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## **Praying for the Holy Souls**

REALITY IS MORE than simply what we can see and hear; it's much more than just the material world in which we live and breathe. There are realities that are hidden, that might escape our senses but are real nonetheless. Anyone who has loved, anyone who has been taken away by the beauty of a sunset or a moving piece of music knows this – there are realities that can't be captured simply by some mechanistic, materialist



explanation. There are realities much deeper and much higher, indeed much more different than the world around us.

We Catholics know this especially, since we believe in things not seen, things beyond the mind of man, as St Paul would say. We know this because we encounter these hidden realities every Sunday, indeed every day in the Sacraments. There, Jesus and the Holy Spirit are present and active in a way that escapes our senses but are not for that fact less real.

This week we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints as well as All Souls' Day, in which we remember those who have gone before us in this life. In these feasts, we recognise that although we may not be able to see them anymore, these people who have died live on in a different mode of existence, in a reality that we cannot grasp.

Well, not physically anyway. We can reach them spiritually, just as they can us. This is very important to remember as we begin this month of November in which we focus in a particular way on praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. When we pray for them, we enable them to advance in their final purification, to help them to receive the purification in love that they missed out on in this life, so that they might finally see God face to face, completely receptive to that love in which they were made and saved. In return, they can support us with their prayers along with all the Saints in heaven.

So, this month, let us make our focus this unseen reality that awaits us all. Let us pray to the Saints in heaven and reflect on their lives, so that we can know their support on this our pilgrimage here below. Let us keep constantly before our minds all those we have known and loved who have passed from this life, so that we might help them in their final journey to the Father. In this way, we will participate more fully in that hidden reality of the Communion of Saints, and store up for ourselves treasure in heaven.





#### • to the first reading



### Saint of the Week

06 November - Blessed Josepha Girbes (1820-1893), Virgin

Josepha Naval Girbés was born at Algemes in the Archdiocese of Valencia, Spain, on December 11, 1820. As a very young woman she consecrated herself to the Lord by a perpetual vow of chastity. Josepha's life was simple. She stood out for her ardent love, and she made progress along the way of prayer and evangelical perfection, while dedicating herself generously to apostolic works in her parish community. In her own home she opened a school where she taught needlework, prayer, and the evangelical virtues. She formed many young girls and women and shared with them her wisdom and spiritual understanding. She was a member of the Third Order Secular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Saint Teresa of Jesus, and had a special love for the Virgin Mother of God. Her holy death took place on February 24, 1893. She is buried in her parish church of Saint James in her native city.



else with our hearts. But we don't always have to show it on the outside. Sometimes we pray together or help people when others can see us, but we should often pray and do good in ways that people won't see, too.


