Bearing fruit in the vineyard

MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS in Christ! It is with joyful anticipation that I begin my ministry here among you at St Patrick's – I have heard such good things about serving as a priest here and I look forward to getting to know you, serving among you, and seeing what the Lord has planned for me in the coming years with you.



This weekend in our reading from the prophet Isaiah, the Lord speaks metaphorically of the disappointment

he has experienced because of those leaders to whom he entrusted the care of his vineyard. This, his treasured vineyard, has not borne him the rich fruits with which he can produce the finest wine, but has instead only left him sour grapes, unfit for consumption. Jesus echoes this metaphor in his parable about the wicked tenants – those entrusted with the care of the Lord's vineyard have gone astray and even when prophets were sent among them to bring them back to the way of the Lord, to remain faithful to his covenant with them, they did not heed. Instead, they dealt wickedly with these prophets, not only rejecting their message, but rejecting them, persecuting them and putting them to death. Jesus assures his audience, the leaders of the people, that for these wicked tenants, a sour, wretched end is in store.

This parable retains its relevance for the Church today. The Lord renews this warning in the very heart of the Church, calling her leaders to take heed of the message of the prophets, to repent and be converted once more, so that they may be faithful tenants in the vineyard of the Lord and produce the fruits that befit the Kingdom of God. It is thus vital that we pray for our leaders, especially our priests, who have been entrusted with this care of the Lord's vineyard.

In the Last Supper discourse in John's gospel, Jesus instructs the apostles how it is that they are to remain fruitful in his vineyard. It is only those who remain in him, those friends of his that abide in his love, who allow themselves to be pruned with care by the Father, that bear good fruit in the vineyard. Many things badger priests for their attention, draw them away from what is essential and can lead them to be like those withered branches that the Father cuts away to be burned. So, pray that your priests might remain faithful to the one thing necessary, to remain close to Jesus so that they might be good and faithful stewards of the vineyard.

St John Vianney, patron saint of priests, once described the priesthood as the love of the heart of Jesus. With your prayerful support in these my first months and years as a priest in the vineyard of the Lord, it is my hope that I might abide in his love and so allow myself to be pruned by the Father, to remain in him and so bear the fruit that God intends.

Saint of the Week


09 October - St John Henry Newman (1801-1890), Priest

Saint John Henry Newman was born on 21 February 1801 in London, England. As an Anglican clergyman for over twenty years he won renown as a preacher and theologian. A Fellow of Oriel College, Oxford, he became one of the leaders of the Oxford Movement and a prominent figure in the Church of England. On 9 October 1845 he was received into full communion with the Catholic Church by Blessed Dominic Barberi of the Passionist Congregation. After a period of study in Rome he was ordained priest on 30 May 1847. Returning to England he established the Oratory of Saint Philip Neri in Birmingham. He was an influential writer on many subjects, most notably the development of Christian doctrine, the true understanding of conscience, faith and reason, the role of the laity, and university education. In 1879 he was created Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII and given the title of San Giorgio in Velabro. He died in the Birmingham Oratory on 11 August 1890. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on 19 September 2010 and canonised by Pope Francis on 13 October 2019.




Tenants of the Vineyard
