"Come to me...and I will give you rest."

OVER THE PAST couple of weekends, we have heard some challenging words from Jesus as he prepares his disciples for mission. Most particularly challenging were the words of Jesus last weekend when he declared that we were to place our love for him before all others, even family members and friends.

We move on this Sunday to the next chapter (11) of Matthew's Gospel but in doing so skip over some verses which we would do well to at least glance at. Following last Sunday's Gospel Jesus goes on to



praise John the Baptist and then condemn the towns of Chorazin and Bethsaida for failing to repent, saying that on the day of judgement it will go worse with them than with the infamous Sodom.

We then come to today's words from Jesus which are more comforting than confronting. These words conclude chapter 11 and are well known for the phrase "my yoke is easy and my burden light."

Before we get to looking at the meaning of these words, let's look at those which begin this weekend's Gospel: "I bless you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth...". Jesus then goes on to rejoice in the intimacy between him and the Father in a way which is not found anywhere else in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark or Luke. Only John (Chapters 5 and 17) rivals it. He speaks of the manner with which God turns conventional wisdom on its head by "...hiding these things from the learned and the clever and revealing them to mere children," and of the oneness of the Son and the Father, ("...no one knows the Son except the Father, just as no one knows the Father except the Son...").

Following on from this beautiful image of harmony, we then come to the famous "yoke is easy, burden light" phrase which brings so many such comfort and peace. We ought not to overlook the fact that Jesus is not saying that we have nothing to worry about but that he will ease the burden, helping us in challenging times. It is wrong to think that being a person of faith means that all worry, concerns and difficulties are a thing of the past; no such promise is made by Jesus. Instead, Jesus tells us that he will accompany us in our struggles.

And he does this with the image of a yoke. Like much in the scriptures, some of the imagery and metaphors are lost on us two thousand years later. A yoke is a heavy piece of wood which is placed on the shoulders of an ox to assist it to pull a heavy load. A yoke can also be placed across the shoulders of two oxen so that together they can pull a load such as a plough. This second image is more fitting to our understanding of Jesus, the one who makes our burden light because he shares the yoke with us, thus helping ease the burden. In doing so, our afflictions, be they physical, mental or spiritual, feel lighter and we are filled with a sense of peace because of the confidence we have that our God is walking with us when we feel most vulnerable and distressed.

Let us give thanks for the God who walks with us, a God of peace and a God who wants to ease our burdens.

SEA SUNDAY AND SYNODALITY

"We are a synodal Church, in which we walk together. We should go forward together, navigating together, without leaving anyone behind, and enriching one another. No one should think that they have nothing to offer." (Cardinal Michael Czerny)

Today is Sea Sunday, a day meant to honour over one million seafarers who enable our everyday life and economy. Their faith, hopes, and struggles, including long periods of separation from their families and limited access to spiritual services, are spotlighted. In his message for Sea Sunday (Vatican news 03 July), Cardinal Michael Czerny, the Prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, emphasised that the recognition of Sea Sunday extends beyond seafarers to all Christian communities who benefit from their work.

Cardinal Czerny affirms that the Church seeks to understand seafarers' unique perspectives on work, economy, interreligious and intercultural relations, environmental conditions, and faith. He highlights that the Church is a synodal entity, walking together and learning from each other. No one should believe they have nothing to offer.

This year, the Church has committed to foster greater engagement and understanding between seafarers and other members of the Church. The aim is to bring the experiences of seafarers closer to the everyday faith experiences of all.

As we walk on this synodal path, may Mary, the Star of the Sea be our guide. May she be a "font of consolation and perseverance" for all seafarers and their families.

Saint of the Week 14 July - St Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680), Martyr

Known as the "Lily of the Mohawks" and the "Geneviève of New France," she was born in the Mohawk fortress of Ossemenon in what is now New York State, the daughter of a Mohawk warrior and a Catholic Algonquin woman whom he had saved from captivity at the hands of the Iroquois. When she was about four, smallpox killed her parents and her brother and left her scarred and with impaired eyesight. She was adopted by her uncle, the chief of the Turtle clan, and had many offers of marriage. She received some knowledge of Christianity from Jesuit missionaries when she was 11. and she determined to live the life not only of a Christian but of a Christian virgin: a heroic determination at the time. She was baptised when she was 20 and eventually, to escape persecution and death threats, she fled to an established Christian community at Kahnawake in what is now Québec. She advanced in union with God, with bodily mortification and intense prayer, and died at the age of 24. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on 22 June 1980 and canonised by Pope Benedict XVI on 21 October 2012.




