There are only two options

IN THE GOSPEL of Matthew, Jesus tells his disciples that, "he who is not with me is against me," teaching them, contrary to what perhaps a lot of modern Christians would like to admit, that there are essentially two paths on which to walk, one that leads to salvation, and one that does not. Or in the words of St Peter in our first reading this week, we are faced with the option to "deny the Holy and Righteous One, [or] ask for a murderer to be granted to [us]," showing the Jews in their decision



to elect Barabas over Jesus, that they were ultimately choosing between the giver of life and the bringer of death. These are the two fundamental options presented to each created soul, that we either choose to follow the way of Jesus, and so choose life, or choose another way, any of which amount to death.

But Peter, after himself denying Jesus and then being forgiven by him, encourages the same Jews he accuses that this God whom they denied, knew beforehand what they did by ignorance and invites them once again to make that fundamental choice. In other words, even though we might have chosen to go against Jesus, he is always ready to renew the invitation to follow him. Choosing to go against Jesus is to choose to sin. But in the words of St John, "if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's."

Whenever this renewed invitation is offered to us, it is that same Risen Jesus who appeared a second time to the disciples in our Gospel today who offers it. The confidence that Peter and the apostles display in Acts, that courage to follow the way of Jesus even if it meant suffering and death, is possible because Jesus is Risen, he is alive. Death, that most fearful of all things, doesn't have any power over the one whom they follow, and so there is nothing for them to fear. They don't need to choose any other way than his, they don't need to sin, because Jesus is Risen. But they walk with even greater confidence knowing that the one whom they follow is always ready to give them another chance should they deviate from the path he has set.

My brothers and sisters, may this same confidence in the Risen Lord and in his ways fill our hearts this Sunday, so that we may make that firm decision to walk his way. We know that any other way leads to death. But we also know that should we in our weakness turn down one of those paths, the Risen Lord will come after us and offer us the invitation once more, "follow me".

Saint of the Week 18 April - Blessed Mary of the Incarnation (1566-1618). Religious

Barbe Avrillot was born in Paris in 1566. At the age of sixteen she married Pierre Acarie, by whom she had seven children. Through her household duties and many hardships, she attained the heights of the mystical life. Under the influence of Saint Teresa's writings, and after mystical contact with the saint herself, she spared no effort in introducing the Discalced Carmelite Nuns into France. After her husband's death, she asked to be admitted among them as a lay sister, taking the name of Mary of the Incarnation; she was professed at the Carmel of Amiens in 1615. She was esteemed by some of the greatest men of her time, including Saint Francis de Sales; and she was distinguished by her spirit of prayer and her zeal for the extension of the Catholic Faith. She died at Pontoise on April 18, 1618.

Did You Know ...?

...that just as Easter Day, liturgically, lasts for eight calendar days, so the Easter season lasts for fifty days?

Easter is the highlight of the Church's year and so the celebration is an extended one. We are, after all, celebrating the event that gives us the hope of eternal life with God, meaning that death does not have the final word. And so, Easter day itself is extended to an Octave, ending on the evening of the Second Sunday of Easter (Low Sunday). The Easter season is extended through to the Feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended upon those gathered in the upper room. The season is marked by white vestments, the lighting of the Paschal Candle, and numerous "Alleluias"!


