The Mystery of Faith

FOR THE NEXT SEVERAL WEEKS, we pause our exploration of the Gospel of Mark to focus our attention on the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, one well known and revered by Catholics especially. Pausing right in the middle of Ordinary Time to focus our attention on the most explicit grounding of the Eucharist in the Bible is itself instructive. For the Eucharist is at the heart of everything. It is spoken about as the source and summit of our faith because it includes everything




in it - itself speaking about everything, and everything speaking about it. And so, in the middle of "Ordinary Time," a season which encompasses everything from the mundane to the sublime, right at its peak, we rightly contemplate the summit of our faith, that which summarises everything.

In today's gospel, we hear the familiar story of Jesus' feeding of the five thousand. This is of course a prefigurement of the mystery of the Eucharist itself, and works as a preparation for the teaching that is to follow, which we will learn about in the coming weeks. But I wanted to focus on the last line of today's gospel: "Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself." Jesus resists being taken by them and made their king for a good many reasons. But the very action of Jesus eluding their grasp is itself significant. In a sense, Jesus always eludes our grasp. We can never tie him down, never fully understand him. We can never boast to have him all figured out. Our understanding is limited, and we see through a glass dimly. Whenever we think we've got him worked out, we've already lost sight of him - he has retreated to the hills, as it were. We must always approach the mystery of Jesus with reverence, with modesty, knowing that as much as I know him (or think I might), there always remains an abyss of unknowing between he and I, simply because I am merely a man, and he true God. If we can accept this truth, then we can remain confident of our faith in the mystery of the Eucharist, despite not being able to fully understand it. Because the mystery of Jesus and the mystery of the Eucharist are one and the same. They, he, is everything.

On another note, thank you to everyone for the well wishes and gifts that I have received over the past week or so. I have felt very loved and supported by all of you and feel so much a part of this community despite not even having been here for a year. I'd particularly like to thank everyone who contributed so generously to last Sunday's celebration in so many ways. As with those in our readings today, they ate as much as they wanted and had some left over!

The Diocese of Parramatta mourns the death of Bishop Emeritus Kevin Manning

Kevin Manning, the second Bishop of Parramatta died peacefully this morning Monday 15 July 2024, in Bathurst NSW at the age of 90.

Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, the Bishop of Parramatta was with Bishop Manning today when he passed.

"Bishop Kevin Manning was a loving servant of Christ. He dedicated his life to serving others and the church. He was a man of deep faith and prayer, and he leaves a strong legacy in Parramatta and the Australian Catholic Church, said Bishop Vincent.

"I give thanks for his life, for his vision and leadership for our local church and his legacy," he said.

Born on 2 November 1933 in Coolah, NSW to Kevin and Edith Manning, he was the second eldest in a family of five boys and two girls.

He attended Sacred Heart Primary School in Coolah before going on to St Columba's College, Springwood where he later began his studies for the priesthood. He was selected to complete his studies at the Propaganda Fide College in Rome, where he was ordained to the priesthood on 21 December 1961.

From 1962 to 1978, he served as a priest of the Diocese of Bathurst. In 1978, he was appointed Assistant Secretary to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in Canberra for five years, and then as Secretary from 1983 to 1991.

In 1991, Bishop Manning was appointed the eighth Bishop of Armidale, NSW, where he served until his appointment as Bishop of Parramatta.

Bishop Manning was appointed as the second Bishop of Parramatta on 10 July 1997, and was installed at St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta, on 21 August 1997. He served as Bishop for over 12 years until his retirement on 4 March 2010. During this time, he led the youngest diocese during a period of rapid growth as more migrants and people chose to live in the western suburbs and Blue Mountains. This is evidenced by the fact that Parramatta now is bigger than most Australian archdioceses.

Bishop Manning is well-known and well-loved by many in the diocese and across Australia. During his time as Bishop of Parramatta, he raised the new St Patrick's Cathedral after the disastrous fire of 1996 and was renowned for his outreach to the marginalised and the poor. He worked tirelessly campaigning and advocating for justice for workers, First Nations people, migrants and refugees, women and children and the growing youth population in the diocese.

He was the first bishop to reach out to the Muslim community in Western Sydney, building relationships based on mutual respect, and continued this interfaith and ecumenical work with other Christian communities and faiths.

He loved listening to and dialoguing with many people. He was a communicator at heart, and in 1998 launched Catholic Outlook, then a monthly newspaper. Writing in the first issue, he said: "It gives me great joy to write my first letter to you in Catholic Outlook, an initiative which is close to my heart, for it gives me the opportunity to correspond regularly with you."

His legacy and work continued after his retirement. He was appointed the Apostolic Administrator of the Wilcannia-Forbes Diocese in 2010 until 2012. A special Bishop Manning Lecture Series was hosted by Catholic Commission for Employment Relations in 2016, and Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese continues the Bishop Manning Support Fund that assists struggling families who desire a Catholic education for their children but cannot afford it.

