The Journey into Divine Life

"IF YOU DON'T KNOW where you are going, you might not get there." These were the words of an American business guru, Yogi Berra. They sound simple but they are really quite profound. They certainly apply in business but they also apply to the rest of our lives. Have you ever thought about this? Where is it that you are trying to get to? Some people might say: "We are trying to get to heaven." and that's fair enough, but when I hear this I sometimes worry – it can sometimes feel like a primary school version of our faith – we do good or avoid sin in order to "qualify" for heaven. This puts God as some sort of scorekeeper or judge and our lives as some sort of test, that we will pass or fail. This is not how we should understand our faith, in fact it is dangerously close to a heresy called Pelagianism. At its essence Pelagianism suggested that we could behave well morally through exercising our will, in other words we could reach heaven by our own efforts. Our faith teaches us, however, that we need God's grace in order to live as we are called to live, and that we cannot do this just through our own efforts.



A better way to understand all this may be to see our lives as a journey, and the destination of that journey is divine life with God. Again, some people think that divine life begins when we die, but that is not the case, divine life is here and now. It began when Jesus came into the world. A Christian journey is one that draws us deeper and deeper into divine life with God in the here and now. If we live this way, then death is just another step deeper into that divine life.

So, where does sin come into all this? Well, sin is what draws us away from the divine life. We cannot live in sin and also be in real relationship with God. It distracts us, draws us away, and can take us off the road to God entirely. And sin is real, and the enemy is active. The enemy will constantly try to draw us into sin. Our own will is not enough to keep us on track, and that is where Jesus comes in. Jesus is the "bread of life". This is the bread given to us by God to sustain us on our journey into divine life.

We receive Jesus clearly in the Eucharist, and we also receive Him in His word. Remember, the Eucharist is not just some magic wafer, it is a sacrament, and a sacrament is only as fruitful as it is received. In other words, we must receive the Eucharist with great faith, faith that we are taking into ourselves the very person of Christ. In a similar way, we receive Christ in His word, not by simply listening to it, but by taking it into our hearts, and living it out in our lives.

In the first reading the angel tells Elijah: "...eat, or the journey will be too long for you." This message is for us too. We need Jesus, in His sacrament and in His word. If we truly take Jesus into our bodies, into our hearts, into our lives, we too will have the strength to complete the journey to Mount Horeb, the mountain of God, and the fullness of divine life.

If you would like to donate items for us to sell or would like to volunteer on the day, please call the office. Although we usually are never short of helpers just turning up, it helps us allocate jobs.

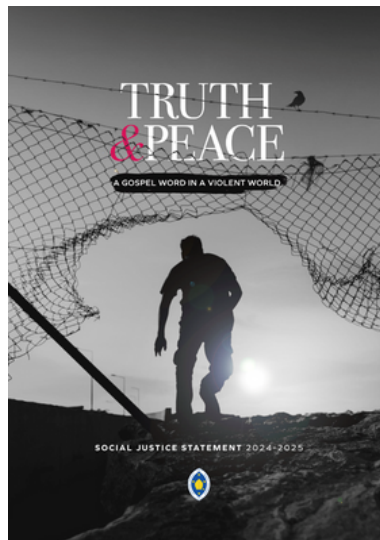
Our next barbecue event will be held on **Sunday 25 August**.

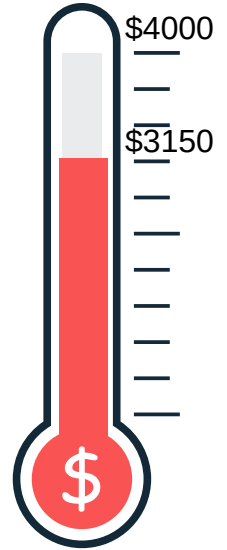

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

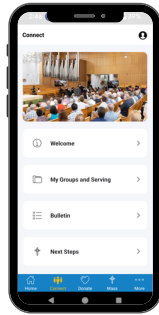

We are once again organising a foodbank drive for our Jesuit Refugee Service partners in Parramatta. This will run throughout the month of August.

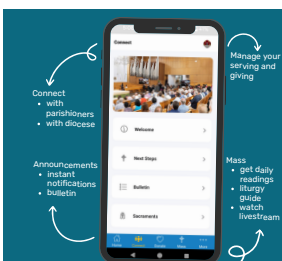

From Around The Diocese

Launch of Diocesan Synod document on Saturday 10 August



Next Saturday, 10 August, the Diocese of Parramatta will hold a significant Diocesan Gathering. This event will bring together various members of our Diocese to discuss and implement the newly developed Diocesan Plan within our communities. This gathering is the culmination of a journey that began in March 2023, when Bishop Vincent Long formally announced the convocation of the first Diocesan Synod for the Diocese of Parramatta, marking a historic moment for our community.

Between May and July 2023, members of our faith community reflected on their experiences, engaged in discussions, and submitted their responses. These contributions were synthesized by the Synod Writing Group to develop the agenda and Synod Working Document for the first Synod Assembly, held from 13-15 October 2023.

In January 2024, the official Decrees and Declarations were launched, outlining the outcomes of the Synod and forming the foundation for the Diocesan Plan for a Synodal Church. From February to July 2024, this plan has been further developed through ongoing synodal practices and Think Tank Sessions involving local leaders and ministry teams.

We are honored to announce that the launch will feature two esteemed keynote speakers: Dr. Myriam Wijlens, a renowned expert in canon law and ecclesiology, and Dr. Ormond Rush, a distinguished theologian known for his work on the theology of the Second Vatican Council. Both have been deeply involved in the Synod on Synodality, and their insights and perspectives will be invaluable as we embark on this synodal journey.

In addition to the keynotes, the Diocesan Gathering will include workshops and opportunities for networking.

We ask for your prayers for Bishop Vincent Long and all members of the Diocese involved in this important launch. May their efforts be guided by the Holy Spirit to foster a more synodal and united Church.

Saints of the Week

13 August - Sts Pontian (d. 235), Pope, Martyr & Hippolytus (d.235), Priest, Martyr

Hippolytus was a priest and a learned man, the most important writer of the Church at Rome in the early third century. He strongly attacked the popes of the time, and was set up as a rival Pope to St Callistus. Some time later, in Maximin's persecution, he was sent to labour in the quarries of Sardinia. There he met the then Pope, Pontian, and was reconciled with him. Pontian was made Pope in 231, and was sent to the quarries in 235, where he resigned the papacy and died. Pontian's successor, Fabian, had both bodies brought back to Rome for burial, and Pontian and Hippolytus were already being venerated by the Roman Church by the start of the fourth century.

Did You Know...?

...that chapter six of John's Gospel, which we are currently hearing in our Sunday Masses, is one of the longest chapters in the Gospels?

If you look through the Gospels and examine the number of verses in each chapter, you will find that John 6 has 71 verses, the same number as Luke 22. These chapters have fewer verses however than Luke 1 and Matthew 26, which have 80 verses and 75 verses respectively. Mark 14 has 72 verses. As a matter of interest, the chapter with the least number of verses is Matthew 3 with just 17 verses. We need to bear in mind that the scriptures were not originally composed with chapters and verses. These were added at a much later date.
