Scraps from the Master's Table

AN ISSUE THAT HAS confronted the Church since its inception has been that of membership: to put it rather crudely, who is "in" and who is "out". Even the apostles, those closest to Jesus, guarded their privileged status to the point of arrogance at times. Right to this day there are those who argue for tighter criteria for membership of the Church. Even if such people concede membership is open to a broader group of people than they would regard as ideal, they will construct a hierarchy of membership, holding that some people are "fuller"



members than others. Having said that, this issue is certainly not restricted to religious institutions!

This weekend we witness Jesus entering territory that was populated by those on the "outer" as far as the Jewish people were concerned, the Canaanites. Jesus moves from the town of Gennesaret on the north-west shore of the Sea of Galilee and heads in a northerly direction to the district of Tyre and Sidon in what we know today as southern Lebanon. It is here, in foreign territory, that today's encounter between Jesus and the nameless Canaanite woman takes place. On the surface, this encounter paints Jesus in an unfavourable light. His language towards the Canaanite woman sounds insulting, to say the least. He refers to her as a 'house-dog', 'dog' being a term of derision used by the Jews of Gentiles. Whether or not Jesus was being offensive however, would depend on the tone he was using. Certainly, based on the way Jesus is generally portrayed in the Gospels, it is unlikely he was being offensive. We can easily pinpoint other wordplay incidents Jesus engaged in similar to this one; his conversation with the woman at Jacob's Well (John 4:1-42) being just one example. The dialogue between Jesus and the Canaanite woman would no doubt have been conducted equally playfully, though with an equally serious basis. The woman doesn't appear to take offence. In any case, her determination to have her child healed is paramount – nothing will dissuade her from her mission.

Perhaps as a means of testing the woman's determination and faith, Jesus announces that he "was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel" (which perhaps begs the question of why he travelled so far into foreign territory!). Nonetheless the woman persists and in the end gets what she wants. Her desire is neither selfish nor unreasonable: her innocent child is unwell and, like any parent, she is desperate to see her child healed. Through her persistence and display of faith ("Son of David"), her plea for her child's healing is granted.

The Canaanite woman in this weekend's Gospel is an example for all of us of the value of deep faith, humility and love, to say nothing of persistence. She has faith in Jesus as one able to heal, she is prepared to humble herself before him, and her love for her daughter moves Jesus greatly so that her persistence bears fruit. It is those qualities of faith, humility, love and persistence, and not an accident of birth, that ensure that she is treated as one of the "chosen ones".

May this be a lesson for us all.

Saint of the Week

26 August - Blessed Dominic Barberi (1792-1849), Priest

Dominic Barberi was born near Viterbo, Italy, in 1792 and joined the Passionist Order, urged on by an inner assurance that God called him to work as a missionary in England. He was ordained a priest in 1818 and worked in Italy and Belgium before coming to England in 1841. His first foundation was at Aston Hall in Staffordshire; he established four Passionist houses in all, and received many Anglicans into full communion, the most famous being John Henry Newman, who was received at Littlemore near Oxford on 9 October 1845. Blessed Dominic was noted for the personal warmth of his approach to non-Catholics and for his zeal in preaching; he drew crowds in spite of his strong Italian accent. He favoured a higher profile for the small Catholic body in England; he went around in his Passionist habit and, while at Aston Hall in 1844, organised a Corpus Christi procession through the streets of the neighbourhood, which is believed to have been the first public procession of its kind in England in modern times. Blessed Dominic died at Reading on 27 August 1849 and was beatified by Pope Paul VI in 1963.




