"Those who believe in me will never thirst."

AS FATHER TOM NOTED in the bulletin last weekend, we have taken a break from our reading of Mark's Gospel and will spend several weeks, five in all, to read from one single chapter of John's Gospel, the famous sixth chapter, most of which comprises Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse. We will resume our reading from Mark on the first weekend in September.



As we moved to the Gospel of John last weekend, we witnessed what is probably the best known of all Jesus' miracles, the feeding of the crowds with just five loaves

and a couple of fish. It is the only miracle mentioned across all four Gospels, six times in all. This weekend we skip over a few verses in which Jesus walks on the sea and is then taken into the boat by the disciples. We take up the story at the point when the people seeking Jesus find him in Capernaum. Jesus' words are delivered in the synagogue there, a fact which is referenced only later in the chapter (v.59).

It is understandable that we tend to view the Bread of Life discourse solely through a Eucharistic lens. As Catholics, perhaps we are "hardwired" to do so. We draw an immediate link between Jesus speaking about himself as the bread of life and the fullness of Christ with which we are so familiar in the Eucharistic bread. At the same time, we should not be blind to a broader understanding of Jesus' words throughout this brief but important excursion into the fourth Gospel. A narrow understanding will only serve to limit our openness to God's grace.


One approach to helping us understand this better is to look at how adults seeking to become Catholics undergo formation. You are probably aware of the process known as the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, something many Catholic parishes run annually, including here at the Cathedral. This process does not seek to simply fill prospective Catholics up with a load of "Catholic facts," but rather seeks to facilitate the process by which the enquirer responds to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, who has already been at work in the enquirer for some time. We do not try to convince enquirers of Catholic truths through lecturing them but through prayer, the reading of scripture and open discussion, enquirers come to see the logic and beauty of these truths, originating as they do in a loving and merciful Creator. Then, and only then, can a genuine faith in Christ's presence in the Eucharist be embraced, and with it, an overwhelming desire to receive it sacramentally at the Easter Vigil, after Baptism and Confirmation.

For us to focus only on the Eucharist when Jesus speaks of himself as the bread of life, is to potentially short-circuit a process which can bear fruit even for us longterm Catholics. Jesus achieves incredible intimacy with us in the Eucharist, but our appreciation of this incredible gift is enhanced when we get to know him better through prayer, reading scripture and embracing his presence in the world around us.

In doing this more often, we can better love Christ and give thanks to him with fuller hearts; hearts devoted to, and grateful for, Christ, the Bread of Life.

The Diocese of Parramatta mourns the death of Bishop Emeritus Kevin Manning

Kevin Manning, the second Bishop of Parramatta died peacefully this morning Monday 15 July 2024, in Bathurst NSW at the age of 90.

Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, the Bishop of Parramatta was with Bishop Manning today when he passed.

"Bishop Kevin Manning was a loving servant of Christ. He dedicated his life to serving others and the church. He was a man of deep faith and prayer, and he leaves a strong legacy in Parramatta and the Australian Catholic Church, said Bishop Vincent.

"I give thanks for his life, for his vision and leadership for our local church and his legacy," he said.

Born on 2 November 1933 in Coolah, NSW to Kevin and Edith Manning, he was the second eldest in a family of five boys and two girls.

He attended Sacred Heart Primary School in Coolah before going on to St Columba's College, Springwood where he later began his studies for the priesthood. He was selected to complete his studies at the Propaganda Fide College in Rome, where he was ordained to the priesthood on 21 December 1961.

From 1962 to 1978, he served as a priest of the Diocese of Bathurst. In 1978, he was appointed Assistant Secretary to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in Canberra for five years, and then as Secretary from 1983 to 1991.

In 1991, Bishop Manning was appointed the eighth Bishop of Armidale, NSW, where he served until his appointment as Bishop of Parramatta.

