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"Perfect love casts out fear."

CONVENTIONAL WISDOM tells us that the opposite of love is hatred. We often encounter the dichotomy between loving or hating something, "love versus hate", and so on. It seems that there is no need to cast any doubt on this "truth", yet a closer examination of this idea will tell us that the opposite of love is not hatred, but fear.



And this truth is borne out by this weekend's gospel.

The exhortation to "have no fear" or "don't be afraid" appears numerous times in the scriptures. Of course, that does not mean that there is any condoning of hatred, but clearly there is an emphasis on fear, more so than any other passion, drawing people away from God. The reason for this is that fear is the breeding ground of hatred and all the feelings and behaviours that give rise to it. Conversely, love is the foundation of all that is good and holy. Loving after the example of Christ and under his inspiration can never be anything other than good, even if it leads one to difficulties, or even persecution.

This is why Jesus exhorts us not to be afraid. Fear can lead us to behaviours that we would otherwise not consider. Fear, for example, is sometimes fomented by prejudiced and extremist groups to further their cause. How often do we hear people, even perhaps those we know well, make disparaging and uninformed comments about refugees, for example, trying to demonise an unfortunate group of people in order to support a prejudicial point of view? And further, how often have we been willing to succumb to this prejudice without thinking reflectively and challenging it?

The question then arises: how do we overcome fear? Jesus, of course, was talking about the fear of persecution for being his disciple rather than an irrational fear of the type outlined above. But the approach to overcome any fear is essentially the same: we need to trust that God will enlighten us and help us to know that he accompanies us in such times. The best way to deal with a fear about a particular group of people is to engage with those people so that we can then recognise in them our common humanity and the truth that all people are created in the image and likeness of God. If we have been led to believe otherwise, a personal encounter is the only way to deal with this fear. It takes courage and boldness to do this, but this is where the reassuring words of Jesus are important to hold in our hearts.

And this is not only a loving thing to do but also a just course of action. True love, the love modelled for us by Jesus, demands justice. And so, when we hear people speak in a manner that reflects their fear or hatred of others, we are called, by love, to counter their voices with reason and seek to aid them to see the presence of Christ in the very people they persecute.

Whatever fear we experience – that fomented by others, fear of the future or even a quite rational fear – know that Jesus accompanies us as we confront it.

Then, and only then, can love blossom, for there is no love where there is fear.

Saint of the Week

01 July - St Oliver Plunkett (1625-1681), Bishop, Martyr

Oliver Plunkett was archbishop of Armagh and primate of All Ireland from 1668, at a time when the country was in a state of civil and religious disorder after the interventions of Oliver Cromwell. He persevered for ten years in his effort to ameliorate this state of affairs. The authorities started to act against many prominent Catholics and Plunkett was arrested in Ireland but taken to London for trial. He was hanged at Tyburn, cheating his executioners by dying before he could be ceremonially disembowelled.



His remains are preserved at Downside Abbey, together with such other relics as the notes for his defence at his trial. Some of his relics are at the cathedral at Drogheda, Ireland.




