Capability versus Character?

WHAT DO YOU VALUE more in a person – their capability or their character? Capability is about how well someone can do a job; character is about the kind of person they are.

Both are important, but for me, character is the most important. The reason being capability is mostly just the gifts a person has been born with, whereas character is something they have had to work at. Character is formed, or forged, in the arena of life, over many years.



The reason I ask the question is because this week we celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost is all about the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit has two impacts on us, one relates to capability and the other to

When scripture talks about how the Holy Spirit impacts us, it talks about the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, and there can often be some confusion over the difference between the two. So, let's take a look at them.

The Gifts of the Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

The Fruits of the Spirit are: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control.

The Gifts are immediate gifts given by the Spirit that relate to our **spiritual capability**. They equip us for our mission.

The Fruits are about our spiritual character and are formed over time. We could think of it in terms of our lifetime journey of increasing sanctification, growing more and more into the character of Christ. This is our process of ongoing formation.

The Gifts are **different** from one person to the next. They are given to people depending on what mission God has in store for them, and they are appropriate to that specific calling.

The Fruits, by contrast, should be the **same** in every Christian and they are the true sign that the person has been engaging in a real relationship with God. While we need grace to develop these Fruits, we do have a role to play in terms of the extent to which we cooperate with, and surrender to, the will of God.

In the end the clue is in the words – a Gift is something we are given outright, whereas a Fruit is something that is cultivated over time. In the Fruit we see the action of the Vinedresser, but there is also the action of the person – cooperation, humility, surrender.

Every day we should pray for the Holy Spirit to fill us, and every night we should examine ourselves to see if we are developing the character that we should. We can ask ourselves:

"Would the people that I interacted with today use these words to describe their experience of me: loving, joyful, peaceful, patient, kind, good, trustworthy, gentle and self-controlled?"

If the answer is "Yes" then we are on the right track. If the answer is "No" then we must call on the Vinedresser to get out his pruning shears... there is some work to be done

Barnardos Australia Seeking Help

Case Summary

Two children, a boy (3 years 9 months old) and a girl (2 years 3 months old), have been in temporary care since September 2022 due to safety concerns at home involving their parents' mental health issues, drug use, and neglect. Currently placed with Indonesian carers, the children are of Nigerian and Sierra Leonean descent. They have shown significant improvement in their current environment, developing well both emotionally and cognitively. The boy requires ongoing occupational therapy and speech therapy, while the girl is meeting her developmental milestones and enjoys interactive play. Both children attend daycare and have supervised family visits with their parents.

Seeking Permanent Care for Two Young Children

We are reaching out to our parish community on behalf of Barnardos to find a permanent and culturally matching home for two young children currently under temporary care. These children have faced significant challenges but are now thriving under stable care. Update on Fr Bob Bossini

Dear parishioners, please find the current update on Father Bob's condition below. We ask for continued prayers.

"Dear friends, just an update on my condition. After meeting with the oncologist last Thursday, he stressed that he didn't want me to undergo any further medical procedures until after a catscan in early June and a subsequent meeting with him the following week. He stated that I need to spend the time till then recuperating. The operation, which was successful, and should have had me in hospital for a week, ended being almost five weeks. There were many complications not least of all was kidney failure. He said with all this trauma and the fact that I had lost 26kgs requires an extended period of recuperation to overcome the physical and mental stress.

I'm coping with the stoma bag, but I have to monitor it every two hours every night which means a very interrupted night followed by a dazed filled day.

Medically, I have to have keyhole surgery to eradicate a very small lesion on the liver; the removal of the primary tumour in the large intestine - which couldn't be detected in the last scan and finally the removal of the stoma bag. All this means that, God willing, I should be back in the parish [Fairfield] mid to late July. At present my sister-in-law is changing the stoma bag every second day - a process I could never attempt on my own. I ask for your prayers and patience as I move to the final stage of medication."

Saint of the Week

25 May - St Bede the Venerable (673-735), Monk

He was born in the north of England, near the monastery of Wearmouth. He joined that monastery, and spent all his life there or at Jarrow, teaching and writing. He was the outstanding ecclesiastical author of his time. He wrote commentaries on Scripture; an ecclesiastical history of the English people, which is a unique and irreplaceable resource for much of early English history; and the first martyrology (collection of saints' lives) to be compiled on historical principles. He was also the first known writer of English prose, though this has not survived. He died at Jarrow on 25 May 735: he taught and worked until the last moments of his life, which are narrated by Cuthbert in today's Office of Readings. He is venerated as the "light of the Church" in the Dark Ages, and as a forerunner of the 8th and 9th century renaissance of the Western Church.

We are all familiar with some islands and other geographical features being named after Christian feast days and festivals, for example Christmas Island and the more famous Easter Island.

There are at least three islands in the world (according to Google Maps, anyway!) named after today's Solemn Feast of Pentecost. One is in Australia, part of the Whitsunday Islands group ("Whitsunday" meaning Pentecost Sunday), one in Canada in the Great Lakes system, but the most famous is an island of Vanuatu, famous for inventing bungee jumping!

Don't buy fruit and vegetables which are pre-wrapped in plastic




