What is the Eucharist for you?

THIS SUNDAY'S SOLEMNITY of Corpus Christi, or The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, to give it its more formal title, marks, as always, the last Sunday before returning to Sundays in Ordinary Time. We returned to Ordinary Time a couple of weeks ago after the Solemnity of Pentecost, but last Sunday and this Sunday stand out as special celebrations to remind us of the Trinitarian nature of God and the great gift of the Eucharist.



We might ask why the Church brings these two beliefs to the forefront of our consciousness when they are such

cornerstones of our Catholic Christian faith? After all, one cannot call oneself Catholic without holding these beliefs.

And perhaps that is the point. It is never a bad thing to be reminded of what is most important. Sometimes the things that loom largest in our life are the ones we find easiest to ignore, whether we are talking about our faith or some other area of life. The familiar, no matter how important, tends to fade into the background if we allow it to do so.

So, what does it mean to say we believe in the Eucharist as the Body and Blood of Christ? Many of us could rattle off a definition of the Eucharist, based on what we learnt in school or catechist classes in our youth. But embracing a definition is different to embracing a reality, and this Sunday's solemnity is an opportunity to reflect on the impact the Eucharist has on our lives both as individuals and as the Body of Christ.

For some, the impact may be purely personal: "I come to Mass to receive the Eucharist and so be comforted by intimacy with Christ." "The Eucharist gives me the nourishment I need to live out my discipleship most fruitfully." Most certainly, the gift of the Eucharist is important on a personal level.

But we must also appreciate the significance of the Eucharist for us at a corporate level too. We, the faithful, are the Body of Christ and the Eucharist affirms this because we all consume the one Bread and the one Cup. Our manner of living ought to reflect this unity. When we embrace the truth of our solidarity we will ensure that our love for one another is not something superficial but rather something genuine and Christlike.

So, let us allow this Sunday's solemnity of Corpus Christi speak to us of the importance of the Eucharist in our lives as Catholic Christians, more important for what it does to both transform and unite us than simply being something that differentiates us from other Christians.

This Sunday we congratulate those children who will be receiving the Eucharist for the first time. We pray that they, as well as the other children here next weekend, will allow the Eucharist to slowly transform them in the years ahead. May they embrace the truth that the Eucharist is a force of unity and love and make that evident in their manner of living. May their parents, godparents, family and friends assist them in this divine endeavour.

I regret that I cannot be here on either of the two Sundays for First Eucharist but ask that these children and their families know of my prayers for them all at this time.

Upcoming Features: Next week, we plan to send the bulletin and liturgy guide via ParishStaq to your email. These will be sent to all parishioners who have provided their email addresses and are recorded in our database. If you receive the bulletin by email and prefer not to receive it in the future, you can unsubscribe. If you are unsure whether you have provided your email to the parish office and would like to receive the bulletin weekly, please email Pat on secretary@stpatscathedral.com.au to register.

Future Access via the App: Upon the launch of the Cathedral App, you will be able to access the bulletin through the app, similar to the functionality of the former Skoolbag App.

Communication and Privacy: With ParishStaq, you will be able to chat with parishioners within your groups for group-related purposes. Rest assured, other parishioners will not have access to your email or phone contact details. Once you have filled out a group form, your contact information will remain secure. Thank you for your patience and support as we transition to these new systems. We are committed to ensuring a smooth experience for everyone and are here to help you every step of the way.

Clarifying the Names

Following up on last week's bulletin note, we would like to clarify the names and functions of two key platforms we are using: Pushpay and ParishStaq.

Pushpay: Pushpay is the platform where our parish electronic giving is received and recorded. It allows for simple and secure giving through various methods, including mobile and online options. Pushpay streamlines the process, making it easier for you to support our parish.

ParishStag:

ParishStaq serves as our online parish hub. It is a dynamic Catholic church management system that will give you access to the parish office when you need it. Through ParishStaq, you will be able to sign up for events, interact with small groups, track your ministry commitments, request prayers and Mass offering, register for your child for Sacarament and watch Mass online and many more.

Parish App - The parish App will consolidate the two platforms above.



Saints of the Week

03 June - St Charles Lwanga and Co., Martyrs

Many Christians, Catholic and Protestant, were killed by the Ugandan king Mwanga. Some of them were servants in the king's palace or even his personal attendants. Charles Lwanga and his twenty-one companions (the youngest, Kizito, was only 13) were executed for being Christians, for rebuking the king for his debauchery and his murder of an Anglican missionary, for "praying from a book," and for refusing to allow themselves to be ritually sodomised by the king. They died between 1885 and 1887. Most of them were burned alive in a group after being tortured.

Within a year of their deaths, the number of catechumens in the country quadrupled. St Charles Lwanga is the patron of Catholic Action and of black African youth, and the Ugandan martyrs' feast day is a public holiday in Uganda.



The Body and Blood of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into Heaven.

Jesus comes to us in every Mass. The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.

How do I receive Communion well?

- 1. Be ready! Think about what is going to happen. Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul. If you do, then go to confession first.
- 2. Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion. This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.
- 3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!
