"Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus."

THIS SUNDAY marks the first Sunday after our return to Ordinary Time. However, because Easter Sunday is early this year (31 March), Lent also starts early (Ash Wednesday falls on 14 February), giving us just five Sundays before we move into the penitential season.

This does not mean that we can afford to treat these five "ordinary" Sundays as if they are of lesser importance than those that lie ahead in Lent and Easter. Every Sunday celebration is "extraordinary" because every Sunday is a small Easter in itself, a celebration of the Resurrection and the gift of Christ to us in his Word and in the Eucharist.

This year is designated as Year B in our three-year Sunday cycle, giving us a focus on Mark, the shortest and earliest written of the four Gospels. Despite this, we hear from John's Gospel this Sunday, though Mark will certainly dominate our Sundays throughout the rest of the liturgical year, interrupted by John once again around August when we will hear Jesus' famous "Bread of Life" discourse.

As we return to Ordinary Time this Sunday, we hear of three people choosing to follow Jesus, two of whom had been up to that time followers of John the Baptist, and Simon Peter, brother of Andrew who was one of the followers of John up to that point. One of the most interesting aspects of this Gospel is the attitude of John the Baptist to those who choose to now follow Jesus. We are all familiar with John the Baptist speaking of himself as one who was not fit to carry Jesus' sandals (Matthew 3:11), displaying great humility in accordance with his mission to prepare the way for Jesus. In this Sunday's Gospel we witness that John was not just about words but also about putting those words into action. He points Jesus out to Andrew and the other disciple, acknowledges who Jesus is (the Lamb of God), and raises no objections when the two disciples "switch their allegiance", so to speak, from John to Jesus. John knows who he is in relation to the Messiah and is not willing to have followers under false pretences.

This gives us the opportunity to reflect on who Jesus is for us as we hear of his early ministry over the next few weeks. Is Jesus merely a great teacher, an engaging preacher, a miracle worker, a charismatic figure to whom we are attracted? When John the Baptist pointed out Jesus to his followers, he didn't refer to Jesus in any of these ways. John calls Jesus the "Lamb of God" and Andrew calls him the "Messiah". We can easily understand Jesus in a limited capacity when we read the Gospels, especially when we hear him speak or witness his miraculous deeds. Having just said farewell to the Christmas season however, let us not forget that the baby lying in the feeding trough in Bethlehem is God-made-flesh, God-with-us, Emmanuel.

And having absorbed this incredible truth, let us pray for the strength and courage to respond with gratitude to God, evident not just in prayer and piety, but also in the manner in which we relate to those we encounter in our daily lives.

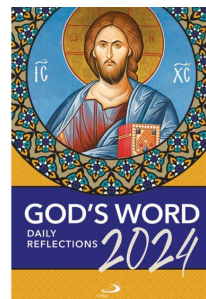
"God's Word 2024" and the Columban Calendar

Saint of the Week

16 January - St Joseph Vaz (1651-1711), Priest

Joseph Vaz was a missionary born on 21 April 1651 in Goa, India. He died on 16 January 1711 in Kandy, present day Sri Lanka. He was an Oratorian missionary priest. He arrived in Sri Lanka (formerly known as Ceylon) during the Dutch occupation.

The Dutch had expelled the Portuguese who had introduced Catholicism to Ceylon. The Dutch then went on to impose Calvinism as the official religion. Father Vaz travelled throughout the country, bringing the Eucharist and Sacraments to clandestine groups of Catholics. He would sometimes disguise himself as a beggar in order to facilitate his mission. Later, he founded a shelter in the Kingdom of Kandy where he intensified his missionary work of ministering to both the minority Tamil and Sinhalese ethnic groups. By the time of his death, he had managed to rebuild the Catholic Church in Ceylon. He was beatified by Pope Saint John Paul II on 21 January 1995, in the Sri Lankan capital, Colombo, and canonised there by Pope Francis on 14 January 2015.

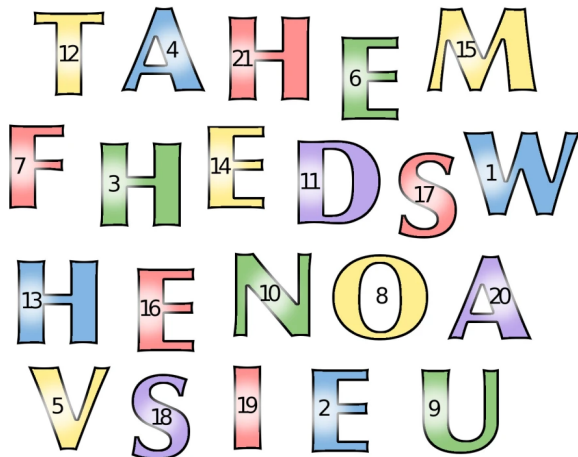

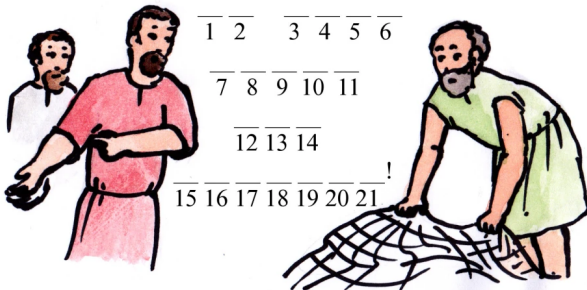

Samuel grew up, and the Lord was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

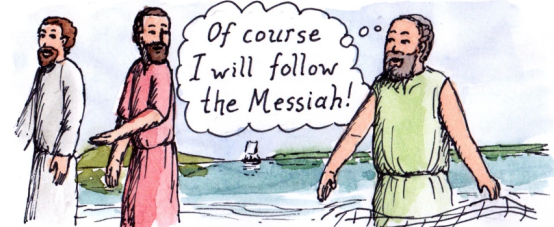
What's another way of saying this was Samuel's calling?

In today's first reading, God called young Samuel in a special way. Samuel's life had been dedicated to God, and because he was willing to follow God's plan, God made Samuel a holy prophet.

In the Gospel reading, Saint John the Baptist tells his followers that Jesus is the Messiah. Two of them decided to follow Jesus, and one of them, Andrew, went and got his brother Simon. When Simon went to follow Him, Jesus told him that his name would now be "Cephas," or "Peter," which means 'rock.' God had a special plan for Simon Peter. He was to become the leader of the Church- the first pope!

God does not call all of us to very important jobs like the prophet Samuel and Saint Peter. But each of us should follow Jesus and be ready to do His will. If we always try to do what God wants, then we will be ready if He does have a special job for us! How can you do God's will today?

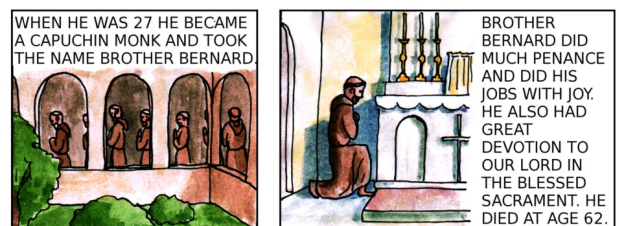
