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Are you a Thomas?

I LIKE THOMAS. Thomas the Doubter. Thomas is a lot like us. He wasn't there when Christ first appeared and so he was initially expected to believe based on the other disciples' encounters. And guess what? He didn't. He basically said: "Unless I have an encounter myself, I will not believe." And there was another way in which Thomas was a lot like us - he was still hanging around. He didn't believe, and yet something kept him hanging out with the rest of the disciples, despite the extreme danger. So, at some deep level, a part of him was hoping to have that encounter. In time he did, and then he believed.



What about us? I mean we are here, but do we really believe? CS Lewis once said: If Christianity is false, then it is unimportant. If it is true, then it is of infinite importance. The only thing it cannot be is moderately important.

This is a really important point. Too many people try to take some sort of Christian*ish* middle ground, but that middle ground is nonsense. If Christianity is true, then it should change our lives. We should be living lives as radical as those early Christians in our first reading. If it's false, we should walk away.

Being a Christian is a bit like being pregnant. We either are or we are not. We cannot be moderately pregnant. The sad truth is that a lukewarm Christian, is not actually a Christian at all.

So, what about us?

Well, I think many of us are Thomases. Our lives say that we haven't really committed to Christianity, and yet here we are at Mass. While many of us have not had a personal encounter with Christ, it's as though at some deep level we keep hanging around, hoping that that encounter might just happen.

Well, we can do better than that. Jesus stands at the door of our life and knocks, but He won't push his way into our lives. We, on the other hand, can push our way, and pray our way, into that encounter. We are all different and one of the wonderful things about our faith is that we can each encounter Christ in different ways:

In prayer: Scripture says: Draw close to God, and he will draw close to you.

In his Church: Christ's body is his church, this beautiful collection of people of faith. There are wonderful groups within this parish, and you may experience an encounter with Christ through the love and fellowship that people in these groups offer.

In his Word: Christ resides in his word. If you meet his Word prayerfully and reflectively, you can have a real and tangible encounter with him.

In Reconciliation: Christ says: *Peace be with you.* There is a remarkable peace available in the sacrament of reconciliation. The guilt and wounds of a lifetime can be washed away.

In the Eucharist: every time you approach the Eucharist, Christ is offering himself to you. Before you come forward, pray your heart out that He will open your eyes to His glory.

In so many different ways Christ offers himself to us, he longs for us to encounter Him. If we desire to encounter Him, all we have to do is pray and watch. And then one day, just like Thomas, we will exclaim: "My Lord and my God!"

Saint of the Week

12 April - St Zeno of Verona (d.371), Bishop

Zeno, a native of North Africa, was appointed bishop of Verona (Northern Italy) in 362. He ministered to his people for about nine years, distinguishing himself for his leadership skills and good pastoral approach. He was close to his people and cared for the poor. In his writings he described many liturgical practices of his Church especially during Holy Week. He preached much against Arianism and fostered the growth of missionary activity in his area.