Bishop Manning was appointed as the second Bishop of Parramatta on 10 July 1997, and was installed at St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta, on 21 August 1997. He served as Bishop for over 12 years until his retirement on 4 March 2010. During this time, he led the youngest diocese during a period of rapid growth as more migrants and people chose to live in the western suburbs and Blue Mountains. This is evidenced by the fact that Parramatta now is bigger than most Australian archdioceses.

Bishop Manning is well-known and well-loved by many in the diocese and across Australia. During his time as Bishop of Parramatta, he raised the new St Patrick's Cathedral after the disastrous fire of 1996 and was renowned for his outreach to the marginalised and the poor. He worked tirelessly campaigning and advocating for justice for workers, First Nations people, migrants and refugees, women and children and the growing youth population in the diocese.

He was the first bishop to reach out to the Muslim community in Western Sydney, building relationships based on mutual respect, and continued this interfaith and ecumenical work with other Christian communities and faiths.

He loved listening to and dialoguing with many people. He was a communicator at heart, and in 1998 launched Catholic Outlook, then a monthly newspaper. Writing in the first issue, he said: "It gives me great joy to write my first letter to you in Catholic Outlook, an initiative which is close to my heart, for it gives me the opportunity to correspond regularly with you."

His legacy and work continued after his retirement. He was appointed the Apostolic Administrator of the Wilcannia-Forbes Diocese in 2010 until 2012. A special Bishop Manning Lecture Series was hosted by Catholic Commission for Employment Relations in 2016, and Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese continues the Bishop Manning Support Fund that assists struggling families who desire a Catholic education for their children but cannot afford it.

Bishop Manning was the epitome of a Good Shepherd. He was a dutiful and humble servant full of compassion, humour and a love for the Church. The Diocese of Parramatta owes much to his leadership and vision, and we pray for the repose of his soul and give thanks to God for his earthly life.

Bishop Kevin Manning's funeral will be celebrated at St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta at 11:00am on Friday 02 August.

From Around The Diocese

Launch of Diocesan Synod document on Saturday 10 August



Next Saturday, 10 August, the Diocese of Parramatta will hold a significant Diocesan Gathering. This event will bring together various members of our Diocese to discuss and implement the newly developed Diocesan Plan within our communities. This gathering is the culmination of a journey that began in March 2023, when Bishop Vincent Long formally announced the convocation of the first Diocesan Synod for the Diocese of Parramatta, marking a historic moment for our community.

Between May and July 2023, members of our faith community reflected on their experiences, engaged in discussions, and submitted their responses. These contributions were synthesized by the Synod Writing Group to develop the agenda and Synod Working Document for the first Synod Assembly, held from 13-15 October 2023.

In January 2024, the official Decrees and Declarations were launched, outlining the outcomes of the Synod and forming the foundation for the Diocesan Plan for a Synodal Church. From February to July 2024, this plan has been further developed through ongoing synodal practices and Think Tank Sessions involving local leaders and ministry teams.

We are honored to announce that the launch will feature two esteemed keynote speakers: Dr. Myriam Wijlens, a renowned expert in canon law and ecclesiology, and Dr. Ormond Rush, a distinguished theologian known for his work on the theology of the Second Vatican Council. Both have been deeply involved in the Synod on Synodality, and their insights and perspectives will be invaluable as we embark on this synodal journey.

In addition to the keynotes, the Diocesan Gathering will include workshops and opportunities for networking.

We ask for your prayers for Bishop Vincent Long and all members of the Diocese involved in this important launch. May their efforts be guided by the Holy Spirit to foster a more synodal and united Church.



Saint of the Week 05 August - Blessed Frederic Janssoone (1838-1916), Priest

Frederic Jansoonne was born in Flanders, the youngest of thirteen children. When he was nine years old, his father died, and he left school to help support his mother, until her death in 1861. He then joined the Franciscans and became a priest. After serving as a military chaplain and preaching in the Holy Land, he was sent to Canada on a fund-raising tour in 1881, settling there permanently in 1888. By his preaching and his writing he led many people to bear authentic witness to the Gospel and share his closeness to Christ.



Have you ever been hungry?


