## Your wealth is rotting

THE LETTER OF ST JAMES is challenging to read. It is not like the letters of Paul which are written to particular local churches with their particular circumstances and often vary in their emphases, sometimes simply trying to expand upon a theological truth. The letter of James, on the other hand, is written for every follower of Jesus, in every time and place, and seeks simply to challenge the believer to live up to the standard of the Gospel. That standard is a very high standard, encouraging not just an outward observance of good deeds, but an interior conversion to goodness itself, a heart purified and set free to cling only to that which is good. The Letter of James is challenging to read then because it places this standard before our eyes, and because it does so without pulling any punches, without mincing of words. St James doesn't shy away from the pricklier subjects, like money.



This week, St James acts as financial advisor, giving "an answer for the rich," which reads very much like the warnings of the prophets of old to the rich and powerful, as he seeks to awaken their minds to the injustices wrought by their gain-seeking. He is taking aim at those who say, "today or tomorrow we shall go into such and such a town, spend a year there doing business, and make a profit" (4:13). Now of course, if profit comes one's way, then thank Providence. But St James points out that those who seek profit for profit's sake, those who store up their wealth "for a rainy day" are banking on a future for themselves that may not be. And in doing so, they neglect to attend to the poor who, in the here and now, need what the wealthy have in abundance.

Hence the vivid imagery in the reading today. "Your wealth is all rotting," James says, "your clothes are all eaten up by moths," which sounds very similar to something Jesus himself said, "do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven." We are only given this moment, we only have today in which to act, and so we must do what we can today and not put off our works of charity for a future about which we have no certainty. As the Proverb goes, "do not say to your neighbour, 'Go away! Come another time! I will give it you tomorrow,' if you can do it now." If we have been fortunate enough to have been given more than we need, that excess isn't for us to indulge ourselves with or store up needlessly for the future. Rather, it belongs to those in need *today*. This might seem like daft financial advice, but that's because financial advisors aren't usually trying to get their clients to heaven. St James is.

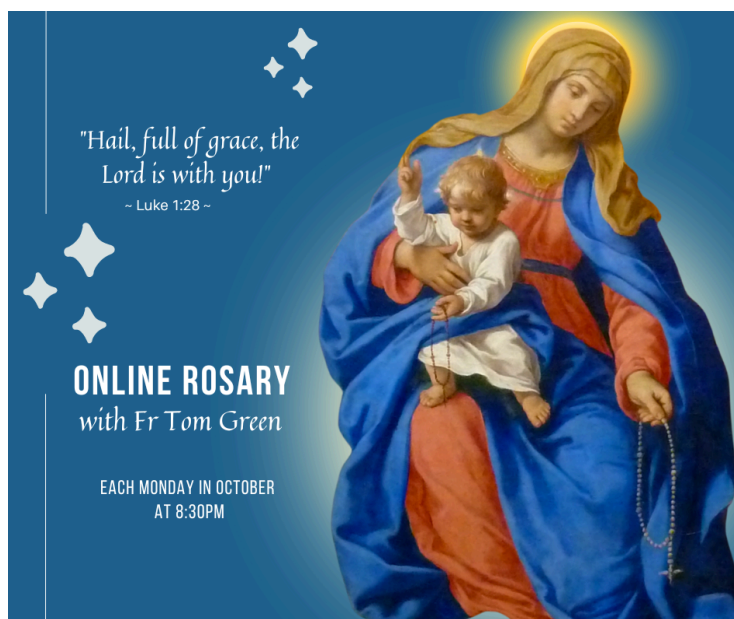

# Saint of the Week

03 October - St Francis Borgia (1510-1572), Priest

Francis Borgia was born in Valencia, Spain. Although as a child he wished to become a monk, his family sent him instead to be trained for life at court, where he distinguished himself in the diplomatic service of Charles V, the Holy Roman Emperor and king of Spain, and as viceroy of Catalonia. He married in 1529 and had eight children. A gifted musician and composer, he was considered one of the chief restorers of sacred music (prior to Palestrina). In May 1539, he was missioned to accompany the corpse of the empress Isabella, who had died unexpectedly fifteen days earlier, to her burial place in Granada. He was shocked to see her beautiful face disfigured beyond recognition. This experience proved to be the turning point of his life. After his wife's death in 1546, he joined the Society of Jesus. In 1565 he was elected the third superior general of the Society of Jesus. He died in Rome in 1572.

...that the sort of extreme language used by Jesus in this weekend's Gospel was not unusual for the culture and time in which he lived?

One of the difficulties we often encounter in reading the scriptures is that we are reading texts thousands of years old. Not only that, we are reading them in translation from ancient languages and reading them in a time and culture far removed from the original context. These factors mean that we must be careful not to read scripture always at face value and thus fail to comprehend its nuances and openness to interpretation.
