#### Our Relationship with God...

It seems to be a human condition that we often have to lose something to realise just how important it is to us. How many sad songs do we hear about people who didn't realise how much they loved someone until they lost them...

One of the biggest learnings we inherited from COVID lockdowns was just how much we crave physical presence. Many of us became proficient with video calls and zoom meetings, and it was wonderful to be able to see and hear our family and friends.



We had virtual dinners together, and virtual drinks. We got to see kids and grandkids sing and dance and draw and play. In many ways we got a greater insight into our families and friends lives then we had before COVID. And yet despite all that, we were terribly lonely. We missed their actual presence. Do you remember what it was like when lockdowns ended and we could be actually present to our loved ones again. Didn't it lift our spirits? It was truly wonderful. There is clearly something immensely spiritually real and powerful about being actually present with another person. We are made to be in relationship with other people, and that relationship is strongest when we are actually together.

This should not be a surprise to us – everything important about our faith centres around relationship: Our God is three persons in the one God - three people in relationship. All our commandments can be captured by "Love God, and love your neighbour". Each of us is called into relationship with God and a relationship with the people around us.

Jesus' mission on Earth was to save the world, and when he went to the Father he passed that mission to the Church, a group of people, a sacred assembly. He did not look for people to worship Him individually. We are called to worship together, and to act together. Of course there is a place for personal prayer, but Jesus is telling us clearly today, that our communal prayer will be immensely more powerful. "Where two or three gather in my name, I shall be there with them."

We live in a time when we are surrounded by individualism – the power of "me" - my opinion, my entitlements, my truth. And this individualism extends into spirituality, even Christian spirituality: you can hear "I don't believe in institutional religion. I have a personal relationship with Christ. I am fine."

But are they fine? Is their relationship real and healthy? How can it be, if they ignore what He tells us? Christianity is not about "mix and match". We cannot take parts we like and pass over parts we don't like. If Jesus tells us to pray together, then there is an important purpose to that. Prayer is a spiritual exercise, and when we do a spiritual exercise together, it creates a special bond between us. God desires that bond for us; it is a part of his plan.

Saint John Vianney captured it beautifully when he said: "Private prayer is like straw scattered here and there: If you set it on fire, it makes a lot of little flames. But gather these straws into a bundle and light them, and you get a mighty fire, rising like a column into the sky; public prayer is like that."



#### to the point

Whatever begins as an unresolved dispute between two persons becomes matter for the community of the Church. When disputes rupture relationships, it is the Church that is weakened; when relationships are healed, it is the Church that is built up. What is ultimately at stake is the presence of Jesus in the Church: when reconciliation takes place and where two or three gather in his name, Jesus is 'in the midst of them.'

#### Connecting the Gospel...

• to last Sunday and paschal mystery Perhaps one of the most difficult ways we experience the 'dying' of the paschal mystery is to face another about his or her sinfulness. When we do so, the reconciliation is a 'rising.'

• to Catholic sacramental experience Traditionally, the Sacrament of Penance has been solely a private matter among penitent, priest, and God. The revised rite of communal reconciliation underscores the community aspects of both sin and reconciliation.


### Saint of the Week

#### 13 September - St John Chrysostom (349 - 407)


He was born in Antioch. After a thorough education, he took up the ascetic life. He was ordained to the priesthood, and became a fruitful and effective preacher.

He was elected Patriarch of Constantinople in 397, and was energetic in reforming the ways of the clergy and the laity alike. He incurred the displeasure of the Emperor and was twice forced into exile. When the second exile, to Armenia, had lasted three years, it was decided that he should be sent still further away, but he died on the journey, worn out by his hardships.

His sermons and writings did much to explain the Catholic faith and to encourage the living of the Christian life: his eloquence earned him the surname "Chrystostom" (the Greek for "golden mouth").






