What do you mean by love?

IF THERE IS A WORD most associated with the Christian religion, it would be "love". Famous passages like the ones we read in today's lectionary are staples for the Christian community which was born from love and from the beginning was known by its love. Love is what the world has come to expect of Christians, and it calls them out when they fail to live up to their own profession. Everything in our faith is summed up by love, and at the end, when we meet our maker, it will be the only thing that counts.



The English-speaking world suffers for only having

one word for love, whereas other languages might have the advantage of several words which help them to distinguish clearly between different kinds of love. This becomes a challenge for much of the Western world which has become increasingly English dominant, because different people can say the same thing and mean many different things by it. It seems to me that when John Lennon sang, "All you need is love," he meant something a little different than me saying "love will be the only thing that counts," and from the love that St John writes about in today's readings. The Lennon-love is that kind of vacuous, soppy love that has ever since dominated pop songs and pop culture in general; that feel-good love which doesn't mean much else than "leave me and everyone around me alone to do whatever we want and just be happy for us and accept us for who we are and whatever we become."

But the Christian idea of love is not this. John explains it in our first reading: "this is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away." The love by which we are meant to live is not like the love we have for God, because our love is characterised by a response to having been loved first. In that sense, our love for God is always an imperfect love, because it never begins as a free gift from us, but always as a response. You can see how the Lennon-love is more like "our love for God," when we reflect upon how so many of that type are so intolerant and hostile to anyone would question their behaviour – they love only in response to those who, in their eyes, have first "loved" them.

No, the love that is expected of us for each other is the love that God has for us, by which he came to deliver us from our sins through his self-immolation. The love than which there is no greater, by which one lays down their life for their friends. That love which inspires the Christian to pray for his enemy, to love those from whom he's never received love. It is a love which is for others, which seeks their good and goes to great lengths to attain it, and like Christ, seeks to deliver people from the greatest evil of all, sin.

This is what the Church means by love, what do you mean by it?



Joseph de Veuster was born in Belgium and took the name Damien on entering the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary at Leuven (Louvain). He landed in Hawaii in 1864, fulfilling his dream of becoming a missionary. In 1873, at his own request, he took up residence at the leper colony at Kalaupapa and ministered to its spiritual and material needs until he caught leprosy himself and eventually died of it.






