Who is Jesus? Who am I?

THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL sees us as witnesses to a very famous encounter between Jesus and his disciples, in particular, Simon Peter. Last weekend we saw Jesus heal the deaf man who, along with the witnesses to this miracle, broadcast the healing to a large number of people, despite Jesus ordering them not to do so. That event closes out chapter seven of Mark. Chapter eight begins with one of two accounts by Mark of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Jesus then explains the meaning of this miracle to his disciples, followed by the healing of a blind man (also utilising spittle, as Jesus did for the deaf man with the speech impediment.)



This Sunday's Gospel follows these remarkable events. Jesus asks his disciples who people think he is. Their responses prompt Jesus to ask a more confronting question: "Who do you say I am?" Inevitably, it is the impetuous Peter who responds: "You are the Christ." Subsequent events, both in today's Gospel and later, will reveal that Peter has not yet grasped what "the Christ" means, but these words denote a turning point at this halfway point in Mark's Gospel.

Jesus challenges us with the same question: Who is Christ for me? It is a crucial question because if we believe Christ to be anything other than God-made-flesh, our Saviour, then our claim to be a Christian falls somewhat flat. Christ may be for some, even those professing to be Christians, simply an inspiring teacher, healer or role model. One doesn't need to be a Christian to embrace Jesus in this way. We might call such people "Christian sympathisers."

The point is simply this: our understanding of who Christ is goes a long way towards how we understand ourselves ("Who am I?"). This, in turn, affects the way in which we relate to others be they fellow Christians or others we encounter who do not share our faith.

Jesus gives us the "formula" at the end of today's Gospel for how to be a disciple of his: "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let them renounce themselves and take up their cross and follow me." To be a disciple rather than a mere "sympathiser" means dying to self, living with the well-being of others uppermost in mind and actively living and loving like Jesus, which naturally calls for a renunciation of self-interest. In living this way we can then answer the question of "Who am I" with a firm response: "A Christian."

With the aid of the Holy Spirit, essential for living a life which does not come naturally, we can find our true nature as people who are "other Christs", making his presence manifest throughout the world, something Jesus himself couldn't do during his short earthly life. Today's second reading throws down the gauntlet in this regard, helping us to see that a life of faith without good works is pointless. In fact, one might as well have no faith as far as others are concerned, especially those in need.

Jesus understood, embraced and loved as Saviour, helps us to see the dignity which is to be afforded to every other human being and helps transform us into beings making Christ manifest to all. This is our faith, this is the faith of the Church, and this is our mission.

In discovering who Christ truly is, we discover who we truly are too.

Catholic Schools Bishop Manning Fund



Saint of the Week

18 September - St Stanisław Kostka (1550-1568), Religious


Stanisław Kostka (1550-1568) was born into a noble family in Poland. In 1567 he was sent to the Jesuit college in Vienna to complete his studies. Soon after, he expressed the desire to enter the Society of Jesus. The local Jesuit authorities, fearing the negative reaction of his father, hesitated to receive him. Stanisław, quickly grasping the difficulty raised by the opposition of his family, walked the 500 miles to Germany, from where with the encouragement and blessing of Saint Peter Canisius, the provincial superior, he went on to Rome. He was admitted to the Society of Jesus there. In the novitiate, Stanisław was blessed with mystical experiences. He died of illness on August 15, 1568.

Did You Know...?

...that the Letter of James, from which we are currently hearing at Sunday Masses, places emphasis on works being an expression of faith?

Whilst it is true that one cannot "work" one's way into heaven (a heresy known as the Pelagian heresy), James, as we hear this Sunday, emphasises that faith needs to be made manifest, and this is done so by works that express one's charity.


