably thinking 'Surely he's not suggesting that I am to "cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, and cast out devils"?

Well, yes and no. We can't do these things, but Jesus can. But for this to happen, we must answer his call. He works through people. Ours must be the feet that bring him to these people. Ours must be the eyes that look at them with tenderness and love. Ours must be the arms that hold them and draw them closer to him.

Our whole society is "sick" from chasing things with no substance, in the belief that they will bring them happiness. We can offer them substance.

There are many people around us whose hearts are dead from a lack of love in their lives. We can raise them from the dead with love.

The lepers of Israel were people cast out of their society, forced to live isolated from their tribes and families. We have our own lepers - homeless people, refugees, people living with physical and mental disabilities, people wrestling with sexual, gender or identity issues. We can offer them dignity, accompaniment, community.

A healthy parish, a healthy church, is one where every person serves, and every person is served. Each and every one of us is shaped to serve in some way, and the beautiful thing about this is that it is through serving that we grow. If we are to become the person we were created to be, we must move out of our comfort zone.

So, what do we do from here? Well, we answer Christ's call. We get the bulletin and we sign up. We stop just attending Church, and we start becoming Church. It is time to stop complaining about the state of the world, and to start changing it, curing it, healing it.

'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few.' It's time to step up and take our place in all this!



Mahjong is a tile-based game originating from China. This game is gaining popularity, hence this notice.


A parishioner (Lynn) who has been learning this game would like to gauge the interest in having a group play here on a regular basis.



Saint of the Week

23 June - St Paulinus of Nola (355-431), Bishop

Paulinus was born in Bordeaux, in France, to a rich and powerful family. He was well trained in poetry and rhetoric, and had a successful political career, culminating in the governorship of an Italian province. Returning to France, he married a Spanish lady, who shared with him her ideal of living a strictly evangelical life. He was baptised in 389 and



moved to Spain, where after the death of his son he gave away all his property and began to live a monastic style of life. He was ordained in 394, in Barcelona, at the urgent insistence of the people there; but then moved back to Italy, to Nola, in the province where he had once been governor. There he began to live the monastic life and set up a hospice for the sick and for poor visitors to the shrine of St Felix. He became bishop, by popular request, in about 409, and died some twenty years later.