Bishop Manning was the epitome of a Good Shepherd. He was a dutiful and humble servant full of compassion, humour and a love for the Church. The Diocese of Parramatta owes much to his leadership and vision, and we pray for the repose of his soul and give thanks to God for his earthly life.

Bishop Kevin Manning's funeral will be celebrated at St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta at 11:00am on Friday 02 August.

Sea Sunday 2024

Every year on the second Sunday of July Sea Sunday is celebrated. In Australia this year, we are celebrating it on both 21 and 28 July. The Catholic communities of the entire world pray for those who work in the maritime sector and for those who take care of them. For the occasion, the prefect of the



Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, Cardinal Michael Czerny, SJ, is sending a message to all people involved in this area and the chaplains and volunteers active in the pastoral care of seafarers.

Sea Sunday is an occasion to shed light on one of the sectors about which little is said but that is at the centre of everyone's lives. As the prefect's message underscores, "seafarers are among the least visible members of all of humanity. And, it's by way of their invisible efforts that we are able to receive many of our necessities." They are efforts that often confront injustices. exploitation, and inequalities. That's why the Church accompanies and defends the workers and, as Cardinal Czerny declares, "it's wonderful when the volunteers, chaplains, and members of the local port churches who are engaged in maritime pastoral care defend the dignity and the rights of seafarers."

It's by way of the sea that the Church was formed and spread throughout the entire world. Sailing out and landing in faraway ports, the Apostles and missionaries brought the Good News out to the furthest corners of the Earth. The experience of that time can be an inspiration also for the Church of today because, as the Cardinal highlights, "every new embarcation that arrived meant more encounters and exchanges, greater openness to novelties and to the immense possibilities that were opened up beyond the coastal locales."

The message is addressed to the seafarers of every provenance and faith because those who work in this sector come from all nations and profess all the religions of the world. The commitment of the Church is to include them without distinction to grow together in mutual understanding and solidarity so that "the people of the sea can feel part of the Church wherever they may go."

From Around The Diocese

Launch of Diocesan Synod document Saturday 10 August



On 10 August 2024, the Diocese of Parramatta will hold a significant Diocesan Gathering. This event will bring together various members of our Diocese to discuss and implement the newly developed Diocesan Plan within our communities. This gathering is the culmination of a journey that began in March 2023, when Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv formally announced the convocation of the first Diocesan Synod for the Diocese of Parramatta, marking a historic moment for our community.

Between May and July 2023, members of our faith community reflected on their experiences, engaged in discussions, and submitted their responses. These contributions were synthesized by the Synod Writing Group to develop the agenda and Synod Working Document for the first Synod Assembly, held from 13-15 October 2023.

In January 2024, the official Decrees and Declarations were launched, outlining the outcomes of the Synod and forming the foundation for the Diocesan Plan for a Synodal Church. From February to July 2024, this plan has been further developed through ongoing synodal practices and Think Tank Sessions involving local leaders and ministry teams.

We are honored to announce that the launch will feature two esteemed keynote speakers: Dr. Myriam Wijlens, a renowned expert in canon law and ecclesiology, and Dr. Ormond Rush, a distinguished theologian known for his work on the theology of the Second Vatican Council. Both have been deeply involved in the Synod on Synodality, and their insights and perspectives will be invaluable as we embark on this synodal journey.

In addition to the keynotes, the Diocesan Gathering will include workshops and opportunities for networking.

We ask for your prayers for Bishop Vincent Long and all members of the Diocese involved in this important launch. May their efforts be guided by the Holy Spirit to foster a more synodal and united Church.



Saint of the Week

30 July - St Justin de Jacobis (1800-1860), Bishop and Missionary

Justin was born in Italy in 1800. He joined the Vincentians (Lazarists) and later was sent to Abyssinia (Ethiopia-Eritrea) as a missionary. He studied the local language and culture and slowly developed a special love for the Abyssinian traditions which he used in his missionary ministry. Made bishop in 1849, De Jacobis worked hard for the formation of the Catholic Church, establishing a seminary together with Blessed Ghebre Michael, and ordaining several priests. He died in Eritrea on 31 July 1860. His missionary methodology, rooted in inculturation, is both a legacy and a challenge for missionaries today.



Did You Know...?

...that the miracle of the loaves and fishes is referred to in John's Gospel as a "sign" rather than a miracle?

There are seven "signs" mentioned in John's Gospel in all. They are: changing water into wine (2:1-11), healing the royal official's son in Capernaum (4:46-54), healing the paralytic at Bethesda (5:1-18), feeding the five thousand (6:5-14), Jesus walking on water (6:16-24), healing the man born blind (9:1-7),

and the raising of Lazarus (11:1-45). Some scholars also see the great catch of fish (21:1-14) as a sign, and the resurrection of Jesus as yet another.




Jesus still multiplies what we give Him today. At Mass we offer to God some bread and wine and He turns it into the Body and Blood of Jesus!




